Normally, one terrace will
over-top.
This starts a small hole in the terrace, and in just a
little while you've got a littieken terrace.
Once one of them breaks,
chances are pretty good that chances are pretty good that the rest of the terraces will
break.
Utilizing permanent grass windstrips, such as weeping lovegrass, on terraces can eliminate this problem. All in all, wind stripcropping is a multi-purpose
alternative to help hold alternative to help hold
down soil erosion and maintain soil moisture. These two benefits in
