BILL NUMBER 33.

An ordinance concerning the Judge of the Corporation Court, and the manner of collecting Fines and Costs in the Corporation Court.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the Attest-M. W. Cunningham, City Secretary. City of Amarillo, Texas as follows:

Section 1. The Judge of the Corporation Court, shall keep a docket in which he shall nature and character of the offense, the date of trial, the names of all witnesses sworn and examined, the findings of the Court or Jury, the day of issuing commitment if any, and all oth er facts necessary to show full proceedings of

Section 2. The Judge of the Corporation shall be a conservator of the peace, shall have power to administer oaths, and may fine and imprison for contempt offered him while hold. the daily also goes in the weekly,
