

# Nine Touchdowns and Lots of Defense...

The Post Antelopes had possession of the football 10 times Friday night at the Tahoka Bulldog's homecoming and the 'Lopes scored on eight of those times...and added a defensive score for good measure, demolishing the Bulldogs 60-6.

Milton Williams scored five touchdowns, Giles Dalby went in twice, while Daniel Gonzales and Mike Ollison each scored once. When the stats are added up they'll show the Antelopes only punted once and scored on all but two possessions.

An awesome display of offensive power and just as stout a defense, put the undermanned Bulldogs in a no-win situation early in the game.

Williams scored on the 'Lopes first try after a six play drive which started at their own 32. He went the distance from 31 yards out, following runs by himself, Tracy Price and Daniel Gonzales.

Reserve quarterback Dale McVay guided the Antelopes throughout the game, giving starting quarterback Joel Kirkpatrick a much needed rest to help a bruised thigh muscle.

Outstanding blocking by the offensive line set the stage for the high-scoring 'Lopes performance.

Chuck Morris did his job at kicking, as

he hit six of nine extra point attempts.

The defensive score came with 8:53 left in the game as the Bulldogs were punting on fourth down from their own 24.

Johnny Morin had a punt blocked earlier, and when he tried to kick the ball, it went sailing high in the air above his head, and Giles Dalby caught the ball at the five, then stepped into the end zone, putting the 'Lopes out front 53-0.

It was that kind of a game.

Williams got his second touchdown with 3:04 left in the first quarter, capping another six play drive with a one yard plunge over right tackle.

The Bulldogs got their only score on a reverse to Steve Pierce, who went down the sidelines from the Post 41 yard line, with 9:25 left in the first half.

That was the last time the Antelope defense got caught offguard.

The next Williams six points came with 2:45 left in the half, following a six play, three first down drive from the Tahoka 49.

Williams went over right tackle from the 14, raising the score to 21-6 after the point-after.

Gonzales set up the score on a screen pass and run from the 40 to the 14.

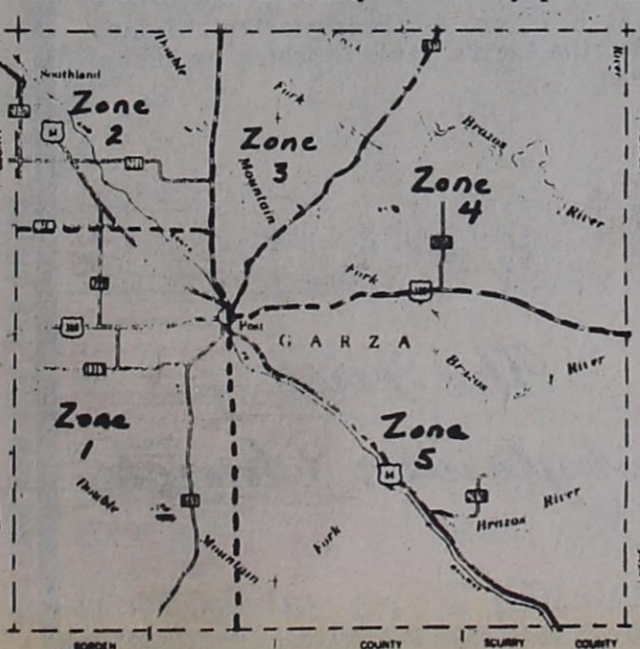

The purpose of the Garza SWCD, with headquarters in Post is to promote sound soil and water conservation programs on farm and ranch lands within the district and to serve as a voice for farmers and ranchers on conservation matters and other issues affecting private property rights of landowners.

The district board of directors coordinates the conservation efforts of various local, state and federal agencies and other organizations and has authority to enter into working agreements with these governmental agencies and private concerns to carry out its purposes.

All conservation programs managed by the district are of a voluntary nature to the landowner or operator.

Taking the opening kickoff in the second half, Williams blasted from the Tahoka 45 to the 31 on first down, then Gonzales ripped over left tackle to the nine and in four more tries Williams went in from the one...27-6.

Curt Greet hit Morin on the following Bulldog series, the ball popped loose and L.D. Harper got it for the 'Lopes at the Tahoka 31.

Dalby, Williams and Gonzales took turns cutting down the Bulldogs with Williams getting the final 12 yards over right tackle...34-6, 7:05 into the third quarter.

The defense took over, the Bulldogs punted from their 32 to the Post 31, and the Antelopes started another march to pay dirt. Dably, Williams, Felix Bustos, Greer and Gonzales joined Ollison piercing Tahoka's defense, with Gonzales going the last 22 yards on a pitchout around left end...41-6, 1:30 left in the third quarter.

James Brown blocked Morin's punt after three downs, and the 'Lopes got another shot, starting at the 'Dogs' 15.

Three plays and Dalby crashed into the end zone over left guard, with Ollison and Bustos helping out in the drive...47-6, 11:05 left in the game.

The Bulldogs were by then showing signs

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT** the Colorado River Municipal Water District of P. O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79720, holder of Weather Modification License No. 83-1 of the State of Texas, has applied for a permit to engage in an operation to change or attempt to change by artificial methods the natural development of appropriate atmospheric cloud forms or precipitation forms which occur in the troposphere. An appli-

cation has been filed with the Texas Department of Water Resources for consideration to conduct a weather modification operation to increase precipitation within the area described and by the method stated below:

1. The equipment, materials and methods to be used to conduct this operation include: a weather radar set, meteorological analysis information, a twin-engine aircraft, air-to-ground radio communications and wing-mounted racks to hold silver iodide flares; a meteorologist directs the aircraft to a radar-selected cloud to begin cloud-seeding at cloud base to increase rainfall in the target area.

2. The area intended to be affected by the operation is the target area which is bounded by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, Texas and running along Highway 87 in a north-westerly direction to Lamesa, then north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County, then east along the northern boundary lines of Dawson, Borden and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence south-southeast to Maryneal; thence southwest to Silver in Coke County; thence south-southwest to Highway 87 at a point approximately 13 miles northwest of Sterling City; thence northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas.

3. The area in which the equipment is to be located includes the operational area and the target area. The operational area is the land-area between an outer boundary which is defined by a line that encompasses the block of counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Fisher, Nolan, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, Martin and Dawson and an inner boundary which is that of the target area.

4. The persons approved by the Department to be in control and in charge of the operation are Ray Pat Jones and Owen H. Ivie, P. E.

5. The period of the operation is expected to be March 1 through November 30 during the years 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987.

6. The initial Texas Weather Modification License was issued to the Colorado River Municipal Water District Dec. 18, 1974 and has been renewed each year.

The Commission shall, if requested by at least 25 persons, hold a public hearing in the area where the operation is to be conducted prior to the

issuance of the permit. No public hearing will be held on this application unless a request for a hearing is made within 20 days following the date of publication of the first of three consecutive weekly notices of intention to engage in weather modification operations.

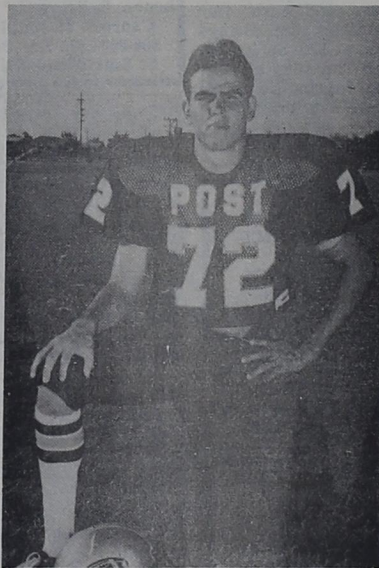

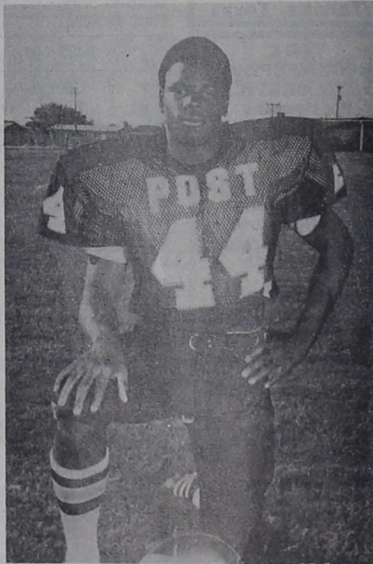
