boys to a bathroom, and living quarters for the house parents.

Boys Ranch is a part of a statewide system, with possibly five being constructed within the state. Lubbock became the first; a second is scheduled for the Brownwood area.

In telling the story, Mr. Moffitt and Dave Anderson, president of the board of Texas Boys Ranch at Lubbock, showed slides of activities at Cal Farley's Boys Ranch near Amarillo and Boys Ranch of Colorado. These two gave valuable assistance in forming the Lubbock ranch. Some of these facts were brought out:

The most important thing is a board of directors composed of dedicated people who believe in what they are doing. Boys Ranch of Texas is governed by a master board, composed of directors of each existing ranch. The local board hires its administrator.

A ranch can be started with 10 boys and a set of house parents, and never takes in more than 100 boys because more effective training can be given the smaller groups, and there is less bind on the public school system. The boys will be attending the local schools. Each ranch will employ about 50 people.

The Lubbock ranch has a budget of \$100,000 for 1973-74, including operational expenses, land and building. Its motto is "Believing in boys today for the men of tomorrow." Moffitt said: "We can't build fast enough to take care of the need.

Contributions are received under several categories: 1. The first 100 people who give \$1,000 become "founders"; 2. Each person giving \$100 or more per year are members of the "Century Ranchers Club"; 3. There are memorial contributions for deceased loved ones, bequests or land or property, etc.; 4. Material gifts of crops, livestock, clothing, equipment and food; and 5. Special gifts and special events.



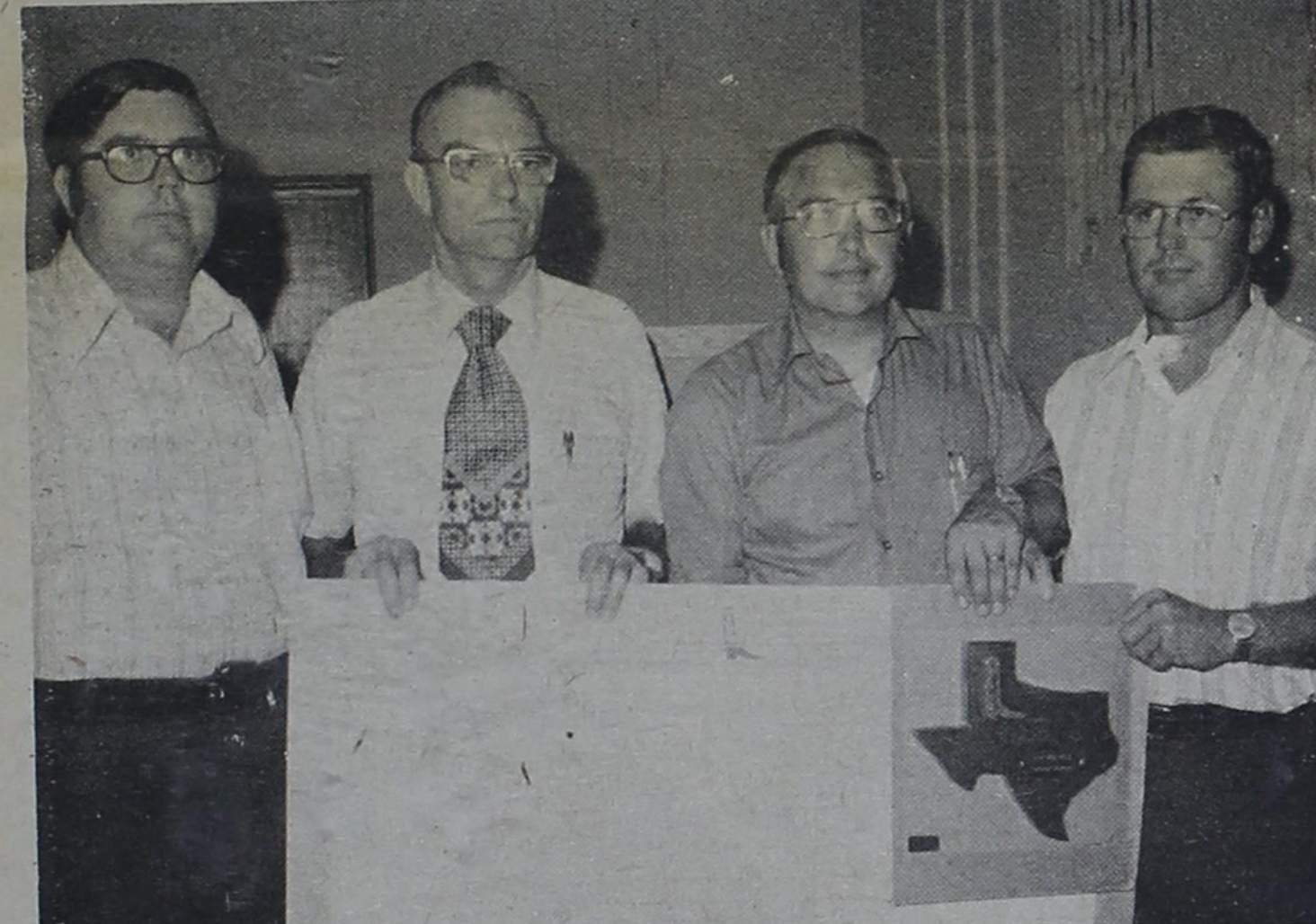
