The Garza County Commissioners Court met in a regular session Monday, December 22, and discussed the coming Bingo election for Precinct Four to be held on Saturday, January 17, 1987.

## PEDC Urges Participation

With the new Tax Reform becoming effective January 1, 1987 many taxpayers will find that greater tax savings may be achieved from contributions made before the close of the year than through contributions after the new law becomes effective.

A contribution made now to the Post Economic Development Corporation (PEDC) can not only reduce your 1986 income tax, but also will be used in the development of our local community.

Your donation to our economic development organization will be appreciated and devoted to local community development.

The Post Economic Development Corporation was organized late in 1984 as a 501 (c) (3) non-

profit corporation to receive and manage the remaining properties of Burlington Industries in Garza County following the closing of the cotton mill in 1983.

Burlington donated some 440,000 square feet of industrial buildings, an assortment of equipment and 23 residential houses, all valued at almost five million dollars to our community.

That gift carried a liability of about \$100,000 annually in maintenance, upkeep and taxes which the PEDC assumed.

Some sixty individuals and organizations contributed \$500 each to provide operating funds and become members of the Corporation.

Now, after a lapse of more than 30 years, Post is being offered regular stage performances in a real theater.

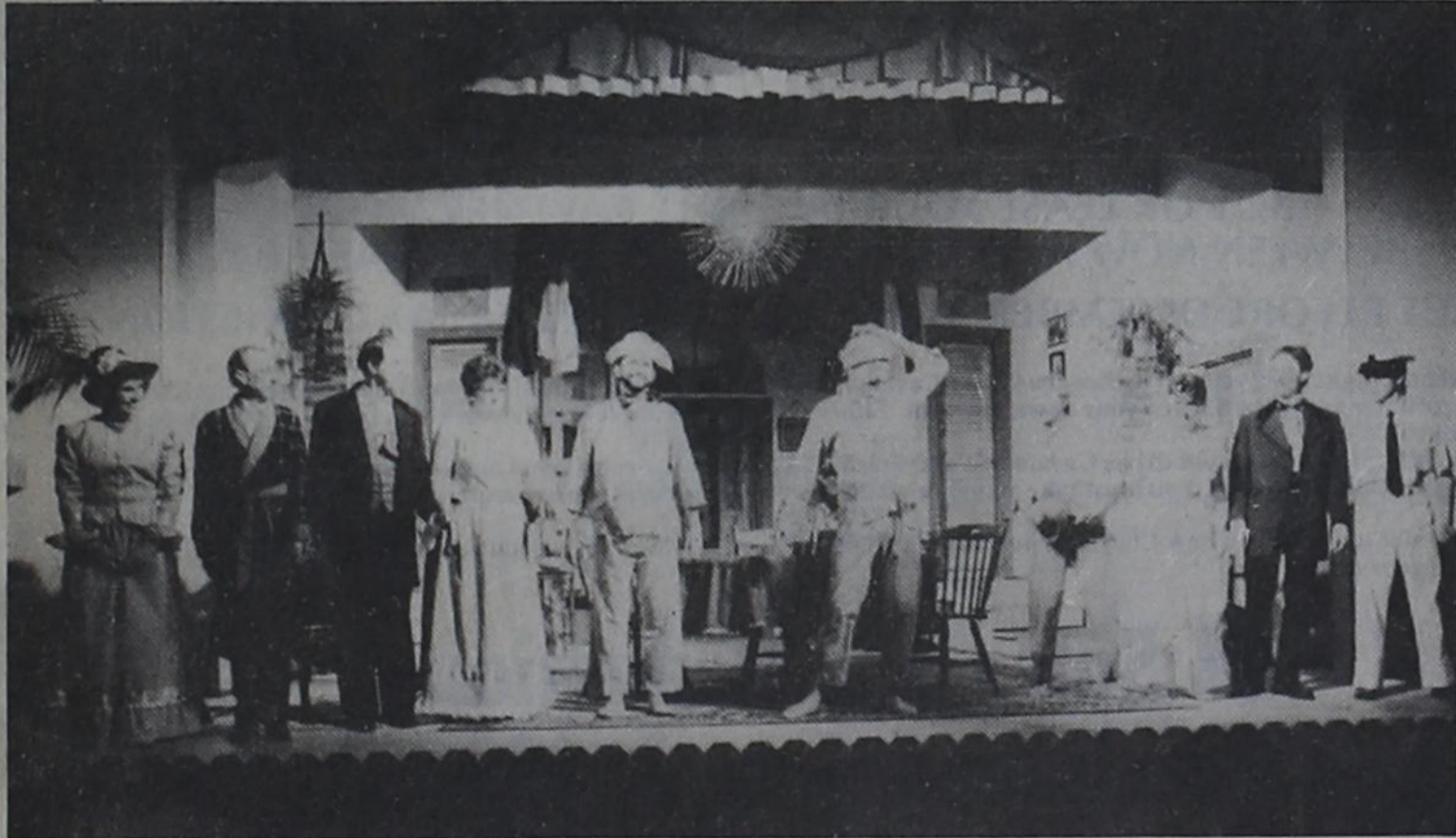
And if you haven't seen any of these productions, you just can't appreciate how valuable this effort is to our town.

 You are invited to join that group and become a shareholder in our endeavor.  
 All contributions to PEDC have been declared tax deductible by the Internal Revenue Service.  
 Our Board of Directors, who serve without compensation, are pleased with our accomplishments in managing the PEDC properties during the last two years.  
 Although we have not achieved our primary goal of bringing a manufacturing industry with a few hundred jobs to the community, we are actively negotiating with two or three industries that offer good possibilities.

We have leased almost all of the industrial property for warehousing use which has provided a few jobs and some income to maintain the facility.  
 Until the downturn in the oil and gas industry in May we had all of the rental houses occupied and returning more than the cost of maintenance.  
 In the past two months we have paid \$41,637.81 in ad valorem taxes to our local schools and governments.

This is an important local support from a tax exempt corporation.  
 In addition to the two major warehouse leases of the Postex plant, we have been able to make space available for community activities.  
 Last month a primary health care clinic was opened in the old health unit area of Postex offices.  
 The state MMR clinic was located in the office area early this year.

The county-city Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor has been housed at the Postex office for more than a year.  
 One of the rental houses has been made available to the Head Start program at minimal rent.

Since the collapse of their housing, space has been made available to the Satallite School in the old F Street office at no cost.  
 The Postex Conference Room has been used for varied short courses, elections and public meetings.

We have attempted to make the housing and grounds more attractive to you and to our visitors.  
 Just recently the Post Gin property consisting of six acres along the Santa Fe tracks was given to PEDC by Giles McCrary.

As a 501 (c) (3) corporation we are able to accept gifts of property as well as money which can be used for economic development purposes.  
 We cannot distribute income to shareholders, officers or directors but we can make expenditures for scientific, educational and charitable purposes.

At this time we are directing our major attention to those expenses

that would eliminate slum and deteriorating property that would be distracting to economic growth.

We invite you to join us with your contributions.

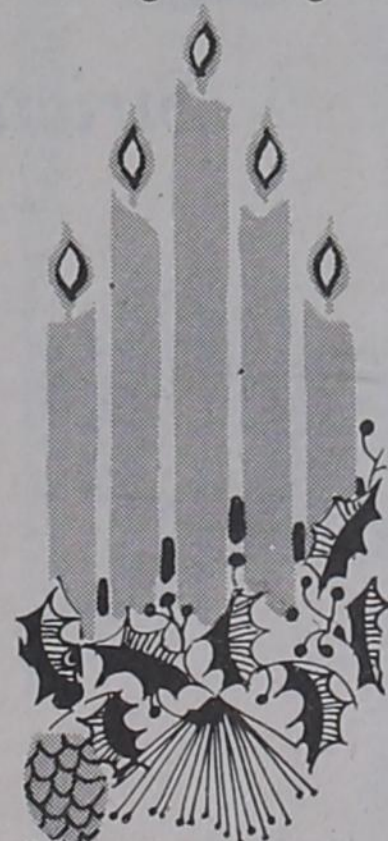





Marvin Lee managed to sink two free throws in the overtime period but that was all that the Antelopes could manage as Abernathy scored six for the win.

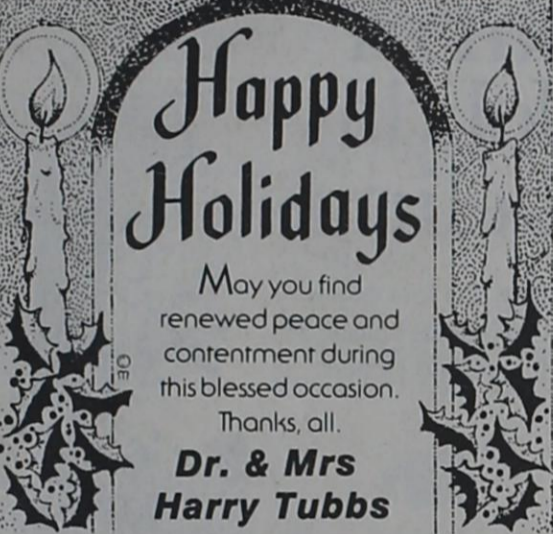

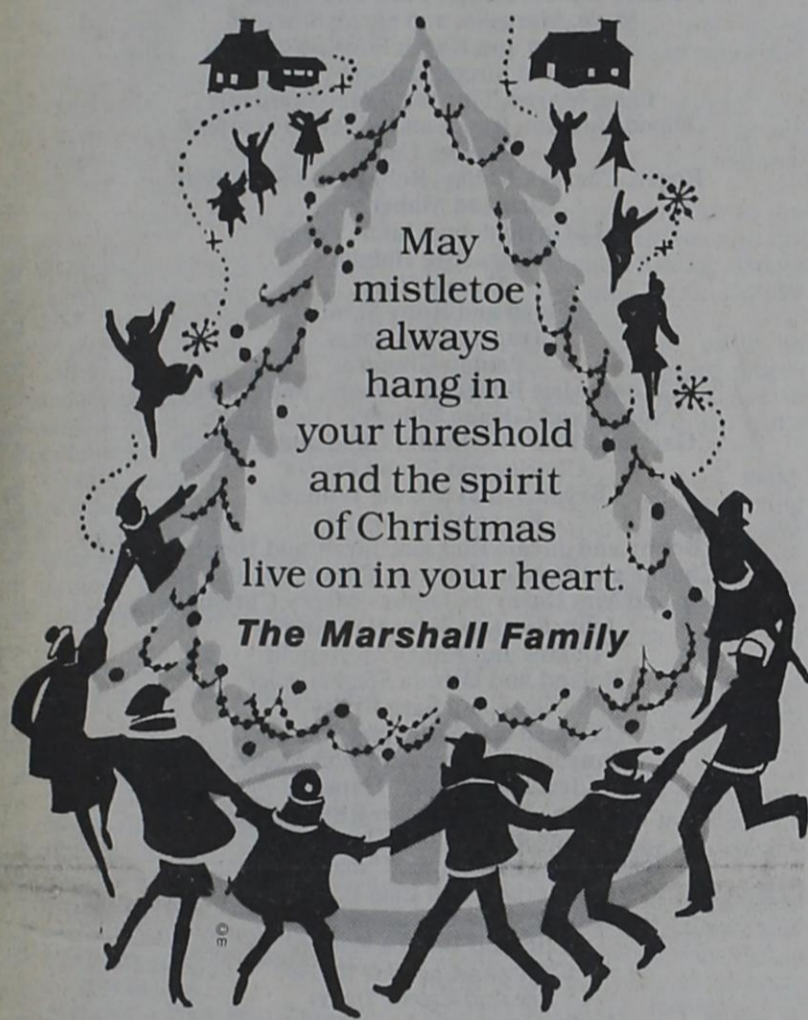

## Post Oil and Gas

The No. 1 Lott, a 9,000-ft wild-cat well, is scheduled to be drilled in Garza County.

James Cleo Thompson of Dallas is the operator.

The well will be spudded in a 208-acre lease nine miles southwest of Post in the Andrew J. Curry Survey.

Production at the No. 1 Connell Estate "29" has been assigned to the Northwest Rocker A Field, Garza County.

The operator is Westland Oil Development.

The well is located five miles southeast of Post in a 667-acre lease in the GH&H Survey.

The well potential at 56 barrels of oil per day, plus 153 barrels of water.

It bottomed at 8,329 feet, and was plugged back to 8,210 feet.

Production is from perforations in the Strawn Formation, 7,766 to 7,826 feet into the wellbore.

Three 3,000-ft developmental wells are planned by Bert Fields, Jr of Dallas at drillsites in the Post Field.

The wells are designated as the No. 7 I.N. McCrary "F" and the Nos. 3 and 3 I.N. McCrary "J".

Drillsites are 11 miles east and ten miles northeast of Post, respectively.

All three wells are to be drilled in a 160-acre lease in the GH&H Survey.

A Lubbock-based operator has staked location for the No. 709T Northwest Garza Unit, a developmental well to be located three miles northwest of Post.

With projected total depth of 3,475 feet, the well will be drilled in a 1,339-acre lease in the Garza Field, AB&M Survey.

The operator is RJD Management.

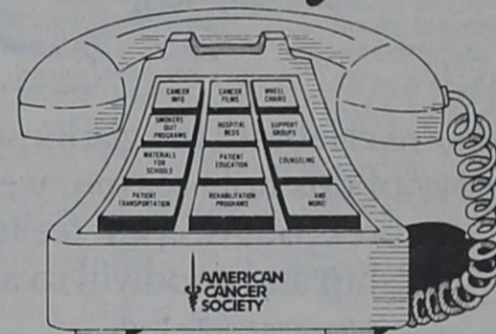

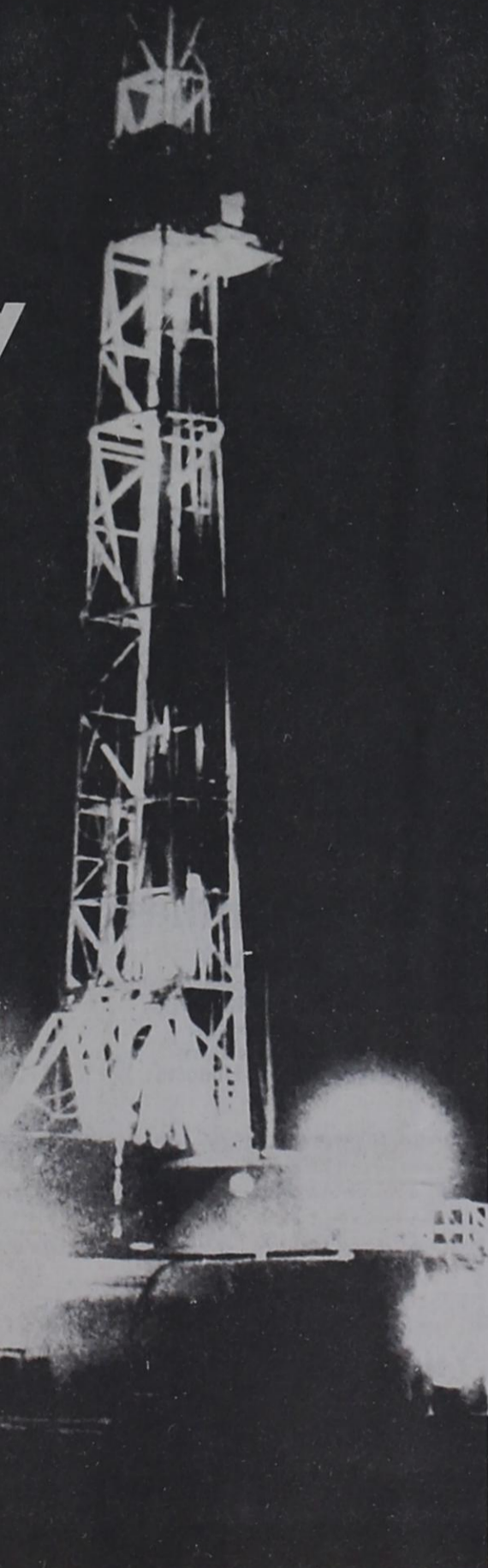

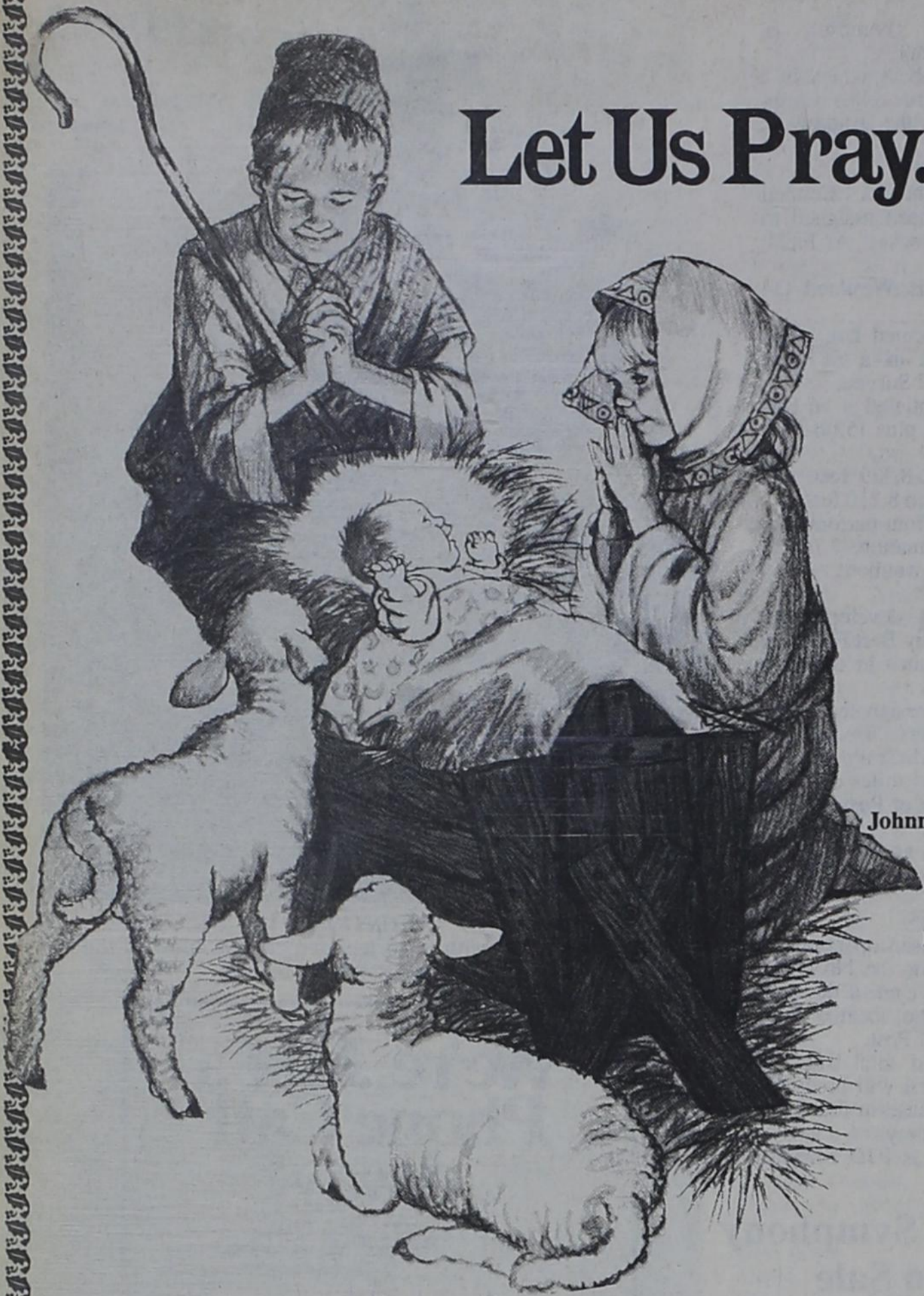
