affect the baking of breads, cakes or cookies.

"During the summer, it is difficult to make a product using 'separated' eggs, fresh from the nest, because the egg yolk and white don't separate very easily due to the heat," she said.

Korren also said she learned, from her grandmother Mrs Faye Payton's experience, that cooking donuts just a few seconds too long makes them tough.

When she and her grandmother had baked donuts together for county fair competition, the 4-H'er won the blue ribbon, while her grandmother won the red.

Korren said she also discovered that it is best to use a little less flour than recipes recommend for bread, if the dough is to be kneaded by hand.

She has conducted numerous bread workshops, including three entitled, "How to Make Muffins," "Foreign "Mexican Bread" and Bread."

Do some "calorie banking". If you anticipate a big splurge at one meal or party, save up some extra calories by eating nutritious, lowcalorie meals for several days in advance. Then treat yourself to the special occasion without worrying about the extra calories.

These practices are appropriate year-round and when coupled with regular exercise, can help you stay within a healthful weight range.
