# Local Man Charged

Steve Allison Hair of Post has been arrested and released on \$25,000 bond by the Lynn County Sheriff's Department, charged with aggravated rape in the case of a November 3 assault of a Grassland housewife.

According to Lynn County Sheriff Stanley Krause, the defendant surrendered himself Thursday, Nov. 11, following the issuance of a warrant for his arrest.

A Lynn County Grand Jury is scheduled to hear the case in early December.

The rape victim told investigating officers that she was watching television with her two small children after her husband had left for work at about 8:30 a.

m. on the day of the assault. She went to the kitchen and there was a man wearing a homemade mask with a screwdriver in his hand.

The entry is suspected to have been made through an unlocked front door.

The victim reported that she tried to run, but the assailant grabbed her arm and put the screwdriver to her throat, forced her into a bedroom, tied her hands and feet with string and put a pillow over her head, and threatened the children if she did not cooperate.

Following the attack, the rapist left and one of the children freed the victim.

The production is scheduled to last two and one-half hours and those not purchasing reserve seats are asked to bring their stadium seats if they have one to be more comfortable during the show.

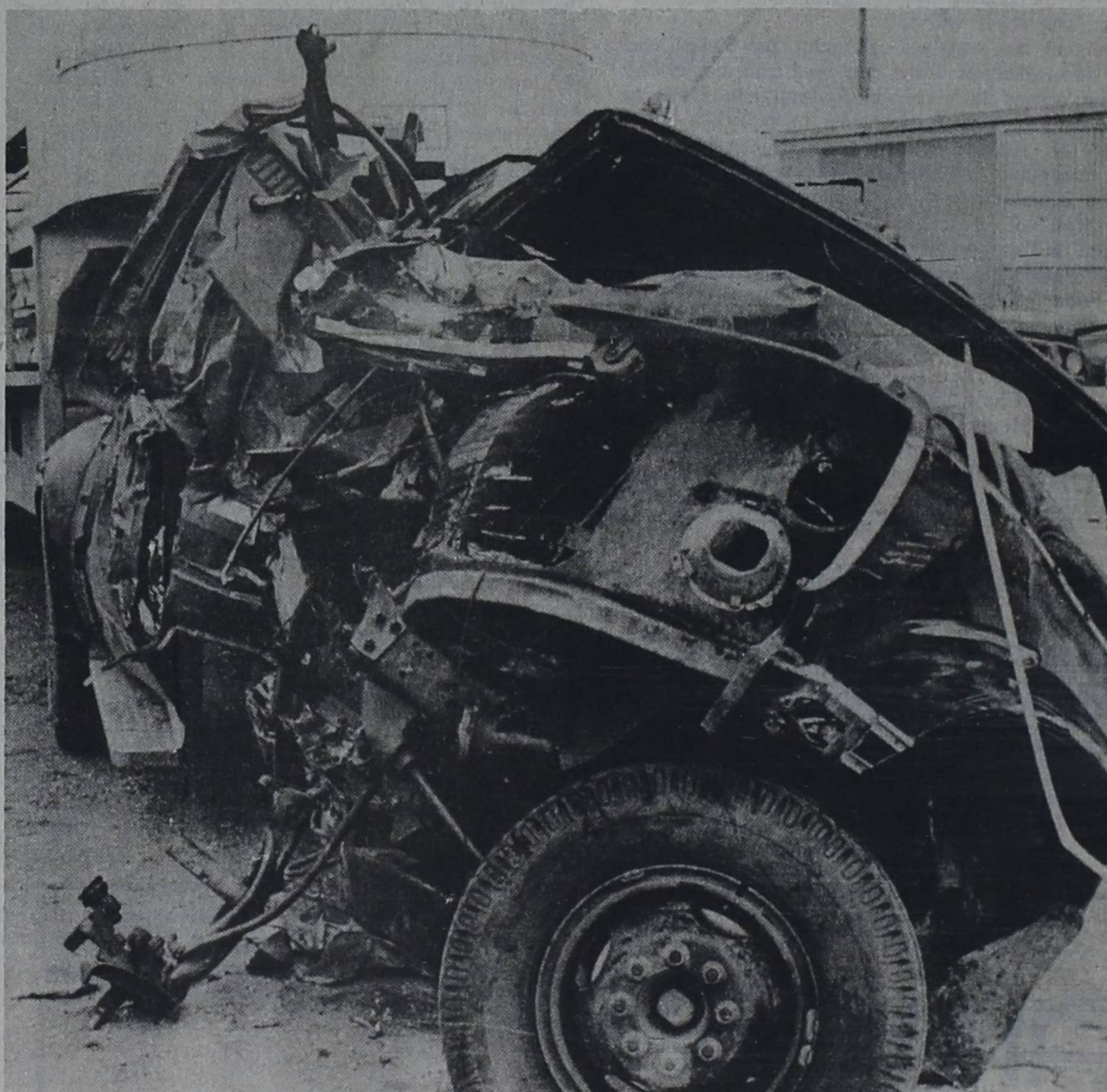

# One Killed in Accident

Lee Gable, 30, of Muleshoe was killed and two Louisiana men injured in a one vehicle smashup, just south of Post on the Snyder highway about 2:30 a. m. Wednesday morning. The trio were in route to Louisiana. Injured in the accident was the driver of the pickup, Leroy Griffin, and passenger Harold Benjamin Lolley, both of Elm Grove, La. Both were listed in satisfactory condition in Garza Memorial Hospital and were expected to be released by Friday.

The pickup truck, pulling a gooseneck trailer, loaded with one horse, veered off the road when the driver apparently went to sleep. The vehicle failed to negotiate a curve and smashed into a tree. Griffin and Gable were pinned in the wreckage.

The Post Volunteer Fire Department was called out with the Jaws of Life to free the victims from the wreckage.

Justice of the Peace Zora Robinson pronounced Gable dead at the scene.

Besides the horse in the wreck, a dog was trapped in the cab of the pickup. Both animals were taken by Post residents to be cared for until members of the family could come for them.

All three men were horse traders and trainers, and Griffin is owner of the Louisiana Horse Palace in Elm Grove, La.

Services for Gable were held at 11 a. m. Friday in Ellis Funeral Home Chapel in Muleshoe.

# Southland Eagles Win District Title

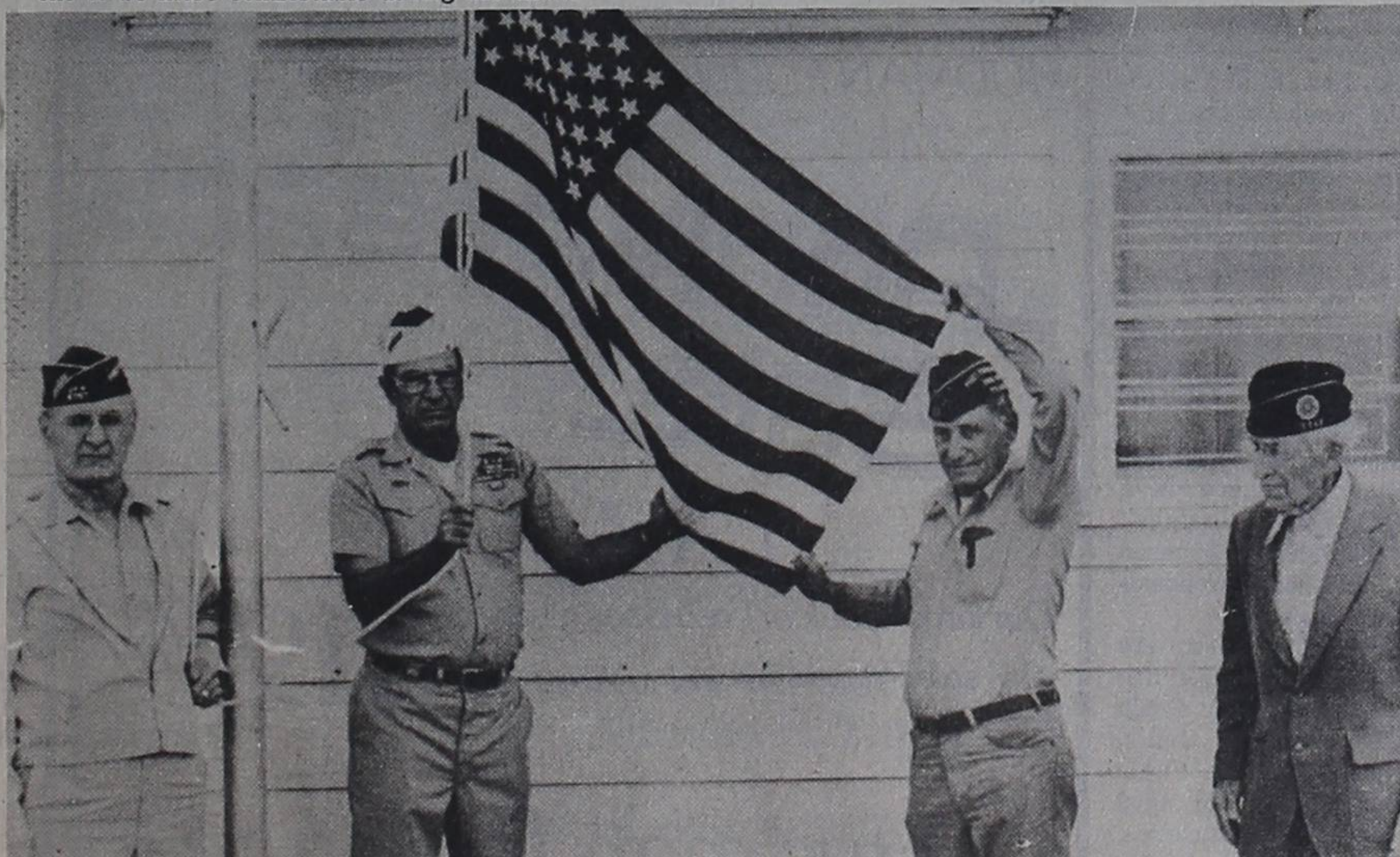
The Southland Eagles rushed for 373 yards to take a 65-20 win over the Whitharrel Panthers.

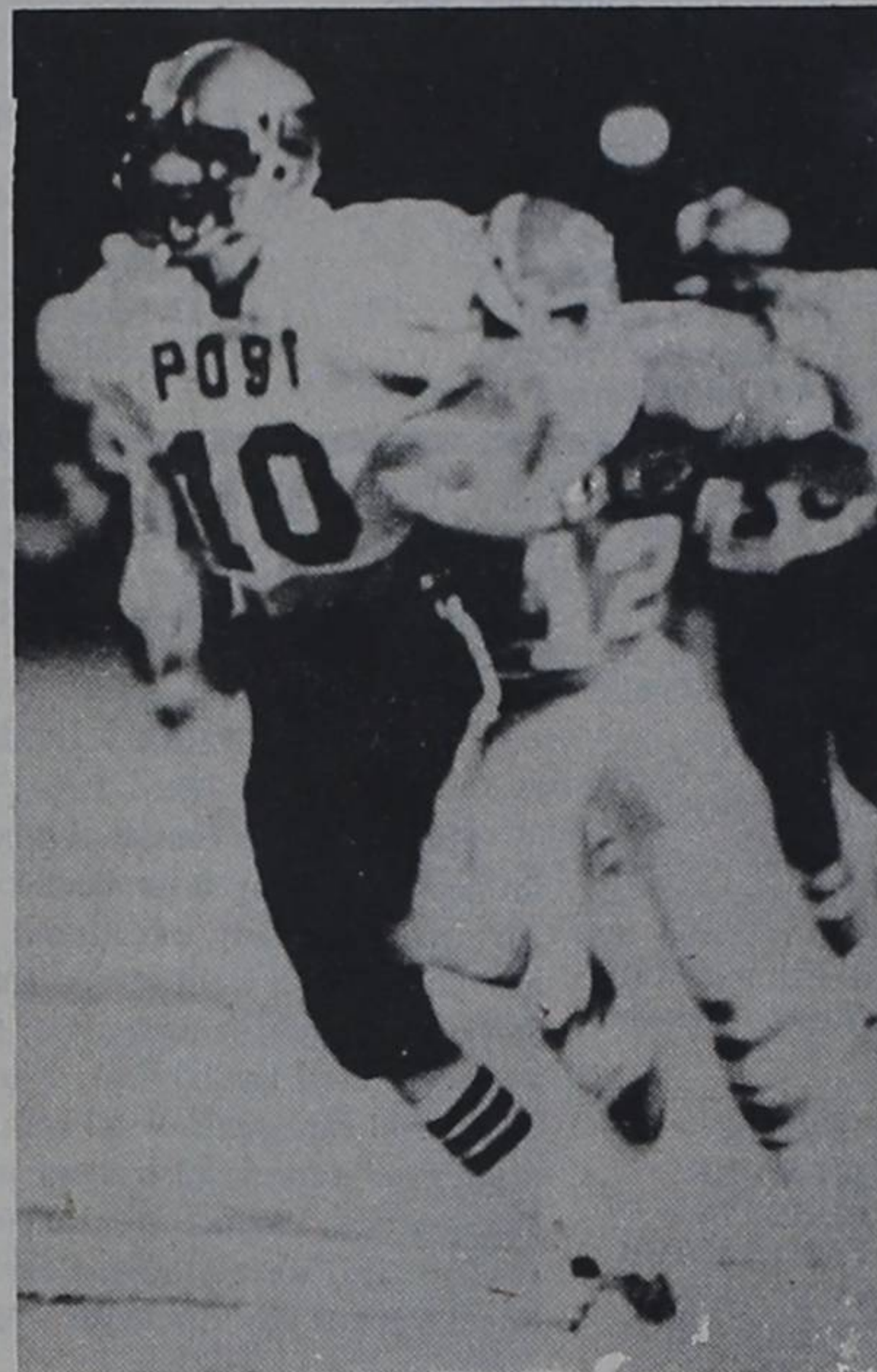


# Veteran's Day Observed Here

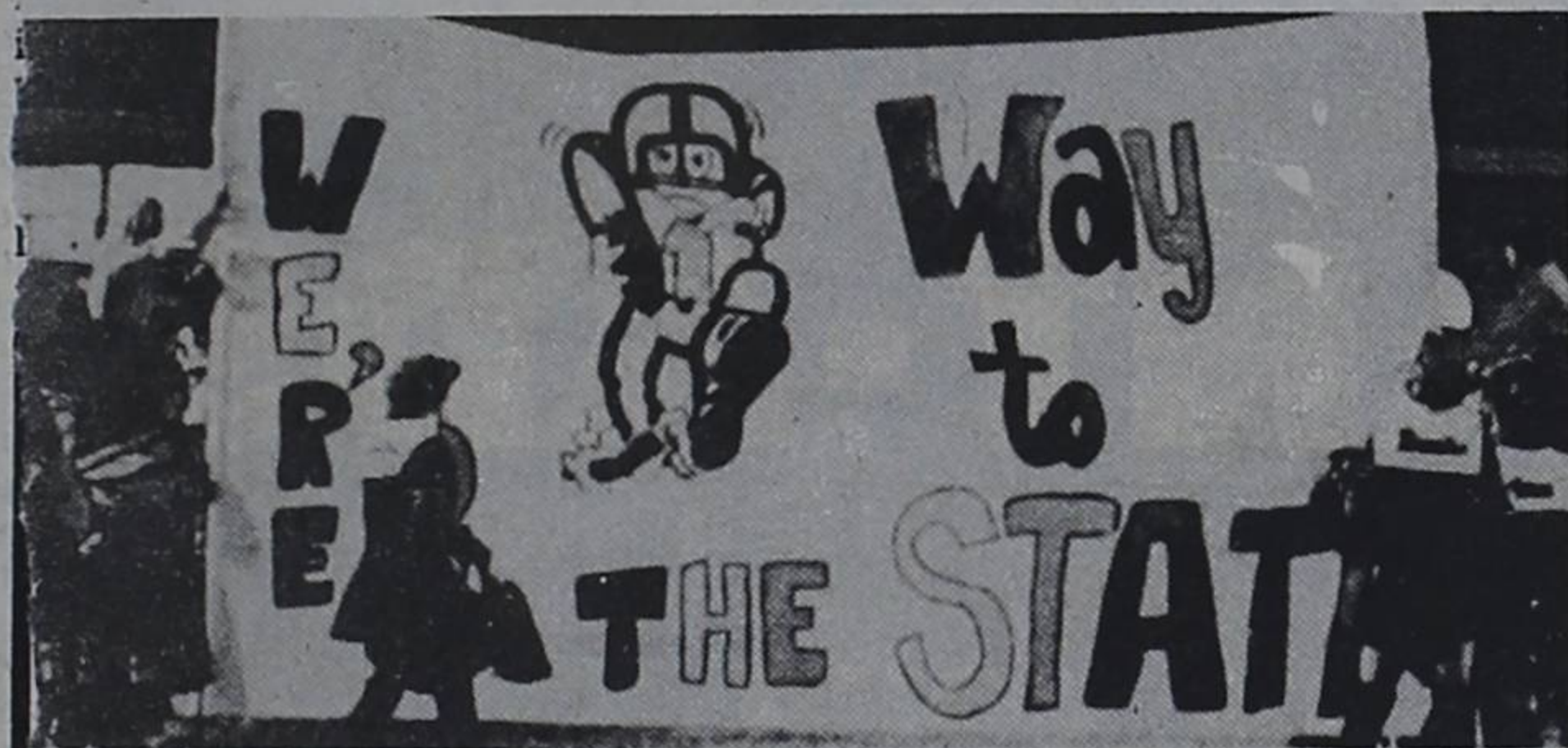

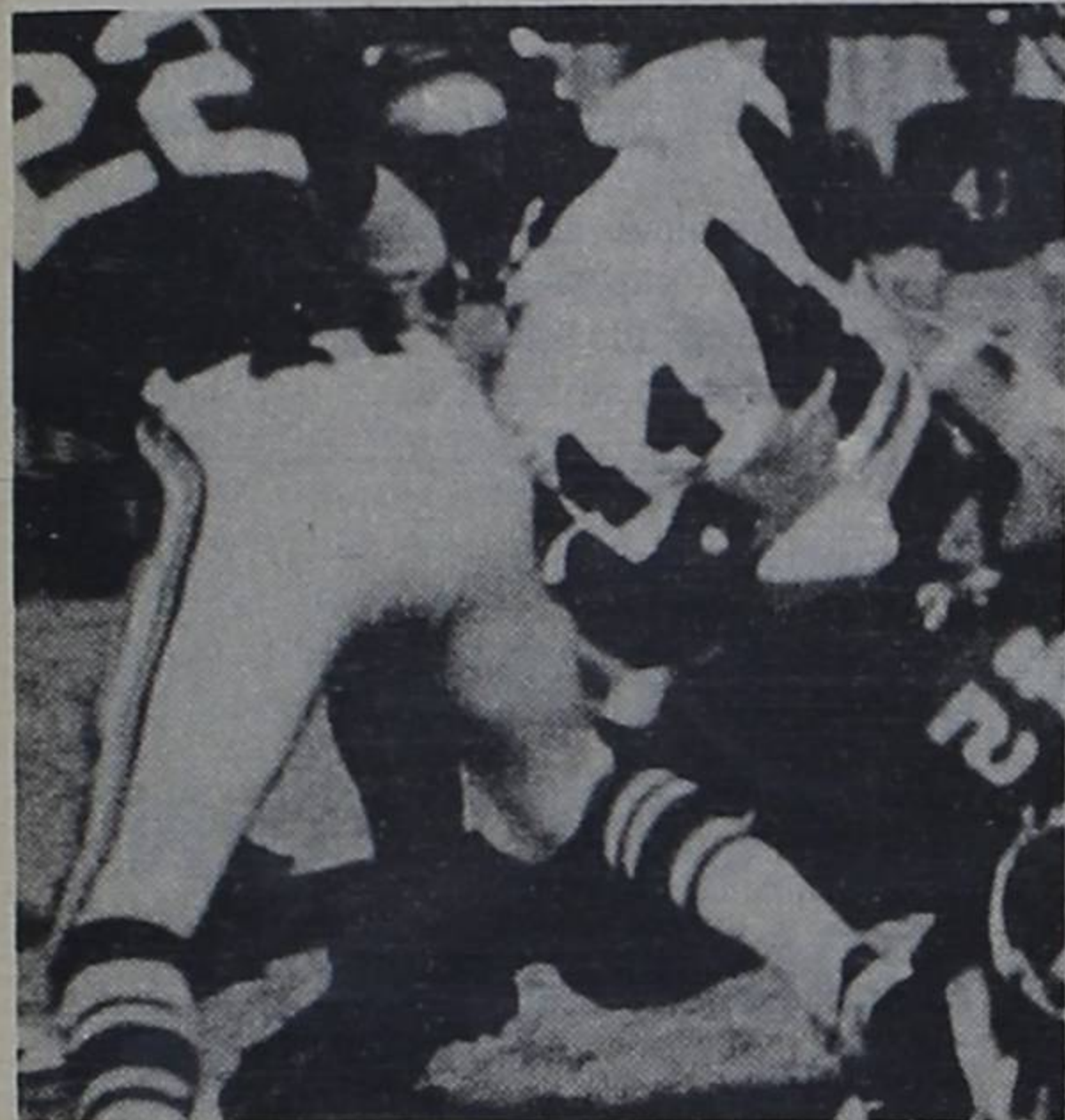

Amarillo River Road defeated Friona 26-17 to win its bi-district contest last Friday night and will meet the Post Antelopes for the area championship in Plainview Friday night.

The Antelopes outscored River Road 35-6 in their first meeting September 10 in Plainview.

In other bi-district contests of interest to Antelope fans, Littlefield beat Dalhart 21-7 and Frenship outgunned Slaton 22-7.

Ballinger upended Fabens 17-15 and will face Breckenridge who blasted Burnet 34-7.

Ozona surprised Kermit 10-9 and will meet Stamford, a 34-0 winner over Llano.

The winner of the Amarillo River Road and Post Antelope area game will play the winner of the Stamford-Ozona contest in the regional championship.

## Stats Don't Tell Story

On the statistic boards, it would look like Denver City outplayed the Post Antelopes last Friday as they collected 282 yards offense to 257 for the winner.

Post got 10 first downs, to Denver City's 18, but the Antelopes won in the turnover game, losing only one on an interception and picking up two Mustang fumbles.

The Antelopes had 143 yards rushing and completed five of seven passes for 114 yards.

The Mustangs had 231 yards on the ground and completed two of six passes for 51 yards.

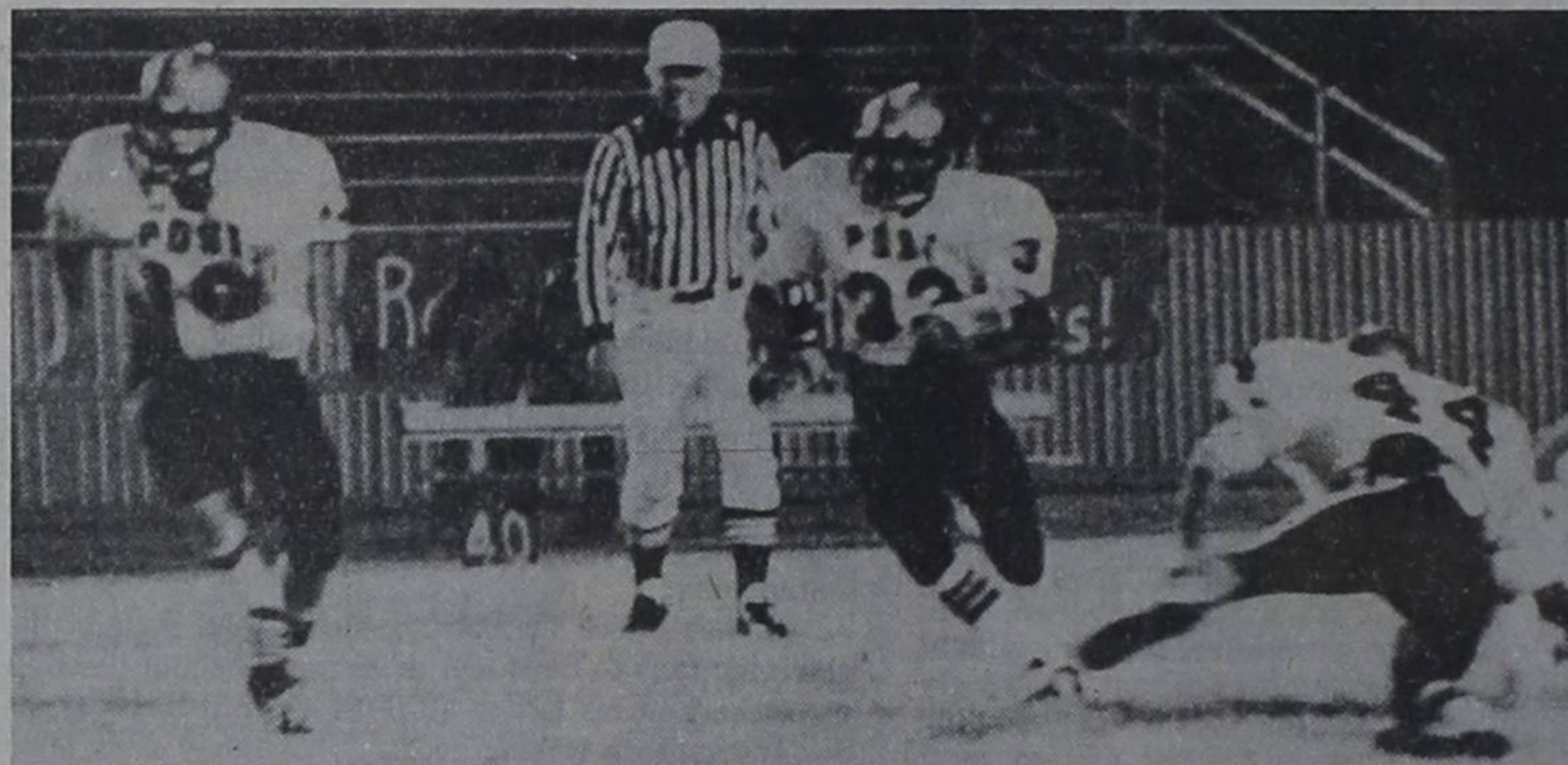
