

Story of Christmas Seal Stamps Origination Told By A Columnist

If newspapers of December 10, 1907, had said that small bits of paper sold in Delaware the day before at a penny apiece would in 30 years lead to saving 2,500,000 lives, no one could have believed it. If a woman from Wilmington had not happened to stop in the office of the writer two days later—but "ifs' fade before facts.

In 1903 Einer Holboell, a postal clerk in Denmark, conceived a nonpostage stamp to be used as a messenger of hope on letters and parcels. Issued the next year by the Government, this half-cent sticker raised enough money to start a sanatorium for tuberculous Danish children. These stamps came on letters to the late Jacob Riis, and in July, 1907, he proposed in the Outlook, a Christmas stamp for America.

A few months later Emily P. Bissell of the Delaware Red Cross was asked to raise money for an openair shack, built by a struggling society to help poor victims of the disease, and in dire need of \$300 to keep going. "Why not try the stamp idea." she said to herself. The Wilmington Red Cross told her to go ahead if she could find a way to pay the bill. Tuberculosis then was looked upon as a sort of divine curse, about which little could be done. Even when New York City's (Continued on Page 8)
