Borden was also a newspaper reporter best known for, ase the phrase "Remember the Alamo." His words would ater become the battle cry of freedom for the Texans' heoic struggle to gain independence.
However, Gail Borden didn't make history with his early work. What Borden is best known for is milk. Specifically, condensed sweet milk that included additional sugar to prevent spoilage. His story is one of both failure and success. Like many entrepreneurs', fame and fortune did not run up and jump into Borden's lap. He hungered to get head in the food industry, but financial success eluded him in the beginning.
Borden's first food
Borden's first food product-a déhydrated meat biscuit was healthy and nutritious, but failed to sell well with the general public because of its taste.
Borden was nearly broke and traveling by boat in steerage class with poor European immigrants when inspiration struck. He watched many of the babies die on the trip because of infected milk. Haunted by what he had seen, Borden decided to learn how to prevent future disaster. Borden spent months with the Shakers--a religious sect to learn how they used vacuum cooking to preserve food. It was there he learned to remove water from milk to condense and preserve it. When he was
first patent for sweetened, condensed milk.
The Civil War brought Borden's product to the attention of a nation. During and after the war, condensed milk
on its way to becoming an American food institution. They
were the first company to sell fresh milk in bottles. were the first company to sell fresh milk in bottles. They
