Cold Weather Flu Season

Arrival of cold weather and the "flu season" call attention to the need for influenza vaccinations for people at greatest risk of serious illness or death from flu and its complications.

Influenza virus infections occur every year in the United States, reminds Dr. Mary Ann Shirer, health education specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A & M

University System. Three dominant strains anticipated during the 1982-83 flu season, Shirer adds, are A-Bangkok, A-Brazil,

and B-Singapore. "The antigens in this year's vaccine reduce the likelihood of infection and the severity of disease if a vaccinated individual contracts influenza," she ex-

plains. People considered to be in the "high risk" category are those 65 years of age or more, and people of any age who are chronically ill with heart disease, lung or kidney disorders, diabetes, severe anenisa such as sickle cell disease; and conditions that affect the immune (disease fighting) mechanisms such as certain malignancies and immunosuppressive therapy.


