The media made it sound as if we are in another Civil War, a country torn by divisiveness. They say we are a nation unable to continue effectively because of the rifts. Even the President - whoever he will be - won't be able to govern this wreck of a naUnion.

Unlike most of the media, I believe America will continue to grow and prosper despite the "alleged" damage done by a close, high-voter turnout election. I still believe in the system. Freedom of choice, freedom to vote, free enterprise and free speech are still working. The fact that record numbers cared enough to vote is invigorating to me. The system still works.

Change is coming
A few months from now - or it may take a year or two - our economy will slow down a little. Prudent business owners, investors, and analysts expect it to.
Why? Because it always has. Business cycles are real, the stock market goes up and down, the economic mood of the people changes and the laws of supply and demand still work.
This election was important because the actions of the government do impact our lives in a great way. This is especially true in the areas of rising taxes (expect to pay even more), increasing regulations
(bureaucracies breed policies, rules and regulations) and growing entitlement programs.
However, the government doesn't run the country. People still do. People decide what is acceptable. People determine what the cause of action will be.

It is said that "sex, money, and power" is the fuel that runs our government. Even in this area there is a split. You see, sex is an inherent drive, built into the human by God. The lust for money and power is learned, and originates from an altogether different source.

## I See the Positive

Here is my take on the "terrible rift." I believe is really a healthy balance of power. Let me explain. Take a United States Congressman from Michiga as an example. If he is overwhelmingly elected by "union" voters, his votes in Washington will favo "union interests" every time. But, if he squeaks ou a narrow victory this time, he must balance his ac tions in order not to alienate anyone for fear of not being elected again in two years.
Now let's look at the House and the Senate. When these bodies are equally divided, they must focus on issues important to all the people. No longer can political muscle (party politics) and splinter group pressure drive legislation through the process.
Now let's assume that you disagree with me on this topic. That's fine, too! We can disagree agreeably, and wait for another ballot. You see your vote in the next election carries exactly the same weigh as mine. Isn't the American system great?

Texas Exile is funded by a grant from the Governor Criminal Justice Division that pays for eight prosecu tors stationed throughout Texas. Since its inception in 1999, the program has netted 181 convictions and ha confiscated more than 850 guns.

WATER TREATY SHOULD BE RECOGNIZED

Much of Texas history, and much of our literature as well, can be
summed up by outline the successes and frus
future.
In few regions is this struggle more evident than in the Ler Rio Valley, where a severe lack of water continues to threaten agriculture and the jobs it provides to valley residents. In addition to suffering from a protracted drought that has affected other areas of Texas as well, South Texas agricultributaries of the Rio Grande water to which they are entitled under the terms of a 1944 treaty with Mexico

For nearly a half-century, the water treaty served Texas and Mexico well because both sides understood its importance. The treaty was intended to ensure water users on both sides of the river minimum amounts of water so
they could manage their withdrawals and plan how it is to be used. The United States has scrupulously observed its treaty obligations for the Colorado River basin and provided Mexico with the amount of water to which it is entitled every year-

As of the beginning of this year, Mexico owed Texas roughly 1.5 million acre-feet of water, a debt going back to 1992 (an acre-foot of water is the volume of water that covers one acre to a depth of one foot). For this reason South Texas' Falcon and Amistad lowest in more than 40 years. The effects of the drought could be eased considerably if Mexico would make good on its treaty obligations.
Recent studies by Texas A\&M University and the Texas Water Development Board suggest the economic impact of Mexico's withholding of this
water to be more than $\$ 400$ million annually. A continuing shortage could water to be more than $\$ 400$ million annually. A continuing shortage could
eventually jeopardize the health of local residents on top of crippling the valley's agriculture-based economy

Last month I introduced a resolution in the Senate calling on the President 10 utilize the full power of his office to require Mexico to comply with the terms of this treaty, and begin repaying the water it has impounded. It also calls
on the U.S. Section of the International Boundary and Water Commission, which oversees the treaty's performance, not to accept anything less than full repayment of water in its attempt to negotiate a settlement of the dispute. A similar measure has been introduced in the U.S. House. I have met with the
Mexican Amt ssador to the United States to discuss this situation as well.

but so far, it has failed as well to present its plan to deliver us the water we are but of far, thas failed
due in 2001 and 2002.
It is my hope that congressional passage of my resolution will impress officials on both sides that Mexico must structure a water repayment plan and do it quickly - before more farmers and ranchers in the valley lose their
livelihoods. Consumers of our great South Texas citrus fruits will also be affected by a reduced supply.

Making certain we have an adequate water supply is critical to Texas and in particular to the Lower Rio Grande Valley. It is vital that Mexico work with

Texas' seasonally adjusted unemployment rate dipped to 4.3 percent in October from September's erevised rate of 4.4 percent, continuing a series of 21 year-lows, the Texas Workforc Commission announced today. "Not only is the unemployment rate down from the previous month," TWC Chair Diane Rath precent lower than it was last Oc tober."
"Services led all major industries in monthly job growth," said Commissioner Representing La ness Services adn Health Services comprising more than half of the jobs in October.
"This is the third consecutive month of job gains in Mining said Commissioner Representing Employers Ron Lehman, " and the industry's annual growth rate of nine-tenths of a precent is the highest rate since July of 1998." The lowest unemployment rate among the Metropolitan Statistical Areas was 1.4 percent in Bryan-College Station. Austin San Marcos was next at 1.9 percent, followed by Lubbock at 2.2 percent, Dallas at 3.0 percent, and Wichita Falls and Fort Worth-Ar lington both at 3.1 percent.
