

Old Settler's Reunions From Past To Present

Saturday, August 30th at the Cross Plains City Park, the Callahan County Old Settlers held their 38th Reunion.

The Old Settler's Reunion was first organized by pioneer women such as Mrs. Cox and Mrs. J.B. Cutbirth at a picnic at the Pecan Bayao in 1936.

The first reunion was held at the McCoy Ranch south of 283 and 36 on the Pecan Bayao. Since that time the reunions have been held in Denton Valley (Kendrick Park), in the 1950's Hickman Park, Deep Creek (Hughes Park), the Clyde Park, and most recently at the Cross Plains Park.

There have been fewer than five reunions missed in the last forty-four years. Some of those were missed during World War II, and the reunion barely escaped being called off this year.

The first president of the Settlers Reunion was Tom Windham of Oplin. The present president is Lowell Johnson. Eliza Gilliland, who used to run the Baird Star, was the secretary, treasurer until her death in the early 40's. Mrs. B.L. Boydston filled her position and kept it until 1972, when the post was filled by Maggie Cook, who is the present secretary, treasurer.


Walter Finch Sucumbs Saturday


