



Dr. Harvey W. Wiley, thief of the bureau of chemistry, department of agriculture, is deprived of part of the power he has been exercising by a clause in the agricultural appropriation bill. Doctor Wiley, who heretofore has issued citations to hearings whenever examinations made in his bureau seemed to justify him in demanding of the manufacturer an explanation of any article of food or drug product which it was thought did not come up to the standard of purity required by the food and drug act, will now confine his work practically to his laboratory. His other powers will be transferred to the solicitor of the department.
