



THUMPER AT WORK-One of the newest devices aiding the search for oil is the "thumper." The "thumper" is a truck, carrying a concrete slab weighing 6000 pounds. The truck moves across country, dropping the slab-at intervals -from a height of 12 feet onto the ground. The shock waves produced by the "thump" and reflected from underground formations are recorded on graphs after being picked up by sensitive microphones buried along the route of the truck. Although the thumper is a seismic operation, it does the job without the usual explosions used in conventional seismograph work.


