One held on drug felony

Sheriff Jim Pippin arrested Steve Hays of route 3 with a search warrant for his car Sunday night and found substances believed to be cocaine and marijuana plus various kinds of smoking paraphernalia and several check books belonging to Lubbock people. Hays was in the county jail Wednesday unable to make \$5,000 bond awaiting grand jury action on a felony possession drug charge. Hays' car was impounded. The substances found in the car were taken to the DPS lab for analysis.

Phones out hour here

Post's phone service was interrupted for about an hour Monday night when the ringing machine in the central office here blew a fuse. Approximately 85 percent of the phones in Post were affected between 8 and 9 p.m. according to Doyle Bradshaw, plant foreman from Hurlwood. This was the first time in a long time that Post has had a major outage and Bradshaw said he was sorry for any inconvenience that this may have caused customers.

Thief runs off with Allsup's receipts

An unidentified robber literally ran off with Tuesday's receipts for Allsup's store at 402 West Eighth late Tuesday night.

Sheriff Jim Pippin told The Dispatch that Willie Tate was locking up the store at 11:23 p.m. when the theft occurred.

He said she took the checks and cash in a box to her car and then returned to the store to lock the front door.

While she was locking the door, someone who evidently had been watching opened the car door, grabbed the money box and took off running down the street.

The thief was too far away on the darkened street for the store keeper to make

any identification.

Sheriff Pippin said the amount of the loss was undetermined but that all the checks had been stamped for deposit only and could not be cashed.

Three night deputies went to three local homes within minutes of the robbery and asked permission to search the homes for the missing store receipts. Permission was granted but the stolen money was not found.

Sheriff Pippin said he has three night deputies on duty until the Christmas rush was over. He asked merchants or clerks locking up stores at night to call the sheriff's office and a deputy will be sent to stand by during store closing hours.

The Calvary Baptist Church Christmas day service will be held from 10:30

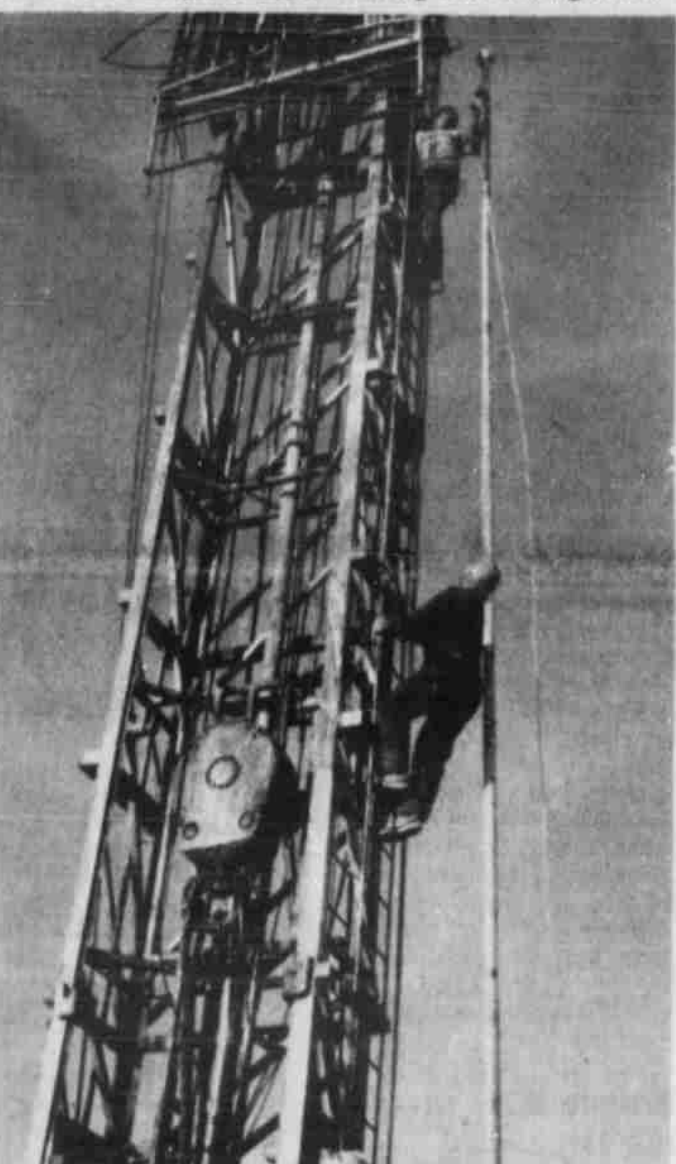
to 11:30 a.m. with no evening services.

Some Christmas Thoughts

Christmas is the holiday for the young. Either the young in age or the young in heart.

Christmas also is the holiday of memories. It is so easy to drift back across the years to other times, and other places, remembering friends, daughters or sons when they were pink cheeked and oh, so small, or other loved ones by your side now gone.

Christmas is changing, or is it? Only a generation ago, Christmas was the time one looked around to find others who needed a helping hand and then helped them secretly. No one ever knew from where that big basket of food came from, or the toys for the children, or the warm clothing. The joy of that giving was in holding it inside one's own heart.

Then came the "organized way." One turned in the name of the "needy" and donated to a Christmas fund and for that often saw his name and the amount of his contribution printed on the front page of his newspaper as they still do in Lubbock today.

That is on its way out now. And we're not sure what's taking over. We think maybe the spirit of Christmas giving is all but lost in today's harried world.

We hope so. We hope that woman did something about it herself.

The dove of peace is always a Christmas symbol. Haven't you noticed that. The Christmas spirit is world wide and especially in World War I, in the trench warfare on the stalemated western front, Christmas was celebrated as a day of peace and brotherly love. They tell stories even now of how the enemies stopped the killing for a day on Christmas. At least for that day only brotherly love prevailed.

America is so young. One realizes this on travels to other lands where a hundred years is only a yesterday and a thousand isn't really much. Consequently, we don't have our deep-rooted traditions as do other countries. The Christmas traditions of the "Old World" are really traditions, and deserving of your study.

Is the true religious significance of Christmas being crowded out by the family gatherings, the avalanche of gifts, and all its gaiety and parties? Answer that one for yourself, then ask yourself why.

The shining eyes and wonderment of a small child on Christmas morning best illustrates Christmas for all of us. Christmas is the birthday observance of a man who long ago died for the sins of the world, not only in his day but in the ages to come. When we comprehend his promise we too must have shining eyes and be filled with wonderment. Such is the Spirit of Christmas.

Christmas has its own music and most beloved. Some writer here and one there is always adding a bit to its magic. Really, the best thing about the modern Christmas is that Christmas music is now so much more available to everyone through radio, television and stereo.

But still the best music of Christmas is that sung by yourself and your friends in a wide variety of church programs. The church choir always reaches its zenith at Christmas time. And the church congregation always sing louder when the time comes again to start singing the Christmas hymns because they are the best known by the average pew-sitter.
