





That at the next general election of the State of Texas for the election of State officers, or at a previous general election, in case a general election for the State shall be sooner or ordered by the Governor for other purposes, there shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Texas, for their adoption or rejection, the following amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas, as provided for in Section 1, Article 17, of said Constitution, relating to proposed amendments thereto, it being intended to amend Section 24, Article 3, of said Constitution, relating to the pay of members of the Legislature, and extention of term of regular sessions, so that the said Section shall read as
