

history," she said. "The folder contains different questions for men than for women, and also lists safeguards that anyone can observe to improve the chance of not getting cancer."

C-Days also will provide an opportunity for people to contribute toward the support of the Society's overall cancer control program, which includes research, public and professional education and patient services and rehabilitation.

"This is an important year in cancer control because the Society has launched a massive study concerning the relation of lifestyles and the environment to cancer," Mills said.
