

Waco, July 15.—Telephone messages received here last night state that the negro who chubbed, cut and otherwise injured Mrs. Benjamin Robert last Tuesday, the 11th inst., was lynched near the scene of the crime. The negro was caught in the Brazos bottoms, taken to Golindo and swung the state of the crime. A negro who admitted giving the fugitive a revolver and money was singled out and the impression here is that he was compelled, under the lash, to divulge the hiding place of his friend. The towns of Golindo, Robinson Rosenthal and Gurley are close together, and at all the places named business has been, in a large degree, sus pended ever since the outrage was committed.

One of the messages received here last night came to County Judge Baker, stating that the guilty negro had been hung, and that he was hung at 34 Golindo. Fear was also expressed that the great crowd of lyachers assembled had worked themselves into such a fronty that they will hang others who refused to divulge the hiding place of the fugitives.

The sheriffs of Falls and McLennan counties and many other officers are on their way to Golindo, which is fitten miles away from here, and not connected by felephone.

Sea Water.

Sea water is a complicated mixture of a great variety of substances. Roughly speaking, it consists of 95½ per cent of fireh water plus 3½ per cent of mineral saits. Three-fourths of these saits are chloride of aodium, or common table sait, and the next increment of the saits are chloride of magnesium, sulphate of lime, sulphate of potash, bromide of magnesium, and carbonate of lime. In addition to these substances sea water contains minute quantities of quite a variety of elements, including lodine, phosphate and arsenie. It also contains some silver copper, zinc, nickel, cobalt, fron and gold. There is said to be 2 cents water, but as yet nobody has found a way to extract R. Copper and zinc are found in some seaweds, and certain species of coral is three-millionths silver.
