Incumbent David Tyler is on the ballot with Ronny Ammons and Norma

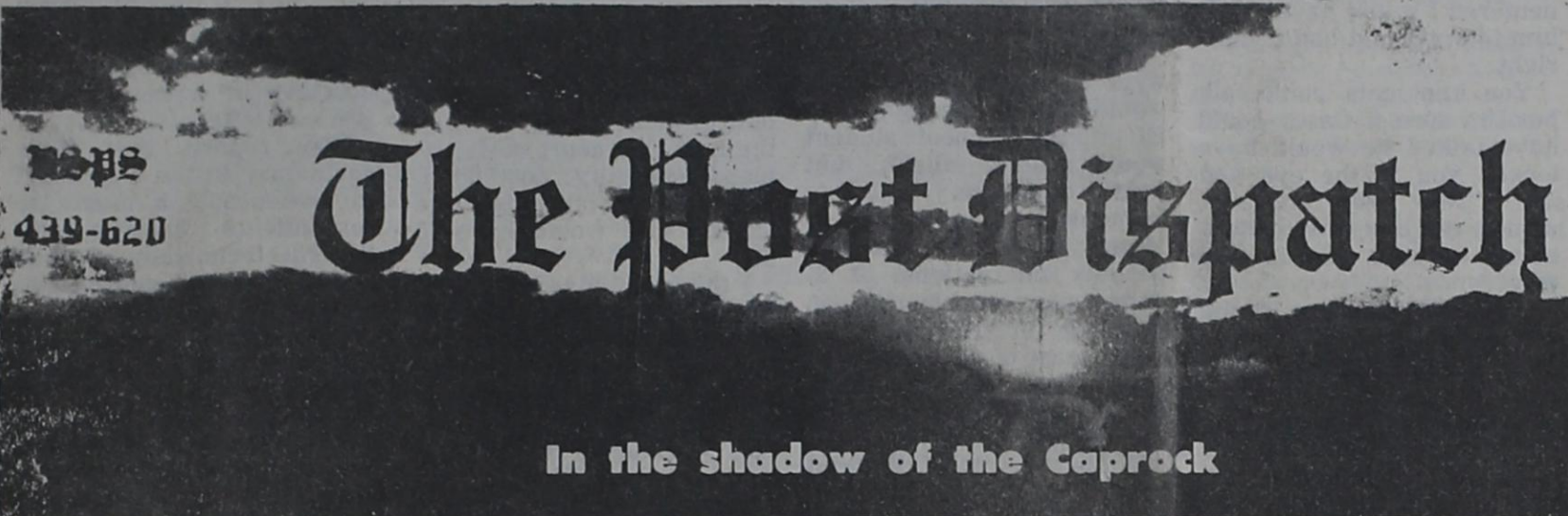

### Letter to the Editor:

Proof that we DO have a double standard in Post, as of this date, March 31, 1986.

On the 14th of March, I filed a Citizens Complaint against the Sheriff, Jim Pippin, for not wearing his seat belts; a violation of State Law.

To this complaint, I swore an oath in front of Judge Greene in City Court.

On the 24th of March, I went to Judge Greene and asked her if anything had been done about my complaint against the Sheriff.

She looked in her record book and said that Constable Lonnie Gene Peel had served the summons to the Sheriff because he had not returned it to her.

To this date, Judge Greene said the Sheriff had not answered her summons. I asked her what she was going to do about it.

Judge Greene said that she had gone to the Sheriff's office several times to talk to him about it, but she kept missing him.

I then asked Judge Greene what the normal procedure was if someone ignores a summons from her court?

To this she replied, "A warrant is issued for their arrest".

I asked her why this had not been done in this case, and she said, "I have to try to keep a working relationship between the Sheriff's office and my court".

I think if Judge Greene is not willing to treat everyone equally, she should vacate her office and return everyone's forty dollar fines for this violation that she has collected to this date.

The longer period has been a matter of procedure in the city court.

Pool also says that the sheriff tried to contact Judge Greene last Friday (when city hall was closed) and again Monday (when Judge Greene was not in).

As of Tuesday afternoon, April 1, the facts in Riedel's letter appear to be accurate.

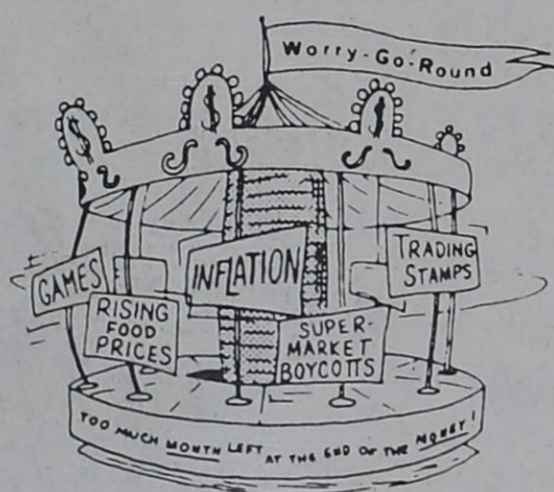

## Drilling Report

A possible production interval has been perforated in the San Andres Formation at the No. 1 Ben Altman "A" in Garza County's PHD Field.

Brothers Production is the operator.

The well was drilled to total depth of 4,285 feet and was plugged back to 4,095.

Perforations were shot at 3,758 to 3,767 feet into the hole.

The operation is eight miles northwest of Post.

Good commercial shows have been reported at the No. 712 Northwest Garza Unit in the Garza Field three miles northwest of Post.

Perforations have been made in the Glorieta Formation, 3,703 to 3,784 feet into the wellbore.

The well was spudded last August with Ray J. Diekemper Jr. as the operator.

Completion testing has been ordered at the No. 1 Justice, a Garza County wildcat located about 7.5 miles northwest of Post.

With Marshall and Winston Inc. as the operator, the well is

bottomed at total depth of 8,780 feet.

It had carried permit for 9,250 ft TD when spudded in mid-February.

Shallower pay has been confirmed at the No. 1 Swenson "F", an 11-year-old producer in Garza County's Barron Ranch Field, 15 miles northeast of Post.

The well pumped 17 barrels of 42-gravity oil with 16 barrels of salt water on an open choke.

Kerr-McGee is the operator.

Production is from the Strawn Formation through an open hole interval 7,178 to 7,187 feet into the hole.

The well originally produced from the Ellenburger Formation at 7,695 to 7,712 feet into the wellbore.

Western Reserves Oil has bottomed the No. 1 Tufbow at total depth of 7,710 feet in Garza County's Tufbow Field after spudding the well last Jan. 20.

Completion testing is planned.

The well is three miles northeast of Justiceburg, with location in the H&TC Survey.

Drilling operations are nearing projected total depth at the No. 3 Jim Hall, a developmental bid in Garza County's Dorward Field, four miles southeast of Justiceburg. Spudded on Feb. 13 by Exxon Corp., the venture carries permit for 2,600 feet of hole.

## Concern Expressed about Tax Revenues

Richard C. Hudson, chairman of Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association, today expressed his concern about the valuation of oil and gas properties by local jurisdictions in light of the dramatic drop in crude oil and natural gas prices.

"These dramatic declines in oil and gas prices are unprecedented in the last 50 years that the Texas oil and gas industry has been supporting our state and local governments through

severance taxes and local property taxes."

Hudson said, "This economic condition was regognized by the State Comptroller in May of 1985, almost a year ago, when he gave his estimate for revenues for the current biennium, and there have been many other factors that have heralded this dramatic event."

Never before in history has the oil and gas industry experienced such an economic downturn.

Drilling operations and

the workover of older wells have been curtailed or in many instances abandoned.

Oil and gas exploration projects are being postponed or totally scrapped as companies restructure their organizations to survive.

"The property tax law provides that valuations be on a fair market value," said Hudson.

He urged that "local taxing jurisdictions make their valuations based on market conditions that have existed for well over a year

and currently exist in the values of oil and gas."

Hudson stressed that "in areas where major oil and gas properties are located, government officials must seriously consider drastic reductions in budgetary funding requirements for 1986 and subsequent years."

He said, "All taxing entities which are touched by the current economic downturn should trim operating budgets and defer capital spending in all cases where possible."

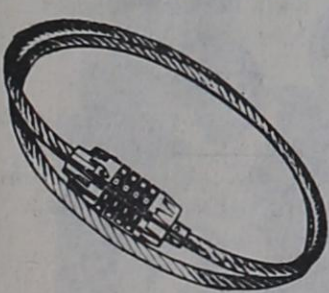

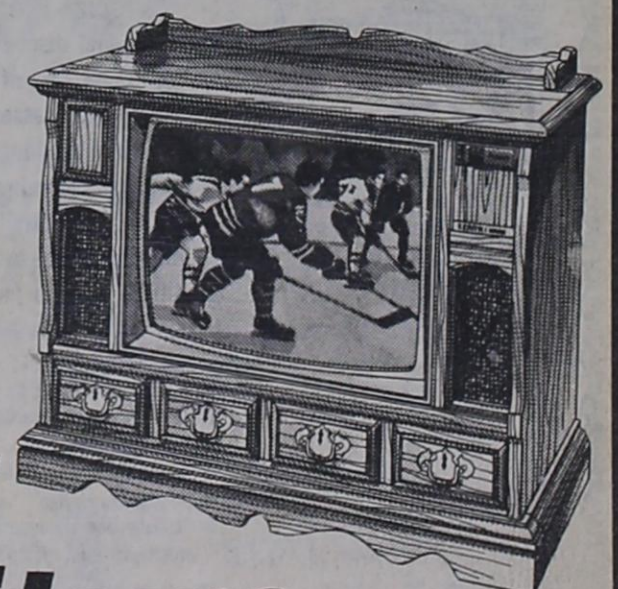

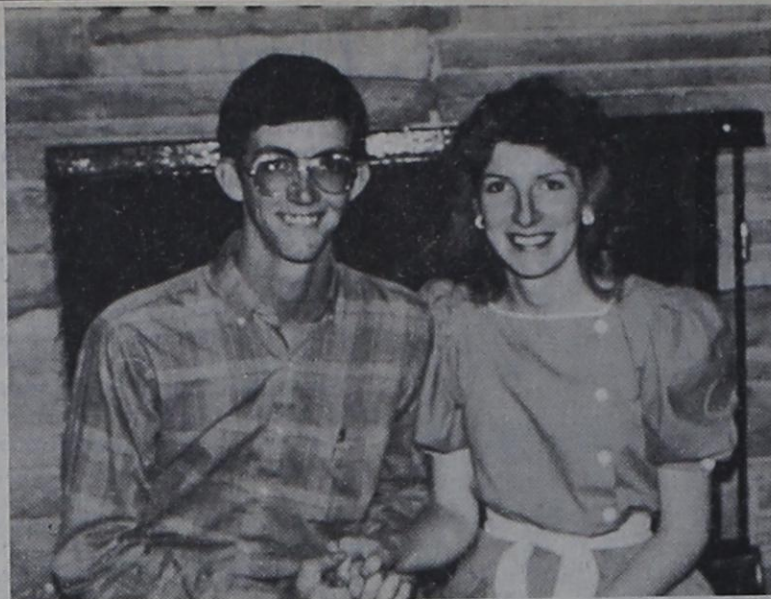

**Families & Financial crisis**  
No family wants to be in financial crisis.

That's why we try to prevent it by learning about budgeting and family financial management.

But there are many factors which can force almost any family into financial straits - at least temporarily.

The Texas families facing financial problems include:

- Farm families. Economic conditions in agriculture have placed a severe financial strain on some farmers. Not only does the farm enterprise suffer, but the family finances feel the squeeze too.

- Unemployed families. Practically every family experiences unemployment at one time or another. Plant closings or layoffs can affect a whole community as well as individual families. Unemployment may be buffered somewhat in two-paycheck families. When a family's lifestyle and debt level are based on having both incomes, however, the effects of unemployment will still be considerable.

- High debt families. To buy a home, many families have taken on debts that consume a fourth to a third of their incomes. In addition, the availability of credit for almost every type of purchase has increased the debt level of many families. Families deep in debt may not have the resources to meet a financial emergency, such as unemployment. Some have faced foreclosure on their homes.

- Fixed income elderly. Faced with rising medical costs and other expenses and fixed incomes, many older families experience difficult economic times. Even families that planned carefully for retirement may face a period of adjustment as they down-scale their lifestyle to fit their retirement income.

- Single heads of households. Figures show that divorce typically means a substantial drop in income and standard of living - especially for mothers who

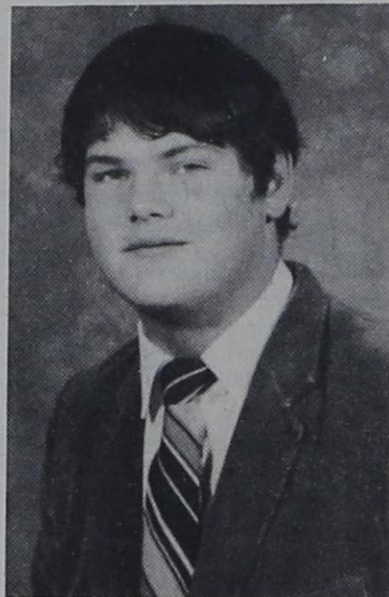

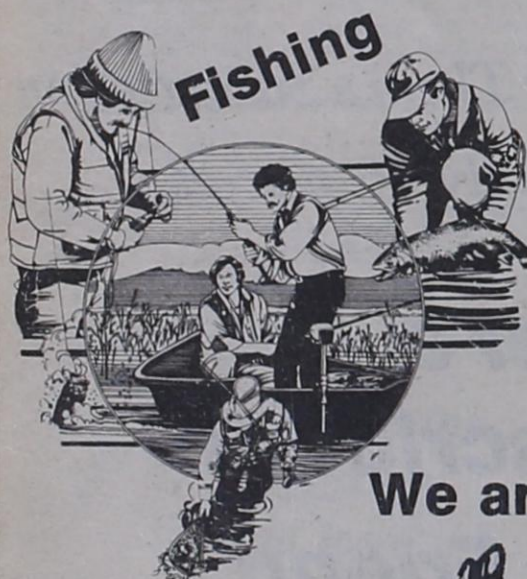

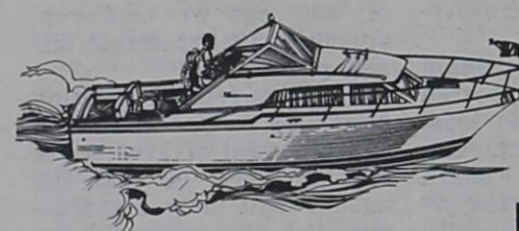

# Economic Boom Expected with Building of Post and Justiceburg Lakes

by Wesley W. Burnett

A major, historic announcement was made in Lubbock Thursday morning, April 3, 1986...as Mayor Alan Henry explained that an agreement had been reached with land owners and that litigation, which has stood in the way of the Justiceburg and Post lake projects, will be dismissed as a result of the agreement.

After outlining the project, the out-going Lubbock mayor told the council he was ready to accept a motion for a resolution authorizing him to sign the agreement papers and provide funding for the lake.

The unanimous vote by the Lubbock City Council brought a round of applause from the crowded council chambers, where Post and Garza County officials joined a wide variety of Lubbockites for the historic event.

Its conception on the drawing board since 1971, funds for the Justiceburg lake project were approved by Lubbock voters in 1977.

Mayor Henry referred to the Post reservoir, saying that with the cooperation of White River Municipal Water District, Lubbock has

secured a vital source of water well into the 21st century and enough to support a city of 350,000 population.

Post Mayor Giles McCrary was introduced by Henry, and McCrary stepped forward to express the appreciation of the citizens of Post to Henry and the Lubbock council for their efforts at building the lake, as well as the long term benefits of the Post lake to Lubbock and Post.

"We are proud to call you our neighbor and friend," McCrary said, "we share mutual values and benefits and consider this a near miracle."

Mayor Henry went on to say that if there are any industrial prospects interested in Lubbock and not yet decided because of the question of water... "Come on in, the water's fine."

The same could be said for Post...now that the building of the Post and Justiceburg lakes are a reality.

Mayor Henry also introduced members of the WRMWD board, Judge Giles Dalby and county commissioners.

The Justiceburg lake will contain 2900 acre feet of

water and work will begin immediately on planning.

Core samples and other geophysical research will start as soon as contracts can be signed.

Freese and Nichols Engineers of Fort Worth will continue to serve Lubbock in the planning stages.

Lubbock city officials expect that planning will take a least a year, and possibly 24 months before construction can begin.

Planning and construction

on the Post lake could begin sooner, but those decisions will have to be made by the WRMWD.

That board meets this Thursday evening.

The Post lake, when completed, will be 50 percent larger than White River.

Its recreational attraction is difficult to assess, but there is no doubt whatsoever that the Post and Justiceburg lakes will push

Post and Garza County into a major boom.

As Mayor Henry said, "Come on in, the water's fine."

Attending the historic meeting from Post were WRMWD chairman Bo Jackson, city manager Bill Pool, WRMWD board members Jack King and Everett Windham, Judge Dalby, commissioners Tommy Young, Herb Walls and T.D. Craft and Mayor McCrary.

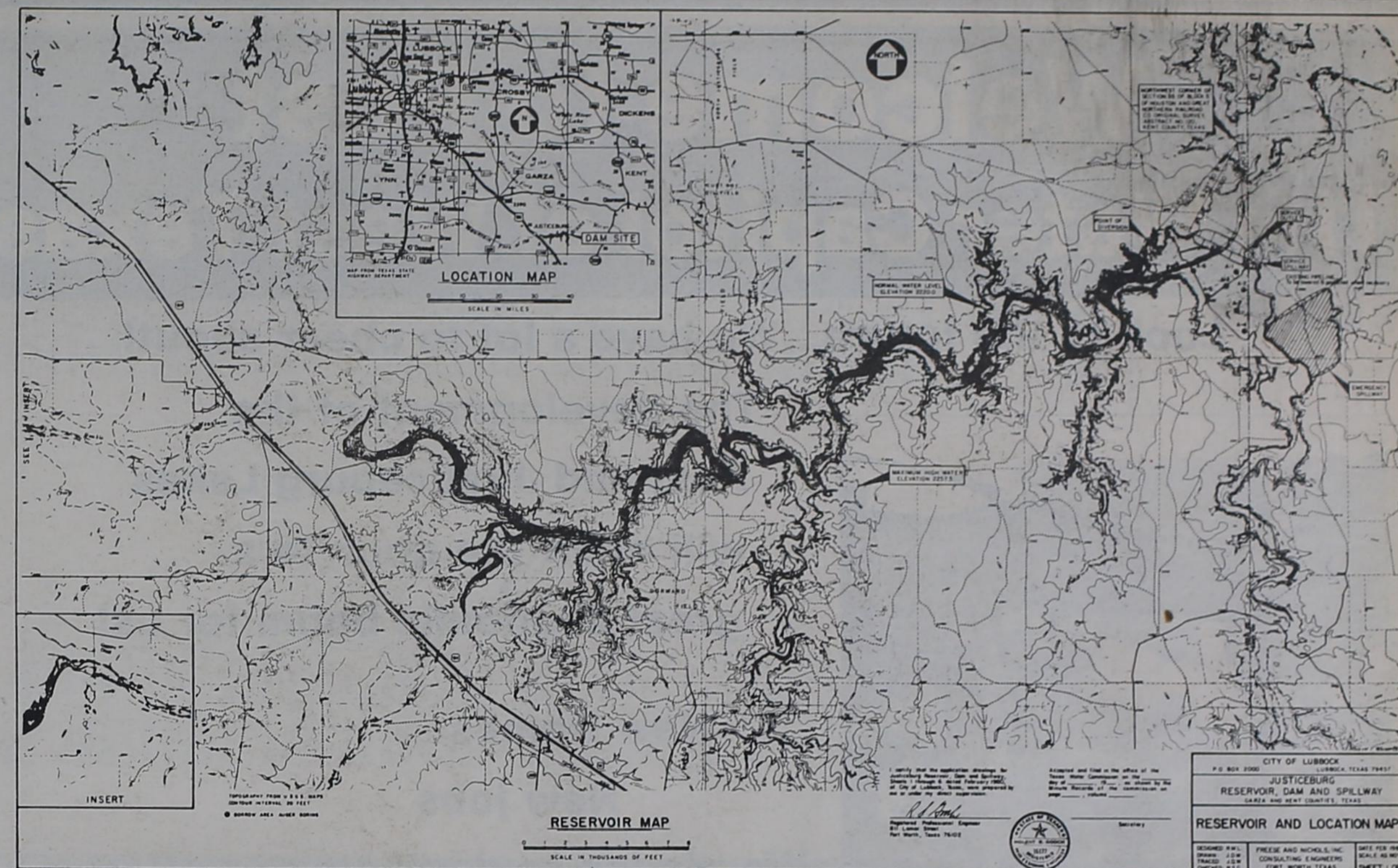

interview information from the local school board, thus the new ruling that there must be at least one board member in attendance at such a summary report.

According to Johnson, the monitoring team always finds something wrong.

There just aren't any schools that can't be improved.

An accreditation team tries to point out how improvements can be accomplished.

Often the team makes recommendations, and in some cases it gives a deadline for completion of definite actions.

Johnson indicated that there were three broad areas of concern which his team noted about the conditions at the Southland schools.

Generally, these concerns deal with the science lab, the library, and the official board minutes.

The science lab needs a vented hood to draw chemical fumes to the outside, plus a ventilated locked cabinet for the dangerous chemicals.

The library needs to centralize the elementary holdings and increase the

usage of the facility by the elementary students.

The official board minutes should refer to each item on the official board agenda, preferably with the same item number.

Johnson gave numerous suggestions for use in implementing corrections and other minor improvements.

The accreditation team was favorably impressed with the work of the local school board, as documented in the official board minutes, and supported by personal interviews with students and personnel of the Southland ISD.

Johnson added "it is evident that this school has a strong administrative staff and a quality faculty."

Areas of strength enumerated during the exit interview included: the local school board, the principals, the teachers, the superintendent, the school policies, compliance with the legislated rules for instruction, coordination between the regular and special programs, the VIP tutorial programs, and other instructional arrangements that support effective teaching and learning.

Local school officials expressed their pleasure to Johnson for the methods utilized during this monitoring visit.

Superintendent Ivey commented "It is obvious that the Texas Education Agency has changed their posture from one of 'I gotcha' to one of 'how can we help you' and our staff appreciate this new posture."

The next regular meeting scheduled for the Southland School Board of Trustees is set for April 14, and the agenda will include discussions of this accreditation visit.

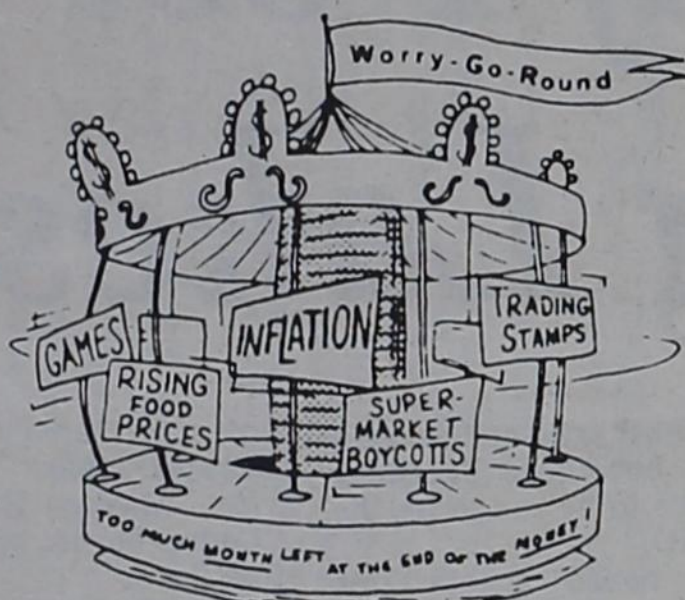

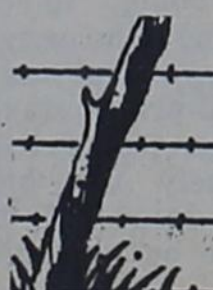

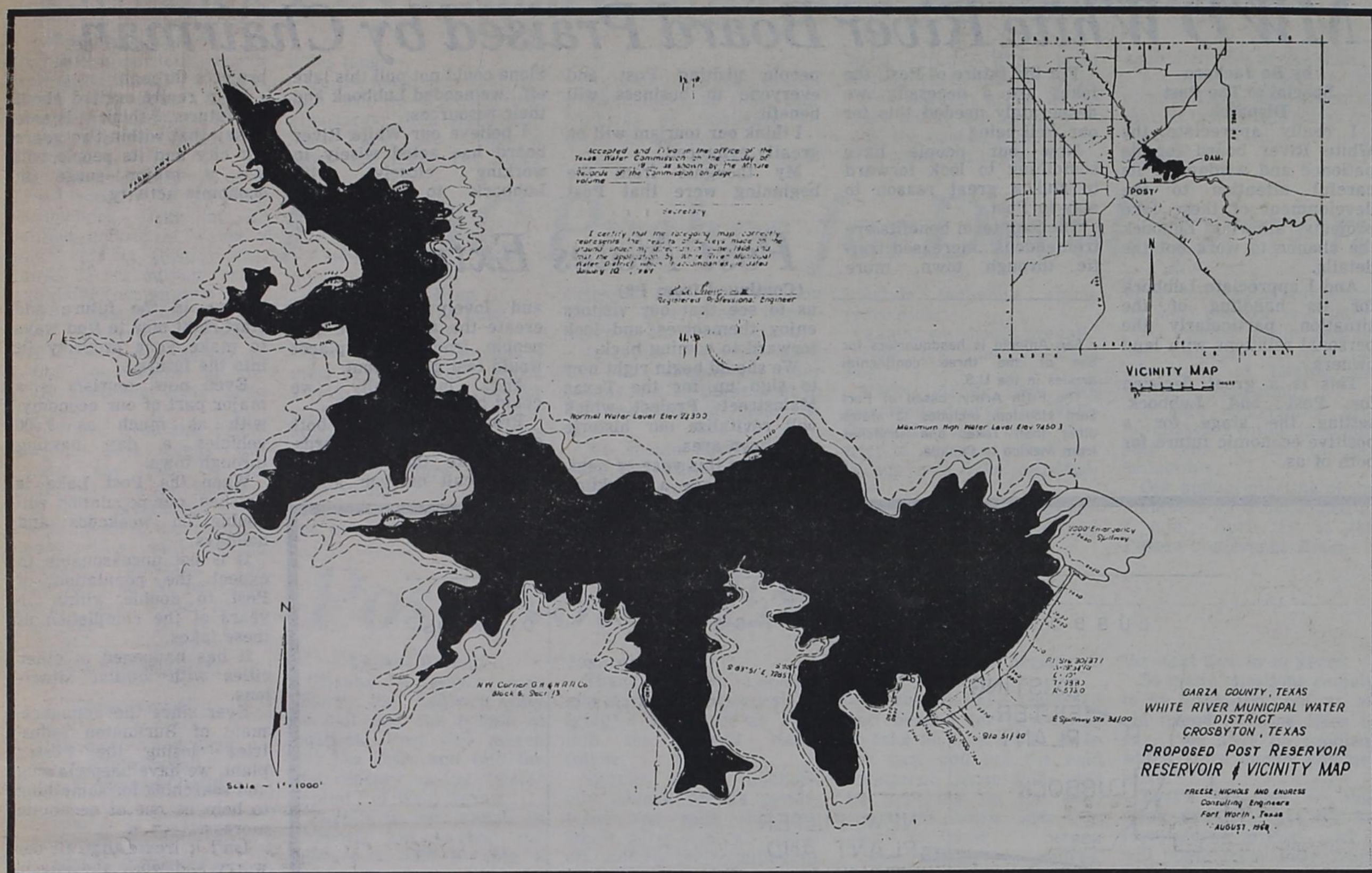

## Southland ISD Gets Outstanding Review

The Southland Independent School District has an outstanding school, according to the Texas Education Agency officials who conducted an accreditation review which began the afternoon of March 25th and ended the morning of March 28th, 1986.

Local school officials listened to Mr. Herc Johnson, of the TEA, who chaired this monitoring visit, and to Dr. David Cobb of the Region XVII Education Service Center of Lubbock, who delivered a summary of findings called "the exit interview" on Friday morning.

Local officials present were Joe E. Basinger, Vice-president of the school board, Valton C. Wheeler, also of the school board, Keith E. Gast, high school principal, Peggy B. Wheeler, elementary school principal, and Ellis Ivey II, school superintendent.

Other TEA officials on the monitoring team, but not present for the summary report were Marion Marshall, Joe Lopez, and Cheryl Chance.

"The bottom line is that you have an outstanding school here in Southland,"

Johnson told the Southland school officials.

This monitoring visit included an inspection of (1) civil rights compliance, (2) community conditions, (3) governance of the school district, (4) school district planning, (5) rules for instruction (including house bill 72 and chapter 75), (6) instruction, (7) student services, (8) instructional resources, (9) personnel, and (10) physical facilities.

All school board members and the superintendent will receive a detailed written report of this inspection within six weeks.

This report will be similar to the exit interview.

An exit interview is conducted only if one or more local board members are present, according to Johnson.

In the past there was no requirement for board members to be present, and in at least one case in another part of the state, a school official withheld exit

that will support city growth well into the 21st century. This will give us a competitive advantage as we attract new industry to Lubbock.

4. We are assured of a firm capacity from the Justiceburg Lake of 22 million gallons of water a day. This is roughly two thirds of our current average daily consumption.

With completion of the Post Reservoir, Lubbock will have a new supply of water comparable to our daily allocation from Lake Meredith.

5. Water from this replenishable new supply will extend the life of the underground water supply.

6. This agreement gives the residents of this region a new facility with terrific recreation potential. The lake itself is 50 per cent larger than White River. The lake will be 11 river

miles long.

On the north side near the dam will be a public use area larger than Mackenzie State Park, and it has a shore line nearly two miles

long.

To orient everyone to this project, this map show U.S. Highway 84 extending toward the southeast.

The lake extends east-

ward from this point

through rustic canyon walls. The area in green is the large public use area.

To the east of that, in the area shown in brown, is the

estimated site of the dam.

I will now return to the council table and accept a motion that we authorize the signing of this historic agreement."
