



natural gas prices. "These dramatic declines in oil and gas prices are unprecedented in the last 50 years that the Texas oil and gas industry has been supporting our state and local governments through mic downturn.

Hudson said, "This economic condition was regognized by the State Comptroller in May of 1985, almost a year ago, when he gave his estimate for revenues for the current biennium, and there have been many other factors that have heralded this dramatic event."

Never before in history has the oil and gas industry experienced such an econo-

Oil and gas exploration projects are being postponed or totally scrapped as companies restructure their organizations to survive.

Families & Financial crisis No family wants to be in

financial crisis. That's why we try to prevent it by learning about budgeting and family finan-

cial management. But there are many factors which can force any family aimost financial straits - at least temporarily.

The Texas families facing financial problems include:

- Farm families. Economic conditions in agriculture have placed a severe financial strain on some farmers. Not only does the farm enterprise suffer, but the family finances feel the squeeze too.

- Unemployed families. Practically every family experiences unemployment at one time or another. Plant closings or layoffs can affect a whole community as well as individual families. Unemployment may be buffered somewhat in twopaycheck families. When a family's lifestyle and debt level are based on having both incomes, however, the effects of unemployment will still be considerable.

-High debt families. To buy a home, many families have taken on debts that consume a fourth to a third of their incomes. In addition, the availability of credit for almost every type of purchase has increased the debt level of many families. Families deep in debt may not have the resources to meet a financial emergency, such as unemployment. Some have faced foreclosure on their homes.

- Fixed income elderly. Faced with rising medical costs and other expenses and fixed incomes, many older families experience difficult economic times. Even families that planned carefully for retirement may face a period of adjustment as they down-scale their lifestyle to fit their retirement income.

Single heads of households. Figures show that divorce typically means a substantial drop in income and standard of living especially for mothers who

This monitoring visit included an inspection of (1) civil rights compliance, (2) community conditions, (3) governance of the school district, (4) school district planning, (5) rules for instruction (including house bill 72 and chapter 75), (6) instruction, (7) student services, (8) instructional resources, (9) personnel, and (10) physical facilities.

All school board members and the superintendent will receive a detailed written report of this inspection within six weeks.

This report will be similar to the exit interview.

An exit interview is conducted only if one or more local board members are present, according to Johnson.

In the past there was no requirement for board members to be present, and in at least one case in another part of the state, a school official withheld exit
