| An election for a director to serve in Zone One on the Wichita Brazos Soil and Water Conservation District Board is scheduled for Tuesday, October 9th, at Sutton Station in Vera, announced L. D. Offutt, chairman of the Wichita Brazos SWCD. The election will be at 10:00 a.m. <br> State law decrees that to be eligible to vote in a soil and water conservation district director's election, a person must own agricultural land within the subdivision where the election is being held. The person must also live in the county all or any part of which is in the district and the voter must be 21 years old. <br> Legal qualifications state that a candidate for the office of a soil and water conservation district director must own land in the zone he represents, be 21 years of age and be actively engaged in farming or in a county all or part of | Zone 1 of the district includes all of the land in Knox county between the Brazos and South Fork of the Wichita rivers east of a line about half way between Vera and Benjamin running north and south between the two rivers. <br> The purpose of the Wichita Brazos SWCD, with headquarters in Knox City, is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on farm and ranch lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers and ranchers on conservation matters and other issues affecting pri vate property rights of land owners. <br> The district board of directors coordinates the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations and has authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purpose. |
