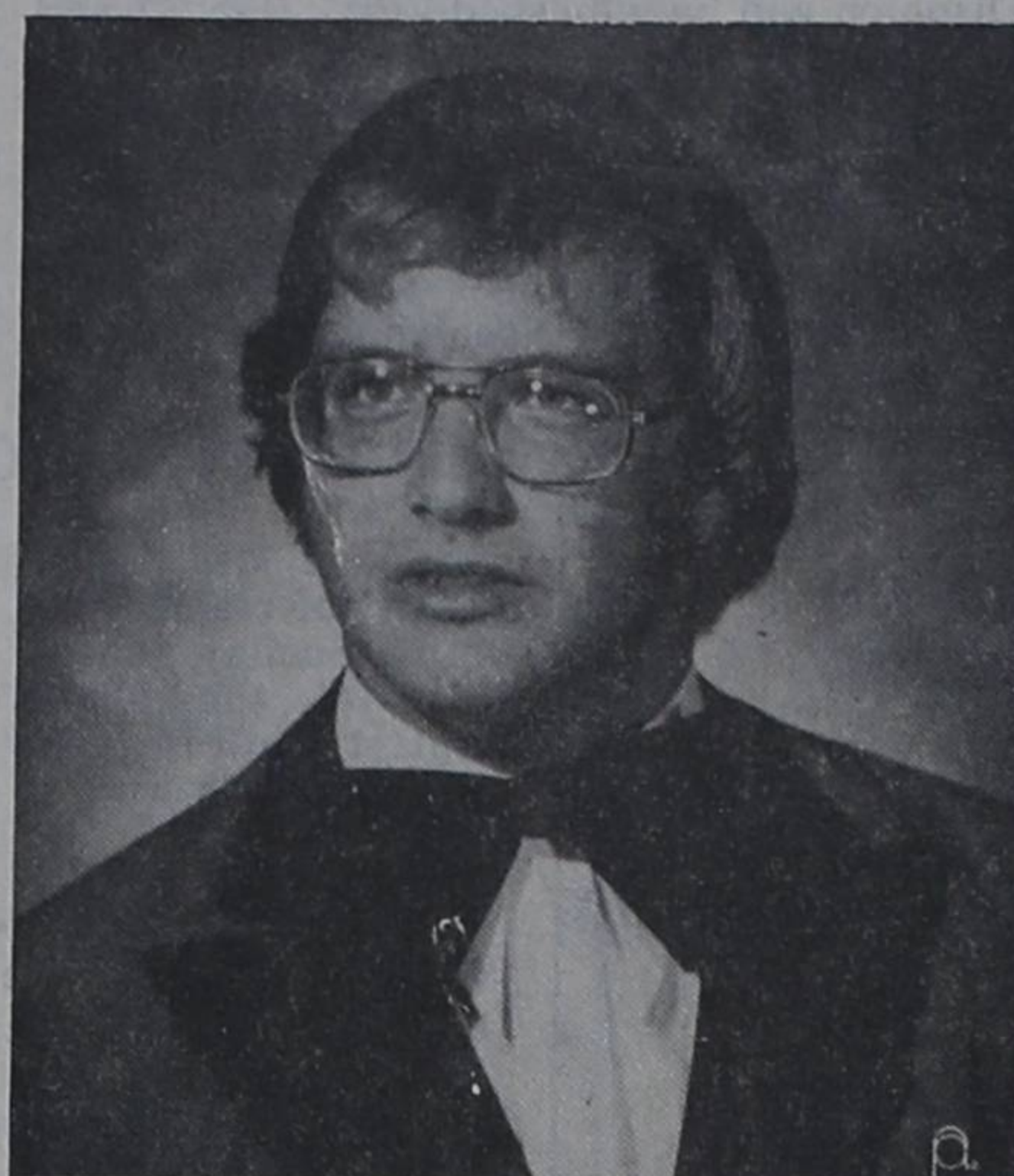

Commissioners Ask for Details

The County Commissioners, meeting in regular session Monday morning heard Dick Milam with Mid Plains Pipe Line Company ask permission to use right of way along county roads for a gas plant which will be built on Floy Richardson property in the northern part of the county.

He said there would be four permanent people stationed in the Post area for the plant.

Judge Dalby asked Mr. Milam for a written report on how many miles of line would be needed and where they would be placed and asked him to meet with the commissioners at a later meeting with his information.

Steve Peterson with Western Geophysical also met with the commissioners and said his company would be doing approximately 40 miles of work in precincts one and two and asked commissioners Ted Aten and Buck Craft for permission to vibrate on the road where feasible, due to bad barchiches in parts of the precincts.

Aten told Mr. Peterson he had no objections to his using the roads in his precinct on the condition that he wanted damages set before work began and that he must have the

landowners permission.

Commissioner Craft denied permission to use the road in his precinct and said that only the back slopes could be used.

County and District Clerk Carl Cederholm and Deputy Faye Cockrell also met with the commissioners and asked them to consider having some of the older records in the Clerk's office rebound and they were getting old and brittle and pages were getting loose.

Two statewide Basketball Shoot-Out winners will be selected: The student who shoots the most baskets in a 3 minute time period, and the student who raises the most in pledge money for Easter Seals.

These winners will receive their grand prize on February 26, 1983 when they and their coach or PE teacher will sit in a prime seat as guests of the UT Longhorn Basketball Team at the UT vs Baylor game in Austin.

Each student who raises \$50 or more will receive a Basketball Shoot-Out sew-on patch and each student who raises \$100 or more will receive a Basketball Shoot-Out T-shirt and sew-on patch.

Those students who raise \$200 or more will receive a Basketball Shoot-Out plaque, T-shirt and sew-on patch.

In addition to the state winners, two Lubbock area winners will be selected. These two winners and their coaches will go to the Texas Tech Vs. Houston Basketball game and dinner at the 50 Yard Line Restaurant in Lubbock on February 18, 1983.

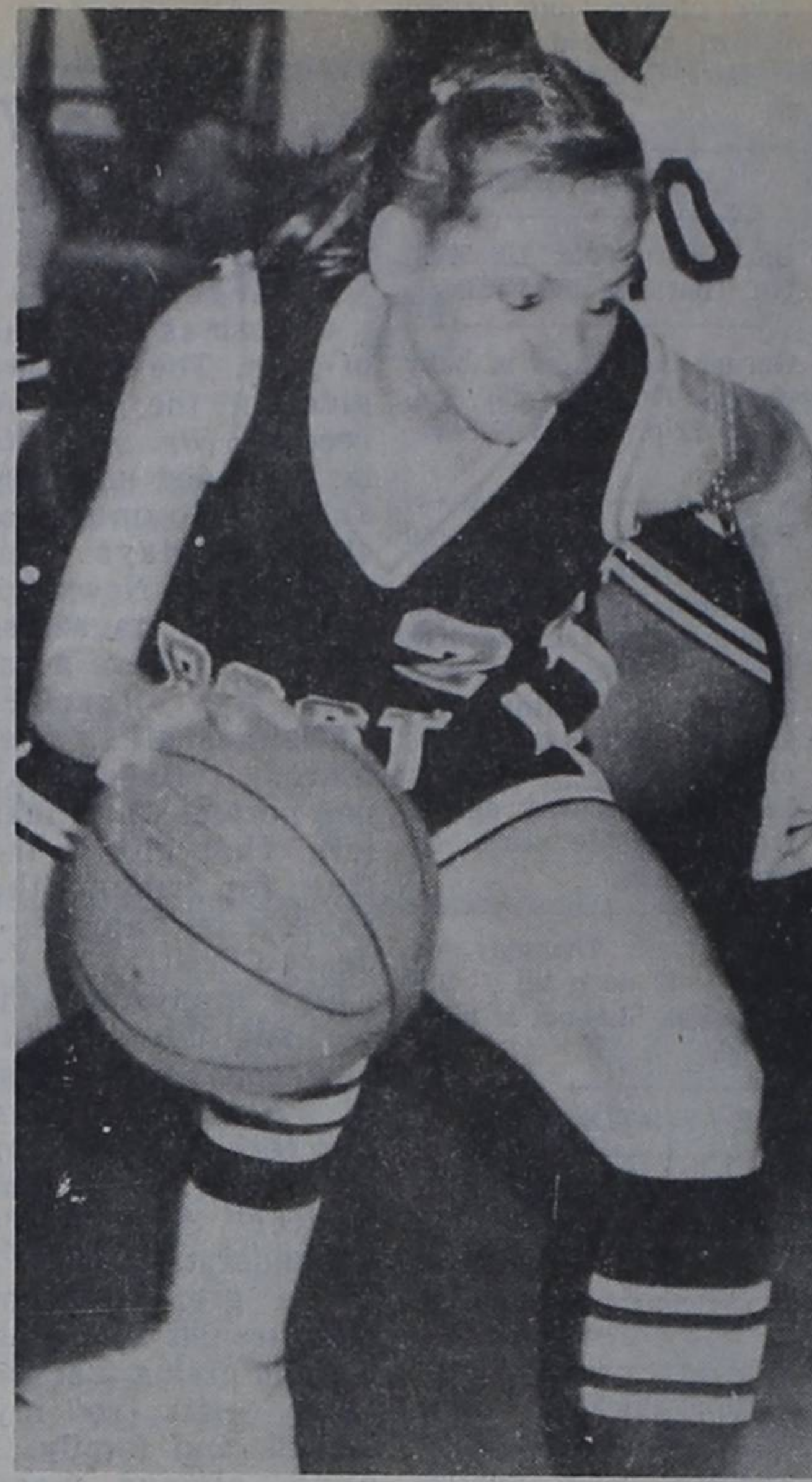
