

Farmers Face Market Choices

Cotton growers who participate in the PIK program face a different situation than in past years when government program participants received cash payments.

This season, producers who remove an additional 10-30 percent of their base acreage from production under PIK provisions will receive an amount of raw cotton equal to 80

percent of their program yield. How this will affect marketing decisions and alter traditional methods of sale is of concern to many growers across the cotton

belt. Marketing options for PIK cotton may not

be much different than those normally considered. The decision to sell at harvest or to store

in anticipation of future price increases still involve the same basic considerations by each grower - immediate sale of PIK cotton when obtained, forward crop contracting of PIK bales, futures markets, and cooperative marketing pools all remain viable options.

One option, the CCC loan is not available for the PIK cotton received under entitlement. But, certain provisions of the PIK program should work to the advantage of

marketing activities. For example, PIK cotton will be available on dates which correspond to the normal harvesting patterns in a given area — October

Coach, Principals' Contracts Extended

In a private session of the Post School Board Trustees, which lasted one and one-half hours Thursday night, members voted unanimously to uphold the suspension of a fourth grade student from school for the remainder of the school year.

School attorney, Joe Boerner, was also present for the hearing.

When the regular meeting was again opened to the public, board members heard Superintendent Bill Shiver recommend the three principals for a contract extension, which would be for two years, and also give them a "local bonus" of \$1,201 for a year, an increment over state level.

Shiver said the Athletic Director already made \$1,200 over and above and this 'bonus' would put the principals over the Athletic

Director.

Jr. Livestock Show Entries Break Record

The Garza County Junior Livestock Show and Fair, planned for next weekend, Feb. 23, 24, 25 and 26, looks to be one of the best ever, with approximately 259 entries entered for the show.

A record number of steers are entered, with 37 steers and 3 heifers entered plus 100 hogs and 90 lambs. Eight pens of chickens, and five pens of rabbits and 15 horses are also entered for judging.

The new livestock show barn, located on the Lubbock Highway will literally be bursting at the seams, with directors and helpers trying to find places for 10 more steers, and where to place 100 hogs, entered in the show.

Judges chosen for this year's show include, Jim Jenkins, who will judge beef cattle. He is the head of the agriculture department at South Plains College in Levelland; Dwayne Brown, vocational agriculture

instructor at Klondike High School, who will judge the swine division; Allen Turner, county extension agent in Ballinger, will be in the lamb ring, with

Plains judging the horse division; Lynn Wallace will judge both the meat rabbit entries and the market broilers. He is from Howard County Junior College in Big Spring, Texas.

The sale following the final judging Saturday morning, will begin at 1:30 p.m. with a good number of bidders hopefully present to buy the exhibitors animals.

The Garza County Extension Homemakers clubs will sponsor a concession stand during the show, including Wednesday afternoon during the weigh-in. A meal is planned for Saturday during the final day of showing and the sale, with a menu of ham, potato salad, green beans, hot rolls, homemade cobbler, and coffee or tea. The price of the plate is \$3.00.

Fair judges include Mrs. Wynon Mayes, Hale County Extension Agent of Home Economics and Mrs. Melissa Long, Hale County Extension Agent, Home Economics, both of Plainview judging the fair categories except for art and photography. Judging these two divisions will be Barbara Maupin, a Lubbock artist, and judging the art will be Mike McBride, journalism department of Western Texas College.

Superintendents of the different divisions include Neal Clary for the beef cattle, Tony Conner in the swine division, Rusty Woods in the lamb division, Bil Hedrick in the horse division, and Tommy Young in the meat rabbit and market broiler divisions.

Jerry Thuett will be the announcer for the show, with Bobby Fletcher of Wolfforth the auctioneer.

Motion carried to extend the principals' contracts with the bonus.

In discussing Athletic Director David Thompson's contract, Superintendent Shiver asked Thompson to give a report to the board concerning his four years here, and that the board take into consideration a one-time bonus to the football and basketball coaches for a job well done.

Thompson, in his report to the board, stated that when he came here four years ago, Post High School had 56 students participating in the football program.

Next year he expects 110 out for the program, including 17 seniors.

The bonus discussed by members was to pay a \$500 expense to eight coaches to attend the coaching clinic during the summer season.

With the discussion switching back and forth from athletics to the 'bonus' situation, school board President Jack Lott noted that this would amount to an incentive pay, which board members voted against several months ago.

Before taking action on the 'bonus' situation, the question was asked to Thompson if he were satisfied with the girls athletic program, which he replied "no."

Thompson told board members that he

When the 'bonus' situation got around to a vote, members voted to give the eight coaches a \$500 bonus to attend the coaching clinic which will be paid upon the opening of the school year.

Athletic Director David Thompson was also given an extended contract for two years. In other action, the board heard an architect's report from Dewayne McQueen who told members that the construction of the auditorium and addition between the Primary and Elementary school buildings was now 30 percent complete and had spent 25 percent of expenditures.

He noted that 28 days had been lost on the construction due to the recent bad weather.

McQueen was requested by the board to study the feasibility of adding aluminum trim around the windows in Jr. High and other buildings which required painting, as some trim needed to be painted again.





No...we will not be quiet and meekly accept the rip-off of our government.


No...we will not let economic threats from our elected officials silence our voices when we disagree with their actions.




