Because of an omission in the recently-enacted state law, Munday I.S.D. may not include revenue collected by the county education district in the calculation of taxes for the 1992-93 school year. The effect of this is to understate last year's actual school tax rate and produce an inaccurate comparison of last year's tax rate to this year's tax rate.

The correct comparison of tax rates is as follows:

This notice is required by the Texas Legislature *The percentage increase shown in the first paragraph below may appear unusually high
