The claim of certain religious people that they collected the different books of the Bible and gave it to the world near
the dawn of the fifth century is not in harmony with the facts of history.

The greatest and best manuscript of the Bible in existence is the Codex Sinaiticus. It was discovered on Mt. Sinai in 1844 by the German scholar Tischendorf. This manuscript was written in Greek capital letters on one hundred antelope skins. It is complete except for small portions of the
Testament. The New Testament is complete. Scholars are cestain that it is one of the fifty manuscripts ordered made by the Emperor Constantine in the third century. Certainly this does away with the claim that the books of the
were not gathered until the dawn of the fifth century.
