**KNOX COUNTY COUNCIL HOLDS REGULAR MEETING**

The regular meeting of the Knox County Home Demonstration Council met Saturday, April 14, in Benjamin, with Gillespie, Knox City, Union Grove, Munday, Hefner, Hood and Benjamin clubs answering roll call with reports of work done by club members the past month.

Reports were given by the expansion and Educational committees and a report from the Lubbock Meat Show was given. Mrs. Roy Jones told of the visit to the Jones County Home Demonstration Council at which time Misses Alene and Brodeth, Philippine girls who are in the United States studying Extension Methods, were visitors.

Plans and arrangements were made for sending an exhibit to the Albany Dairy Show and sending a delegation of some 25 women down for the second day, April 14.

The Council voted to publish a Home Demonstration Club Cook Book. The publishing of this book will be financed through advertisements from the business people of the county, while the receipts of the sales will go into the Council to finance county fair, encampments, Meat Show and the sending of delegates and winners in the various contests to the Annual Short Course and the Dallas Fair.

The motion was made, seconded and carried that we adjourn until the first Saturday in May.

**PREPARE FOR WAR ON BUGS!**

How about bugs? Are there any in your garden? Maybe the cut worm has cut your cabbage and tomato plants. If so, mix up some poison bran mash as follows: 2 lbs. dry bran, 2 oz. white arsenic or Paris Green, and 1 pint molasses. Mix together thoroughly and add enough water to make the bran particles hold together. Apply in the late evening along the rows, placing in small piles the size of a twenty-five cent piece.

To wage war on cabbage bus, dis-

solve 1 lb. of soap in 2-3 gallon of water and spray the plants every ten days. This will not kill the bugs but will keep them off the plants. Where tomato worms are damaging the fruit, dust the plants once a week with 1 part of lead arsenate to 4 parts of lime or spray with 1-2 teaspoons of lead arsenate to 1 gallon of water.

Lice can quickly destroy such plants as mustard, turnips, cucumbers, cantaloupes and watermelons. To combat them, spray the plants thoroughly with nicotene, using 1 1/2 tablespoons of this solution to one gallon of water. Spray the plants every 5-7 days to insure keeping down these pests.

More than 500 visitors from 11 counties attended the Albany Dairy Show, April 13 and 14. Knox County was well represented with 20 entries of American Cheese, Cottage Cheese, Milk, Butter and Market Cream and 15 women in attendance.

Mrs. R. M. Renner of the Dairy Department of Texas Technological College, Lubbock, and Mr. J. Lynn Thomas of A. S. M. College Extension Department, judged all the products and also devoted part of Saturday to advanced training in judging among club women. Fifteen teams, 3 from Knox County, received the instruction.

Miss Bess Edwards, Assistant State Home Demonstration Agent, College Station, was present and assisted in handling the exhibit.
