Callahan and Jones Counties To Receive Highway Construction

AUSTIN — Contracts for highway construction in the Abilene district have been awarded by the Texas Highway Commission.

The work will be under the supervision of District Engineer J. C. Roberts, and will be in Callahan and Jones Counties.

Strain Brothers Inc. of San Angelo was awarded a contract for asphaltic stabilized base and hot mix asphaltic concrete paving on 5.9 miles of State Highway in Callahan County. Low bid was \$260,762.90.

The projects extends from 5.5 miles northwest of Cross Plains to Cross Plains, C. W. Westbrook is the Highway Department engineer in charge of the project which will take an estimated 100 working days.

J. H. Strain & Sons, Inc. of Tye was awarded a contract for grading, structural base and surfacing on 4 miles of Farm to Market Road 2834 in Jones County. Low bid was \$116,656.47.

The project extends from 5 miles east of FM Road 1835 to FM Road 1661. Nelson Shave of Hamlin is the Highway Department engineer in charge of the project which will take an estimated 90 working days.

45 Day Extension Granted Disabled Veterans to Secure License Plates

The Texas Highway Department is granting a 45 day extension for disabled veterans to file applications for 1972 "Disabled Vet" license plates. This benefit was enacted by the 62nd Legislature, 1971, HB 615, and provides for free license plates for veterans who have at least a 70 percent service-connected disability and are in receipt of compensation because of such disability.

The letter received from the Highway Department is quoted below:

"We have received numerous requests to extend the deadline for disabled veterans to file their application for 1972 "Disabled Vet" license plates.

"It has always been our policy whenever possible to be reasonable in our administration of the registration laws of this State. Since this is new

legislation, it does seem reasonable that we should allow an additional period of time this first year of implementation for the affected veterans to file their initial applications. You are therefore advised that we are this date granting a 45 day extension, thus extending the deadline from October 1st through Monday, November 15th."

News About Clyde Students at H-SU

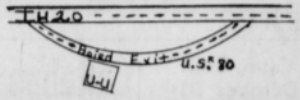
ABILENE — A news report from Hardin-Simmons University is that Jane Taylor, a junior student, and Clyde graduate, is a candidate for the junior class secretary.

UNDERSTANDING THE SCRIPTURES

(continued from last week)

Do you believe that it is right in the sight of God for the South Sea Islanders to murder and sacrifice their purest, sweetest virgins to their heathen gods? They are just as sincere in this as any of us are in what we do. In India the Hindus offer their babies to the so-called god of the Ganges River. People were never more sincere. You see, being honest and sincere is not the test of what is right and what is wrong before God.

God has not left it up to man to make just whatever he wants to out of the scriptures. He does not deal with mankind in such an impractical way. He deals in express ideas and specific commandments. It is not necessary for man to wonder about what God wants him to believe and what God wants him to do.

This brings us face to face with the question: "Is it possible for man to understand what God has said?" God says in His word, "Be not unwise, but understanding what the will of the Lord is." (Eph. 5:17). What kind of a God would He be if He has commanded man to do something which he does not have the power nor the capacity to do? The very fact that God has commanded to understand His will is proof enough that it is possible.

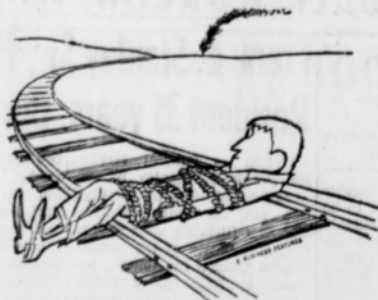
