Clyde Man Recieves 10 Year Sentence On Burglary Conviction

A ten year prison term was handed down, on a Clyde man, by the 104th District Court jury after connecting him on Burglary charges Tuesday.

Joe Mike Camirillo, 28, of Clyde was found guilty, of the May 13 burglary of the Mr. M Food Store, 784 Grape, after 15 minutes of deliberating by an eight man and four woman jury. Punishment was set after another 30 minutes of deliberations.

Because of a prior felony conviction, he was not eligible for a probation request. He was also identified, by finger-

prints, as being the same person who received a 2-year prison term in Dallas County for Robbery and Assault in 1973.

Assistant District Attorney Jack Grant asked the jury to set punishment "in the upper ranges". Punishment range for commercial burglary is two to 20 years. Defense attorney Stan Brown asked for a minimum term.

It was claimed by Grant, that he was the driver of the get-away car, while two other young men entered the food store. The defense offered no evidence.

Netherlands Hans Versteeg Visits Nursing Home

A young man from the kingdom of the Netherlands, one of the most densely populated countries in the world, was in Baird on Tuesday March 23rd.

Hans is a 28-year old university student from Rotherdam. He arrived in New York on February 3 and made his way to Orlando, Florida by bus. DPS Liability Insurance Warning Period Expires Wednesday

The 90-day DPS warning period for the new mandatory liability insurance law expires this week. After midnight Wednesday, March 31, state troopers will begin issuing citations to drivers who fail to show proof of insurance when such information is requested.

The law, which became effective January 1, 1982, requires all drivers to carry minimum liability coverage for bodily injury of \$10,000 per person and property damage of \$5,000.

Col. Jim Adams, DPS director, said the law is encouraging more drivers to obtain the required coverage.

"DPS figures show that during 1981

approximately 73% of drivers involved in reportable accidents had the insurance," Adams pointed out. "That number increased to 81% for the first two months of this year."

Drivers who fail to carry the required coverage risk being fined from \$75 to \$200 for the first offense and from \$200 to \$1,000 for subsequent violations. In addition, a conviction under the new law will result in the suspension of the violator's driver license and motor vehicle registration unless the violator established and maintains proof of financial responsibility for five years from the conviction date.

Bears Win Santa Anna Relays

Last Saturday in Santa Anna, the Bears track team showed a lot of promise for the future by scoring 122 points to win the Boy's division of the meet.

The Bears scored 35 points in the field events to take an early lead and were never behind after this. Ricky Defosses won the shot put and discus. Russell Rhynes placed 4th in the shot put and 6th in the Discus. Scott Graham placed 3rd in the high jump and his brother Chris placed 4th in the pole vault.

Freshman, Michael Cerda placed 1st in the 2 mile run and 2nd in the mile run. Chris Graham placed 4th in the 2-mile run and 6th in the mile. The 400 meter relay team of Tuerk, Grant, Ash and Deel placed second, while the Mile

Relay team of Turnbow, S. Graham, Deel, and Ash clinched the meet by winning that event.

Other running event points came from Turnbow who won the 880 dash. Roger Cunningham who placed 3rd in the 400 meter dash, Andy Ash placed 3rd in the 330 hurdles, Scott Graham 5th in the 330 hurdles and Tuerk who was 4th in the 200 meter dash. The Bears possibly missed 10 more points because of a muscle pull which hobbled Sid Grant. He led the pre-lims in the 200 meters but couldn't run in the finals.

This week, the Bears will take a well deserved rest, except for Ricky Defosses who will be participating in the Texas Relays in Austin on Friday.

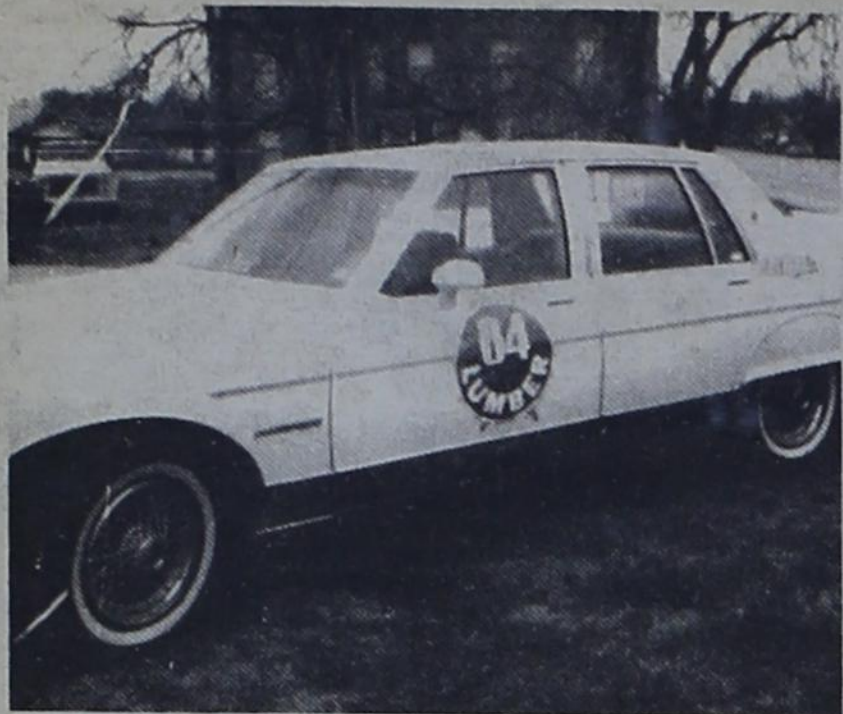
Clyde Graduate ,Lory Moore , Congressional Intern Finalist

The Eleven finalists chosen for the summer Congressional Internship Program were announced by Congressman Charles Stenholm. Defosses Named All-American

Steve Defosses attended the National Collegiate Powerlifting Championships at Huntington W.V., March 19-20.

Participating in his first national meet, Defosses squatted 622.5 pounds, bench pressed 462 and dead lifted 650.5 to total 1,736 pounds, finishing in 3rd in the 242 pound class and winning All-American.

All-American honors went to the top three finishers.

This win will place him in the top 40 in the nation and the top 55 in the world, estimates Defosses.

Defosses, was the only representative from ACU, and is the son of Melba and Roger Defosses of Baird.

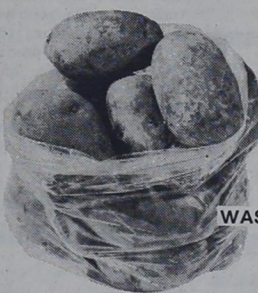

DPS To Waive College Requirements

Colonel Jim Adams, Department of Public Safety director, announced today that "effective with the June recruit class, DPS trooper candidates may substitute law enforcement-related experience for the current educational requirement of 60 college hours. Thus, applicants with two years of commissioned law enforcement experience or two years of honorable ac-

tive military service would be eligible for a waiver of the two-year college requirement. Likewise, one year of such qualifying experience could be substituted

for one year of college work."

"This temporary modification is intended to increase the reservoir of qualified applicants yet ensure

a continuance of the high personal standards which have been the hallmark of the Department's success."

"An evaluation of the results of the temporary modification of educational requirements will be conducted to determine whether a continuation is justified."

Colonel Adams said the DPS hopes to recruit 268 new troopers this year, including the 92 who presently are in training.

Recruits live in the DPS law enforcement academy in Austin during the 18 week training course. The starting monthly salary for recruits is \$1,223. Upon graduation, the officers are paid \$1,347 per month plus allowances for uniforms and equipment. These salaries will increase September 1, 1982.

"The Department continues to emphasize the recruitment of minorities consistent with our philosophy that a law enforcement organization must be representative of the community it serves," Adams pointed out.

Of the 92 recruits scheduled to graduate from the law enforcement academy on May 14, 1982, 35 are members of minority groups. There are six women in the class.

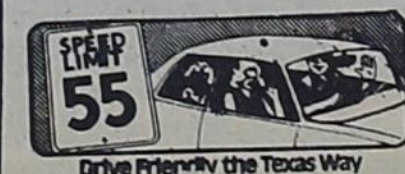

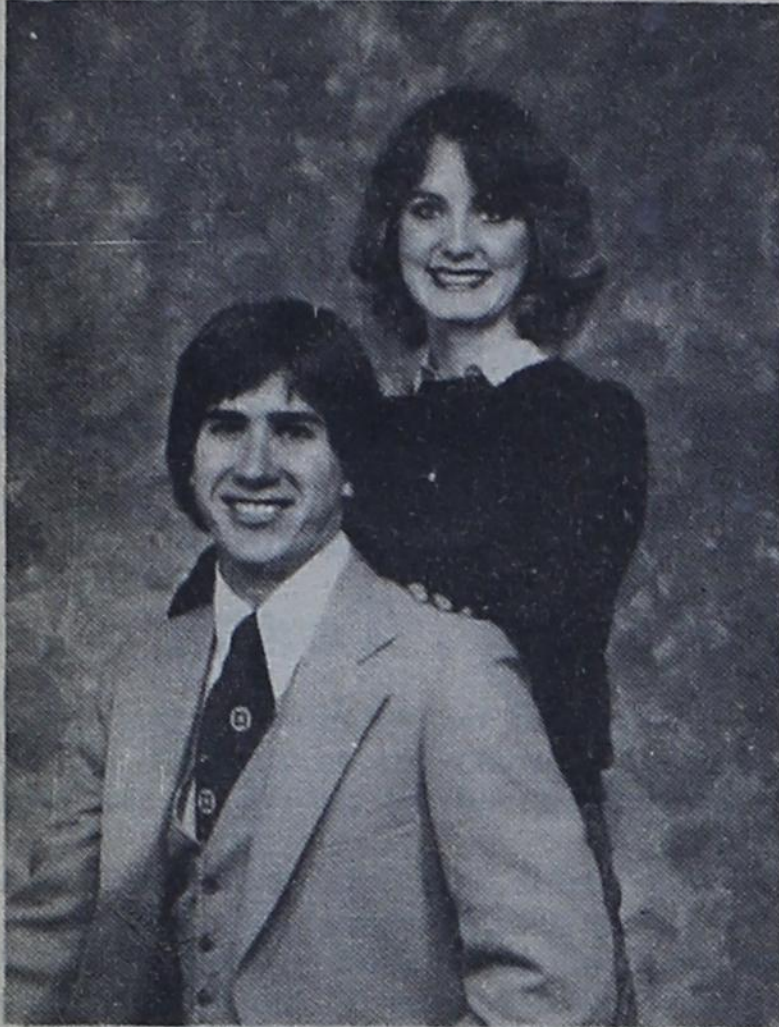
