lynched near the scene of the crime. The negro was caught in the Brazos
bottoms, taken to Golindo and swung bottoms, taken to Golindo and swung
up by a lynching party consisting of 500 tarmers.

oceurred in the town four miles north of Golindo. The neighbors of the Robert familly, reinforced by armed and mounted men from Falls County, and from the por-
tion of McLennan county, south of tlon of McLennan county, south of
the clty, gathered and arrested a aozthe elty, gathered and arrested a aoz
en negroes known to be acquainted
with the one charged with the crime A negro who admitted giving the fugitive a revolver and money was singled out and the impression here is that he was compelled, under the lash, to di-
vulge the hiding place of his friend. vulge the hiding place of his friend.
