### 1168 Men Assigned Serial Numbers by Local Draft Board—

Readers of The Star will find a complete list of registrants who claim Callahan county as home, together with the serial number given them by local draft board in this issue. This list is also posted on a bulletin board in the office of the local draft board on the third floor of the county courthouse.

These numbers have been sent to Washington, where on next Tuesday, October 29th, drawing of numbers in the draft will begin. Secretary of War, Stimson, will draw the first numbers. The drawing will take some 12 or more hours after which 16,654,000 men who registered on October 16th will know the order in which he is subject to call to service.

Your pastor is closing out his third year with Baird Church. Three more Sundays till the fiscal year will be ended. On Nov. 19 a minister will be assigned responsibilities of the pastorate for another twelvemonth.

We had good attendance Sunday morning, but not so good at the evening service. The morning service was a special mission rally. In the evening the sermon was titled "The Needs of the Church."

In all churches, as in every Democracy, there are "fifth columnists," or ecclesiastical termites. They are tares the Lord instructed to permit to grow with the wheat. At harvest they will be plucked out and cast into the fire. We have some in our church who are radical critics, cannot stand sound doctrines, always finding fault. They think the church is a place of entertainment. They find fault with the ministry. Just "scratch beneath the veneer" and you'll find they do little or nothing to carry on the financial end of the church. Others engage in vicious things and cannot stand the searching light of the scriptures. They carry no weight either in the church or in the world. Sinners have their "number" and denominate them "hypocrites." Such are destructive, not constructive. Consider those who are working in the church, whose lives are spotless. They use little criticism. We all need the grace of God. We need to cooperate not to disintegrate.

The pastor proposes two needful sermons Sunday, the morning inspirational; the evening evangelical. Members who profess to love God and the church, the only institution that stands between universal chaos and prosperity, should not forsake assembling together on the Sabbath, as is the custom of some, especially at the evening service. Want to break the preacher's heart? Just stay at home.

### Baird Represented At Bus Hearing

Baird was represented before the state railroad commission special hearing Wednesday at Cisco to testify in behalf of petitioners for two bus lines which seek to operate through Baird. Representatives were Ralph (Jack) Ashlock, secretary of the Baird Luncheon club; Earl Johnson, motorcar dealer; and Percy King, cafe operator. One of the bus lines would operate between Wichita Falls and Coleman via Throckmorton, Albany, Baird, Bayou, Coleman. The other seeks permit to operate from Abilene to Waco via Clyde Baird, Bayou, Cross Plains and Rising Star.

### Many Attend Rally At Methodist Church
