

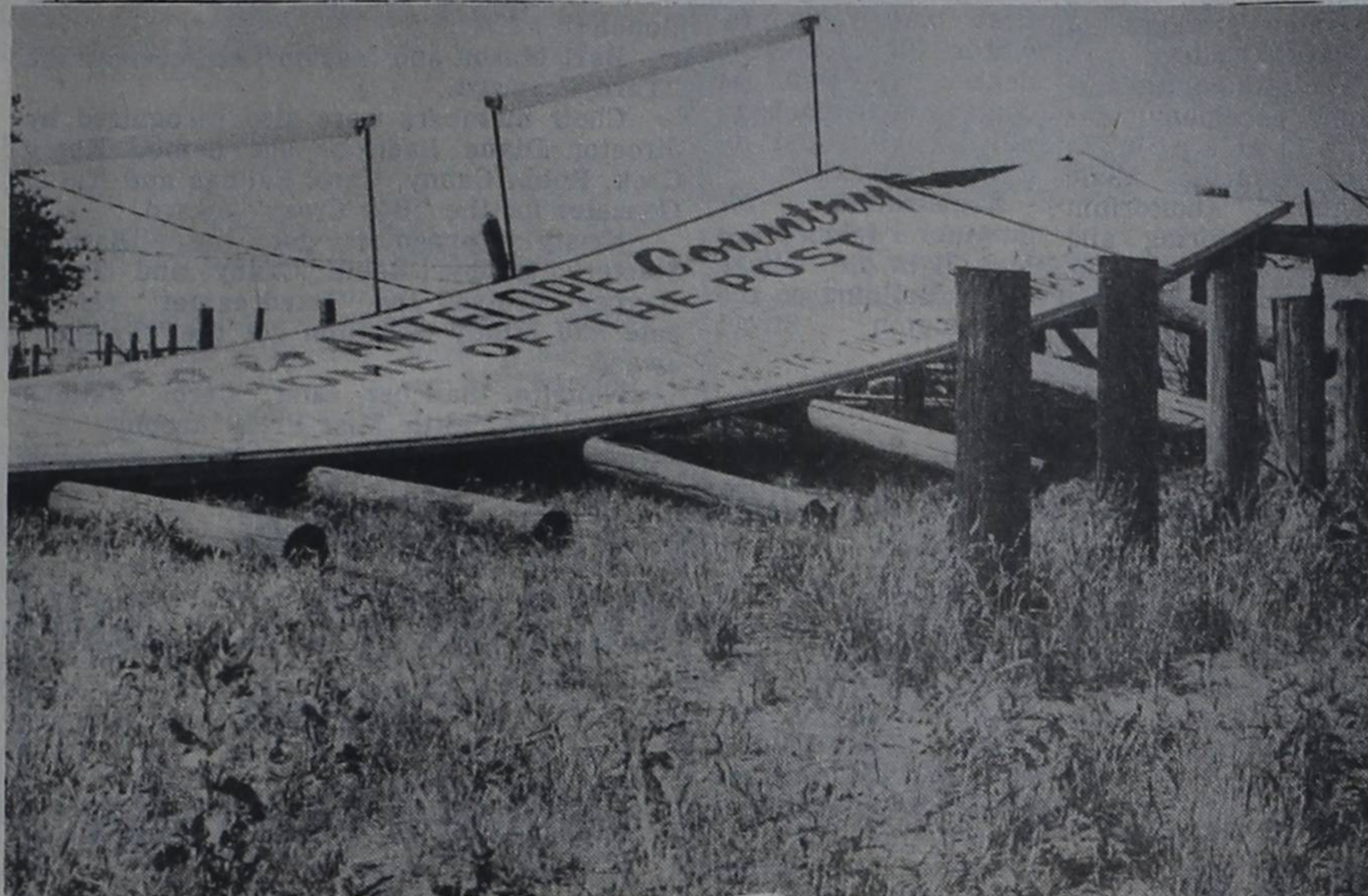

Cancer Crusade Checks Health

"Here in Post they will be the special days when American Cancer Society volunteers will ring the doorbells of friends and neighbors as part of a month-long educational and fund-raising Cancer Crusade that continues this month," Kim Mills, Co-Chairman of the local effort said today.

A special feature of C-Days will be the distribution of a new ACS pamphlet "Check Your Health."

"This little red, white and blue pamphlet might help save some lives here in Post," Mills said.

"It offers a quiz on one's risk of developing cancer.

"The risk increases with age, and it depends on lifestyle and one's medical history," she said.

"The folder contains different questions for men than for women, and also lists safeguards that anyone can observe to improve the chance of not getting cancer."

C-Days also will provide an opportunity for people to contribute toward the support of the Society's overall cancer control program, which includes research, public and professional education and patient services and rehabilitation.

"This is an important year in cancer control because the Society has launched a massive study concerning the relation of lifestyles and the environment to cancer," Mills said.

"We urge everyone to take action against cancer. Join the C-Days volunteers!"
