FARM NEWS

PROGRAM
from the County Agricultural Conservation Committee

MARKET PRICES ARE ABOVE FARM SUPPORT LEVELS

If the housewife were paying prices for food at the Government price-support level instead of the current market prices, the cost of living would be considerably lower, B. F. Vance, Chairman of the State Production and Marketing Administration Committee, said today.

Commenting on the charge that farm price-supports are causing high food prices, Mr. Vance said that many consumers lose sight of the fact that the program is not designed to keep prices "high," but rather to balance the farmer's income with his cost of operations and living. The price-support level therefore rises or falls according to the relationship between the two.

"Prices for food and other things figured in the cost of living have been steadily rising since 1946," Mr. Vance points out, "and prices of farm products generally have been above the support level since 1942. Price-support operations are directed by law and have been in effect for only a few products such as potatoes and eggs."

"We also have a situation now where prices of corn and wheat are down to the support level and yet prices are still high for some meat animals, such as beef cattle, which have no price-sup-

port programs.

"For most of the important farm commodities under the support program, prices can be supported only at 90 percent of parity. If cattle were selling at full parity, the price would be 14 cents a pound, yet the market price to farmers today is around 24 cents a pound. Hogs at the 90-percent-of-parity figure would be selling at 17 cents a pound, whereas the market price is 27 cents a pound."

ACP ELECTIONS JUST AHEAD

Farmers of Texas should begin thinking about the committee-men they want to administer the 1949 Agricultural Conservation and Price Support Programs, says B. F. Vance, Chairman of the State PMA Committee.

Elections for community and county committeemen will be held in most counties of Texas. In each community of those counties farmers will elect a community committee to administer the farm program in that community and to advise with the county committee in the administration of the program in the county. Also at the community election, delegates will be elected to attend a county convention where a county committee will be elected.

The chairman suggests that now is the time for farmers of the State to appraise the work of committeemen who are now ad-

ministering the program. If they are doing a good job and are doing it as well or better than anyone could do it, then the farmers in the Community and county should support them by turning out at election time and give them a vote of confidence. If the committees can be improved by electing someone else, then that should be done.

In the words of the chairman: "One of the real pillars of strength in the farm program is the elected farmer-committeemen. The way to keep this strength is for farmers to participate in elections and see to it that the people best qualified to serve as committeemen are elected. The caliber of committeemen we elect this fall may have a lot to do with the future of the farm program. Conservation of our soil and water resources is vital to the well-being of the Nation. We must have the best committeemen we can get to administer this program, the Nation's direct effort to assure the future food supply."

BEAUTY CREAM

W. R. Morgan, County Agricultural Agent of Henderson County is recommending a "beauty cream" with which to give "Mother Earth" a beauty treatment. The "beauty cream" contains phosphate, legume seed, and inoculant.

The advantages of using this beauty cream are:

- (1) Adds fertilizer (nitrogen) to the soil.
- (2) Saves the fertilizer that is already in the soil.
- (3) Adds humus (vegetable matter) to the soil.
- (4) Prevents Erosion.
- (5) Furnishes Vitamin and Protein (potash) in Winter.

Directions for Cream Application:

- (1) Spread 200 to 400 pounds of 20% phosphate or 200 pounds 20% Potash and 200 pounds O-14-7 to each acre of the face.
- (2) Mix the legume seed and inoculant.
- (3) Spread 20 pounds (in rows) or 50 pounds (broadcast) if Peas or 10 pounds (in rows) or 25 pounds broadcast if Hairy Vetch is used.
- (4) Work the mixture 2 inches deep into the face.

WHEN: As soon after Sep-

tember 1 as season will permit. Can be applied as late as November 15, but the later the poorer the returns.

CAUTION: Neither the bacteria that make the Nitrogen nor the Legume can be fooled—be sure to use the phosphate, potash and inoculant. If small grain is used in the cream, the legume seed can be cut half.

PAYMENTS: The AAA will pay 94 cents per hundred pounds for the 20% phosphate under Winter Legumes; 85 cents per 100 pounds for O-14-7 used under legumes; 13 and 8/10 cents per pound for Hairy Vetch; and 5 1/2 cents per pound on Austrian Winter Peas. The AAA requirements for planting are: Peas 15 lb. in rows; 30 lb. drill; 40 lb. hand broadcast. Vetch 8 lb. in rows; 15 lb. in drill; 20 lb. hand broadcast.

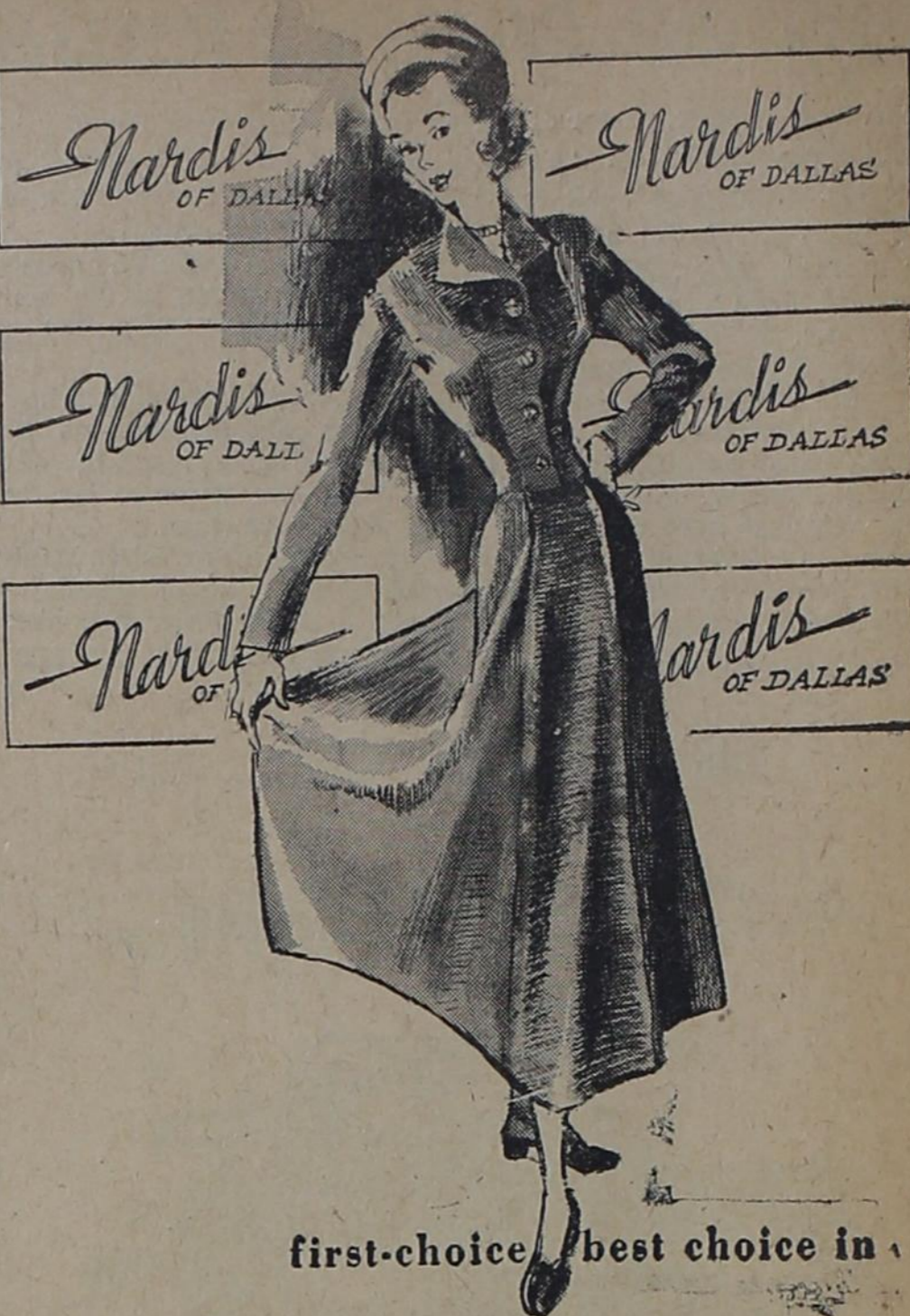

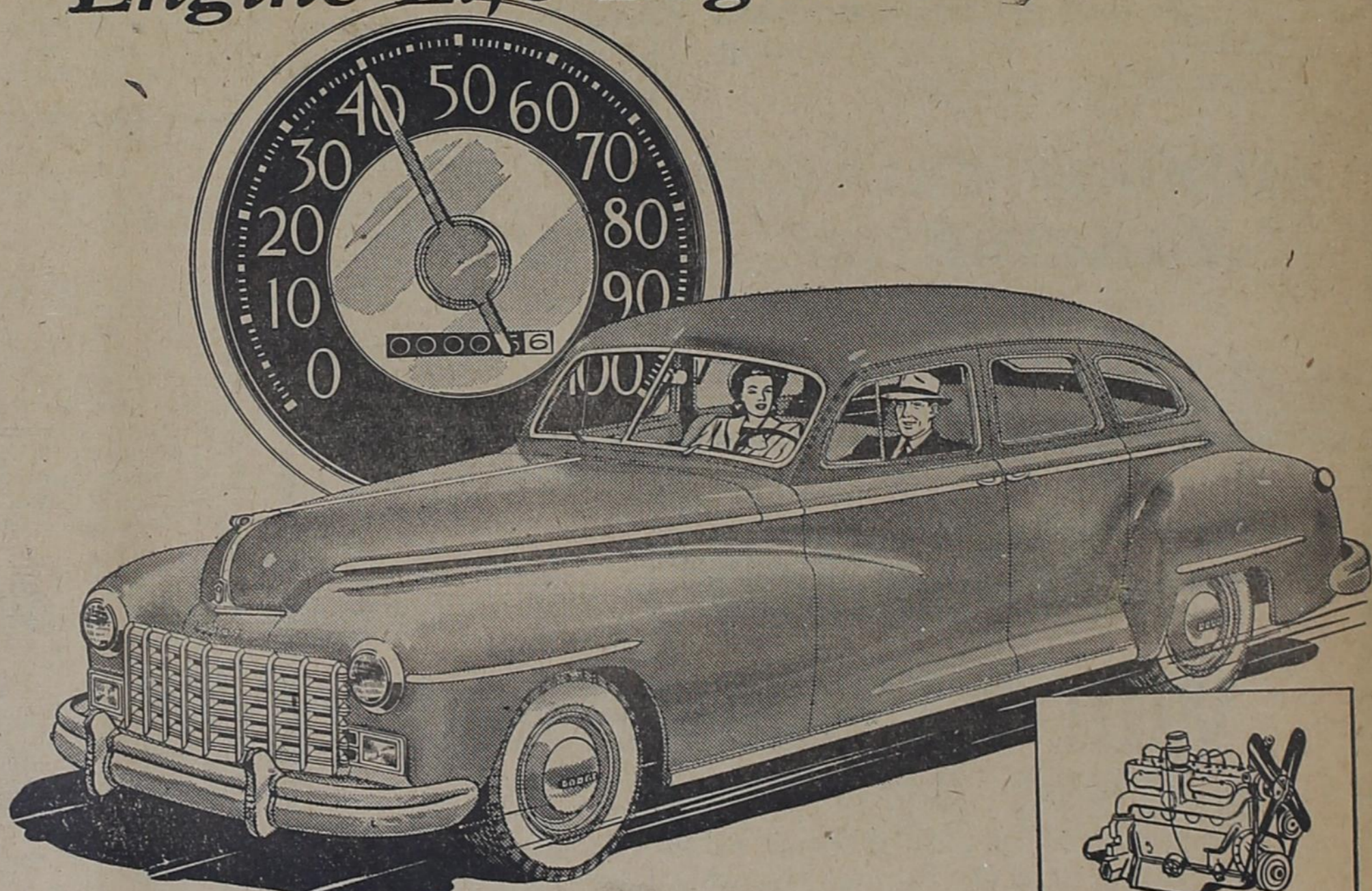

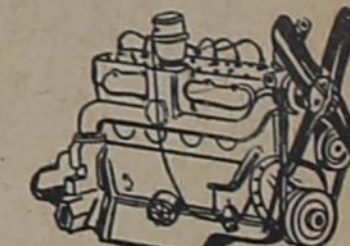

Veterans' News

Prior notice from the Veterans Administration will be sent to veterans whose National Service Insurance term policies will start expiring on or after October 8, 1948.

The notice will be sent two months before expiration date of the original policies. This will give the veterans time to convert their term insurance to a permanent NSLI plan or renew their term insurance for an additional five-year period. Renewals may be made without a physical examination, but at a higher premium rate based on the veterans' attained age at the time of renewal. VA stressed the fact that veterans who plan to renew their term insurance should submit their renewal application, plus a premium payment, prior to the expiration date of the original term policy.

More than a million and a half veterans were in training under the provisions of the GI Bill on September 1, 1948, VA reported. Over half—871,000—were studying in schools and colleges, with 267,000 enrolled for institutional on-farm training and 414,000 taking on-the-job.

"Encouraging progress", especially in the development of new methods of diagnosis, is revealed in the first reports from doctors working with the Veterans Administration's radio-isotope research program.

VA revealed that Leukemia patients are now being treated with radio-phosphorus in most of the VA hospitals having radio-isotope units. Radio-iodine is being employed to treat some thy-

roid diseases.

Questions and Answers

Q. I am a World War II veteran and would like to know if VA will pay my doctor if I go to him for an examination to determine whether I need hospital treatment or domiciliary care?

A. The government will pay the cost of examinations by a private physician only if Veterans Administration has given the physician prior authority for such examination.

Q. I have purchased my home without a G-I loan. May I secure a guaranteed loan to buy furniture?

A. No. Q. I am enrolling under the G-I Bill in a college that collects tuition in advance. There is a chance that I will be forced to drop out before the end of the semester. Must I refund any money to VA?

A. You must refund the tuition that VA paid for the time you did not attend, or lose the training time covered by these payments.

Q. Is it true that I no longer can reinstate my lapsed National Service Life Insurance policy?

A. No. You can still reinstate your policy on a "comparative health basis" within three months from the date of lapse. If your policy has been lapsed for more than three months, you will be required to pass a physical examination to reinstate. Necessary premiums must be paid.

Ranger's Last Patrol

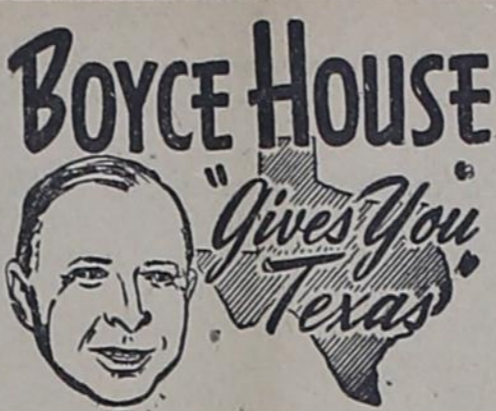

Durst was commissioned a Ranger in 1918, serving on the Texas border patrol. He joined the refinery guard force immediately after Pearl Harbor. A protection system, only slightly relaxed from that used in wartime, is still maintained at this refinery, country's largest in point of production, to safeguard petroleum resources so critical to both the national defense and economy.

The State Constitution provides that, every 10 years, the State shall be re-districted, in accordance with the new census. But Texas has not been re-districted since 1921.

There have, of course, been many changes in population in 27 long years. The result is a situation of gross inequality. There are some House of Representatives districts with five and six times as many people as some other districts.

Nor is this unfair condition

confined to a single part of the State. It has been said that South and West Texas are being discriminated against by the failure of the legislature to do its duty. And this is true. But consider that there is one East Texas district with 109,000 and there are lots of districts over the State with less than 25,000 citizens and one with only 19,000. Contrast this one with a second district in East Texas with 127,000 inhabitants.

Yet the district with only 19,000 people has the same power in making laws as the district with 127,000—six times more people and another has 463,000, which is the 1940 census, and the latest estimate is that the district has grown to 754,000. It is the Lower Rio Grande Valley district.

Repeatedly, the legislature has failed to do its duty. Now the people have a chance to take action. In the November 2 general election, Constitutional Amendment 2 will be voted on. This

provides that a commission shall have power to re-district if the legislature refuses. The commission will consist of the lieutenant governor, speaker of the House, attorney general, state comptroller and land commissioner.

A situation whereby a man living in one district has only one-sixth of the voice in the making of the laws which he lives as a man somewhere else is not democracy. It is indefensible.

Let's pass Constitutional Amendment 2 and change that condition!
