## BILL NUMBER 33

An ordinance concerning the Judge of the Corporation Contt, aud the mamer of collecting Fines and Custs in the Corporation Court
Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Amarillo, Texas as follows:
Section 1. The Judge of the Corporation Court, shall keep a docket in which he shall the proceedings therein. He shall enter in his said docket the name of the complainant, tho nature and character of the of nse, the date of trial, the names of all witnesses sworn and examined, the findings of the Cours or Jury, the judgment of the Conrt therein, the amonnt of fine and costs, the date of payment if any, the day of issuing commitment if any, and all oth er facts necessary to show full proceedings of the case.

Section 2. The Judge of the Corporation Court, shall perform all duties impused on him by law, and the ordinances of this City; he shall be a conservator of the peace, shall have power to administer oaths, aud may fine and imprison for contempt offered him while hold-
ing court, in the same manner, and to the same extent, as is now provided by law in Justice Courts of this State. He shall be diligent, and use all lawful means to enforce obedience to and compliante with all orders, rules, judgments and sentences by him made.
Section 3. If any defendant plead, or be found guilty, the Judge of the Corporation Court, shall declare and assess the pumshment prescribed by ordinances according to hisfind ings, or the vedict of the Jury, and io render judgment accr dingly, and for costs of suit; and it shall be a part of said judgment, that the defendant: stand committed until judgment is complied wist, and it shall be deemed a part of the judgme: 1 anl sentence of the Court that such defendans shall work upon the public strents, high wiss, alleys or other public works of the City. as equired by law, until the judg.时保
Section 4. Al such defendants, as provided for in the proceeding sections, shall be commit red to the custody of the City Marshal, and it shall be made his duty to see that the judgment of the Court if fully carried ont as provided herein, and it shall be his duty to render a statement under oath at eaclo regular meeting of the City Courcil, of the di position of each and every defendant commirted to his ensto. $d y$, as to the mannor in which said fines and costs hare been paic; and all defendants who shall have bern committed to his custody, and who is defan't of the parment of fine and costa, shan be requira tur work on me punlicestremes. alleys. \&e., as herein provided, shall be under theimmediate control of the Marshal or his le gal deputy, by the advice and direction of the Sireet and Alley committee.
Section 5 . All defendants who by the provis. ions of the proce ding sections sinall beenfore ed to work on the Streets, alleys, or any pub. lic works, shall befallowed the sum of $\$ 100$ per day for each days laber performed as herein provided, and a strict account of such labol shall be kept by the Marshal, or his legalis authorized deputy.
Section 6. All ordinances or parts ni ardi nances inconsistant with this ordinance, are hereby repoaled.

Section 7 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
