



New Rules for PIK

Industry support for a voluntary mechanism whereby payment-in-kind bales will be considered new crop cotton for the purpose of producer dues to the National Cotton Council was praised today by President Gerald B. Brew-

Brewer stated that the idea originated in the Producer Steering Committee meeting at the Council's recent annual meeting in Phoenix.

"The committee recognized there is a critical need to maintain programs aimed at strengthening markets for U.S. cotton and improving the economic status of all segments of the industry," Brewer explain-

He added that the group also recognized that the PIK program will greatly reduce acreage seeded to cotton and consequently reduce dues normally available to support industry ef-

Kidney stones common in dogs

Q. Our 6-year-old male dalmatian recently had problems with kidney stones. Therefore, we would like to know as much as we can about

Are kidney stones common in dogs? Are some breeds more likely to have problems with stones? What is the composition of kidney stones?

A. Stones and calculi are fairly common in the urinary tract of the dog. Calculi may be formed in any portion of the urinary tract.

The stones are most commonly found in the urinary bladder of females and in the urethra of males. The urethra is the tube that drains the urinary bladder through the penis. Stones in the kidneys or in the uretus, the tubes connecting the kidneys to the bladder, are relatively

The breeds most commonly affected include the miniature schnauzer. dachshund, dalmatian, pug, bulldog, Welsh corgi, basset hound, beagle and terriers. Although stones may occur in dogs of any size, most affected dogs are between 3 and 7 years of age. Stones are usually classified based on their composition. There are four major types: phosphate, urate, cystine and oxalate. Most urinary calculi are composed of phosphates in various combinations with calcium, magnesium and ammonium salts.

Urate calculi occur almost exclusively in male dalmatian dogs. They are composed of ammonium

Cystine calculi are rare and consist of the amino acid, cystine. Oxalate calculi are made of calcium, magnesium or ammonium oxalate. Oxalate stones are not often seen.

The signs commonly seen with urinary calculi are usually due to obstruction of the urethra. Therefore, drainage of the urainary bladder is hindered. Dogs with obstruction of the urethra make frequent attempts to urinate. However, usually only a few drops of bloody urine are passed at each attempt. Most of these dogs appear to be uncomfortable and walk in crouched positions. If not relieved soon, the animal becomes progressively depressed and shows signs of uremia

Uremia is a condition

where poisonous waste products accumulate in the body tissues instead of being eliminated. Uremic dogs are very sick and are greatly depressed. They usually have bad breath due to the buildup of waste products in their bodies.

Dogs with urinary calculi often show pain in their abdomens. They exhibit pain whenever their abdomens are touched.

Diagnosis of urinary tract stones often involves X-rays to determine the number, size and location of the stones. The main goal of treatment is to remove the blockage as quickly as possible. This often involves surgery.

There is some controversy regarding the causes of urinary stones and, therefore, some differences of opinion on how to prevent them. Whenever stones are removed from a dog they should be analyzed to determine their composition. Drugs can then be given to prevent that particular type of stone. Drugs to regulate the acidity or alkalinity of the urine often are given. Antibiotics to combat urinary tract infection usually are prescribed.

Dogs with previous urinary tract problems should be encouraged to drink water often. This may be accomplished by adding salt to the dog's diet. However, this should only be done under the supervision of a veterinarian because the additional salt may affeet other organs of the body.

Your veterinarian is the best person to consult regarding a preventive program for your particular dog. Urinary tract calculi can usually be prevented by careful control of the dog's diet and preventive

Eva is driving her car approaching the railroad crossing. Noticing that the warning lights aren't flashing she continues at 55 miles per hour until she suddenly sees that the lights are malfunctioning and a train really is coming. Eva slams her foot on the brakes, but it is too late and she strikes the train.

Eva says she did not slow down because the warning lights were not flashing and it was night and she could not see the train. Eva sues the railroad. How would you handle this?

The Texas Supreme Court said that under normal circumstances warning signs along the roadways approaching the tracks are sufficient warning. Only at extra hazardous crossings must addi-

tional warnings be used. However, in this situation it is not important if it was an extra dangerous crossing. Because the railroad company put flashing lights at the intersection the railroad had the duty to keep the lights in working order, even though the actual presence of the lights was not required.

The court found that the faulty lights contributed to the accident and ruled in favor of Eva.

Flying birds move wings circularly

A bird in flight moves its wings not vertically, but circularly, forward on the downstroke, backward on the upstroke, creating at once a lifting and propelling

Nor do the wings move in one piece; on the upstroke they are partially folded at wrist and elbow drawn in toward the body, reducing wind resistance, and the muscles of the "hand" spread the tips of the primary wing feathers, letting air flow between.

On the downstroke the wings are again fully extended and the primaries are held together, closing the slots, the concave underside of the wing section nearest the body cups the air and adds lift.




