# High School Band, Choir Leaders Killed in Two-Car Accident Sunday 

By Wes Burnett A tragic two-car accident Sunday Lubbock sent shock waves through Post with death of Steve and Dianna Ladd $2 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. in the new school auditorium. He was the Post High School band director and she was PHS choir director. Their two year old daughter, Stephanie received a severe concussion and as of received a severe concussion and as of Tuesday was listed in serious condition at Lubbock General Hospital's pediatric intensive care.
