'Lopes Stun Eagles 41-6

Blazing speed, tenacious defense and superior physical conditioning made the Post Antelopes look like repeat district champions as they dominated the Roosevelt Eagles Friday night 41-6 in the opening game for both teams at Roosevelt.

The Antelope defense held highly touted Eagle running back Ira Johnson in check, as the 'Lope offense did what it has proven in the past to be best at...scoring.

Although the first quarter appeared to be an Eagle show, the second quarter opened with a 0-0 tie as the 'Lopes stood at the 16 yard line, ready to strike.

Sophomore quarterback Joel Kirkpatrick, on second down, rolled to his left, found Milton Williams on a flair pass and in six seconds the Bold Gold led 6-0.

Chuck Morris put the football through the uprights for the extra point, and the scoring spree had begun.

The drive started with 2:37 left in the first quarter with the Antelopes operating from their own 16 following an Eagle punt.

Williams went over right tackle to the 25, Giles Dalby took it to the 34, but the team was penalized on an illegal motion call back to the 20.

Then Kirkpatrick rolled to his right and found Charles Johnson on the 40 with a pass completion that ended up on the Roosevelt 30.

Felix Bustos got the call over left tackle to the 23, and Williams went over right tackle to the 18, followed by Dalby to the 16 over left guard.

The Post Crime Line is offering a \$200 reward for information leading to the arrest of an individual who caused a hit and run accident south of Post on US 84 August 23 at approximately 7:30 p. m.

Alfredo Fook-Tsang Lau, 26 of Lubbock was killed in the accident when he was thrown from the vehicle and was pronounced dead by Justice of the Peace Dee Justice.

The driver of the car, Jill Li, 25, also of Lubbock was hospitalized for broken vertebrae.

A composite drawing of the suspect was released this week and described as a white male, 25 to 30 years of age, with dark brown curly hair shoulder length, slender build and had a mustache.

Miss Li told officers on the night of the wreck that her car was struck by a white mid-size automobile that had been weaving from lane to lane. The vehicle may be a compact to mid-size similar to a Ford Maverick and should have some front end damage.

The suspect car was traveling west on US 84 and may have traveled towards New Mexico after a motorist reported encountering a similarly described car west of Brownfield that same night and almost ran the motorist off the road.

The victims car left the roadway after being struck and went through a deep ditch, up an embankment and became airborne for 65 feet. When it hit the ground, the vehicle flipped end over end and rolled three times.

Webster Blamed for Phonics

I have discovered through some recent reading, that the controversy over the use of phonics or word method instruction for elementary students is at least 200 years old.

Noah Webster could be credited with starting the first nation-wide rebellion against the "old ways" of teaching children how to read.

Before he came along, students were taught through a laborious, tedious and frequently boring method...learning the ABCs first, then putting the letters into words.

When Webster introduced a new way, which used a combination of letter recognition with sounding out the syllables, there was much criticism about changing what had always been and was a proved and tried method.

In fact, it wasn't until many years after Webster introduced his new system, that the idea finally caught on and became popular.

Then, his system was considered, "the way it's always been."

The reason I bring up this little bit of history, is to try to put some perspective into the recent roar from a group of parents who are insisting that their kindergarten and younger elementary students be taught to read through emphasized phonics teaching methods.

This is not a new controversy, and certainly has been chewed on and argued about through several generations of parents.

In this series of articles, we will attempt to shed some explanations as to the current controversy here, how it came to be and an outline of what prominent educators have discovered about teaching young people how to read.

About a month ago, it came to our attention through a telephone call from a concerned citizen, that the Post schools were doing away with phonics teaching.

A group of parents were to meet at the August 9 school board meeting, which was changed to August 16.

At that time, parents expressed their

concern about what they believed was happening in the kindergarten level.

School administrators stressed that phonics teaching was not being eliminated, would be continued as a part of the teaching methods, and that all kindergarten teachers were using some form of phonics teaching.

Many parents would not accept this explanation and gave examples of their children who didn't seem to progress as much as others, believing that the lack of phonics teaching was the culprit.

Although school administrators and school board members tried at that meeting and the next, to explain that phonics is a part of an over-all teaching method.

It appeared to us, as observers, that nothing short of mandatory teaching of phonics would satisfy the concerned parents.

Much can be said about the rights of parents to choose the style of teaching for their children, however, there is a strong counter-argument that to restrict teachers to

Two die in plane crash

Two Lubbock men, John Lutes, 28 and John Beeson, 27, were pronounced dead at the scene by Justice of the Peace, Shelia Melton, following a plane crash that occurred Tuesday night.

The crash was discovered shortly after 8:30 a. m. Wednesday by oil field workers Clyde Cash and Bill Case, who reported it to the Garza County Sheriff's Office and the Department of Public Safety.

Federal Aviation Administration investigators estimated that the crash occurred about 8:30 p. m. Tuesday, but the plane was not reported missing until 1:30 a. m. Wednesday.

The crash was discovered in a field 14.8 miles north of Post, about 100 yards from a Garza County road.

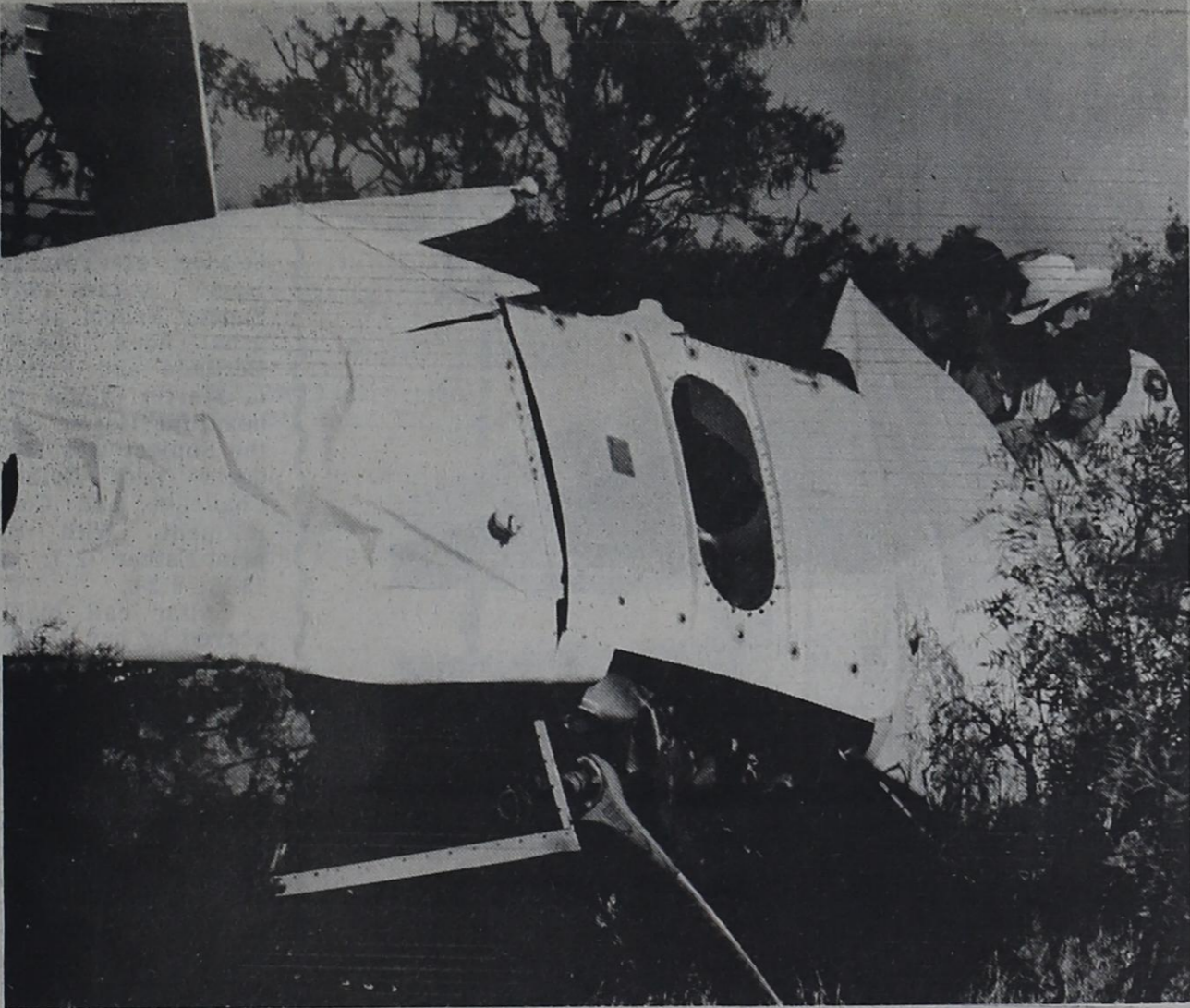
According to Department of Public Safety reports, when the plane hit, it skidded approximately 25 to 30 feet with the left wheel coming off and flipped over.

The plane reportedly took off from Ag. Central Aircraft's runway in Town and Country Air Park near Slaton with FAA investigators unable to determine the exact destination of the two men.

It was first thought that the plane might have run out of fuel, but further investigations found that there was still fuel in the tank.

Lutes was the pilot of the 1946 Luscomb two-seater airplane and had earlier been employed by Ag Central as an aircraft mechanic, but at the time of his death was employed with Lubbock Lock & Key as was Beeson, who had just recently moved to Lubbock from Brownfield.

The bodies were taken to Resthaven Funeral Home of Lubbock where services were pending.

Dr. Chun Joins Door Prize List

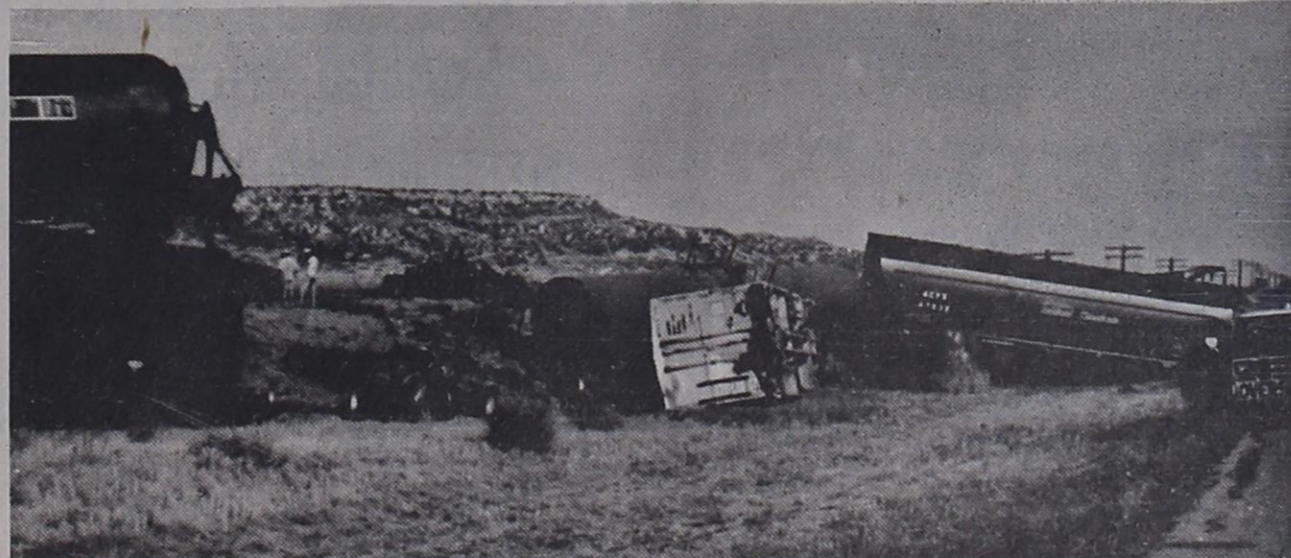

Common sense dictates a mix in teaching methods

limited and specifically controlled teaching methods, could be just as harmful as not teaching phonics at all.

And, more importantly perhaps, how about those parents who prefer that their child be taught by a combination method? Should their children be placed under a program which might not fit their child?

As we stated in an earlier article, the way a person feels about this topic depends primarily on how they look at it.

Parents whose children are already past the elementary level also have their opinions. Just about anyone you talk to, has some idea, pro or con, about the phonics issue.

Several of the pro-phonics parents have asked me how I feel, how were my children taught to read?

Honestly, I can't really say...our older two attended seven elementary schools in six years, from California to Oregon, Nebraska, Louisiana, Ohio and Texas.

They seem to read and comprehend fairly well.

Part of that could be the fact that our family has been in some form of information business and that home environment has to have had an affect.

I was asked how did I learn to read?

My recollection, outside of the normal ABCs at school, were early afternoon nap-times as a pre-schooler, when my Mom placed me on one side and my younger brother on the other side, as she propped her head on a pillow and read aloud from her big Bible, which had a lot of neat pictures.

I guess you could say that kind of teaching used both phonics (because we could hear her sound out the words) and word association, because our little eyes could scan the page as she read.

I suppose what I'm saying is, a specific teaching method can not be imposed dogmatically on all students with any certainty that every child will get the same out of it.

I am not an educator in the formal sense, but I have had some experience at teaching and I have through the years in all the places I've lived and worked, been exposed to a multitude of schools, teaching methods and seen various degrees of illiteracy and highly literate young people, all graduating from the same schools but with different achievements.

Because of the industry that I am associated with, I look with obvious concern at the fearful thought that current and future generations might come out of school unable to read.

If that happens, then we in the printed media business are in for a lot of trouble.

Parents who push me to the wall to make a statement about phonics as being the best

method of teaching will find me responding something like this:

I have seen hand written reports by students who spell most words exactly the way they sound...if that's a result of phonics, I'm not impressed.

It seems to me just plain common sense, that children learning how to read ought to be exposed to the best of both teaching methods.

Sure, they need to know how to decode the sounds, but if they don't know what the words mean or can't spell them correctly, they're not much better off in this world today.

I cite an example from personal experience...I grew up as a "Border Rat," in Brownsville, Texas.

I can read or comprehend very little written Spanish, but let a Tejano friend encourage me, and I'll carry on a fairly decent conversation in "Tex-Mex."

The reason is simple, I learned at an early age to mimic the sounds of the Spanish being spoken by my school mates and learned that certain sounds meant more or less certain things.

Limited though it was, this "phonics" self-taught approach proved invaluable to me through the years.

However, I am not fluent in Spanish as a result of this phonics teaching, and I can not get past the simple Spanish words in written form.

Wednesday we'll look at what professional educators say about this issue.

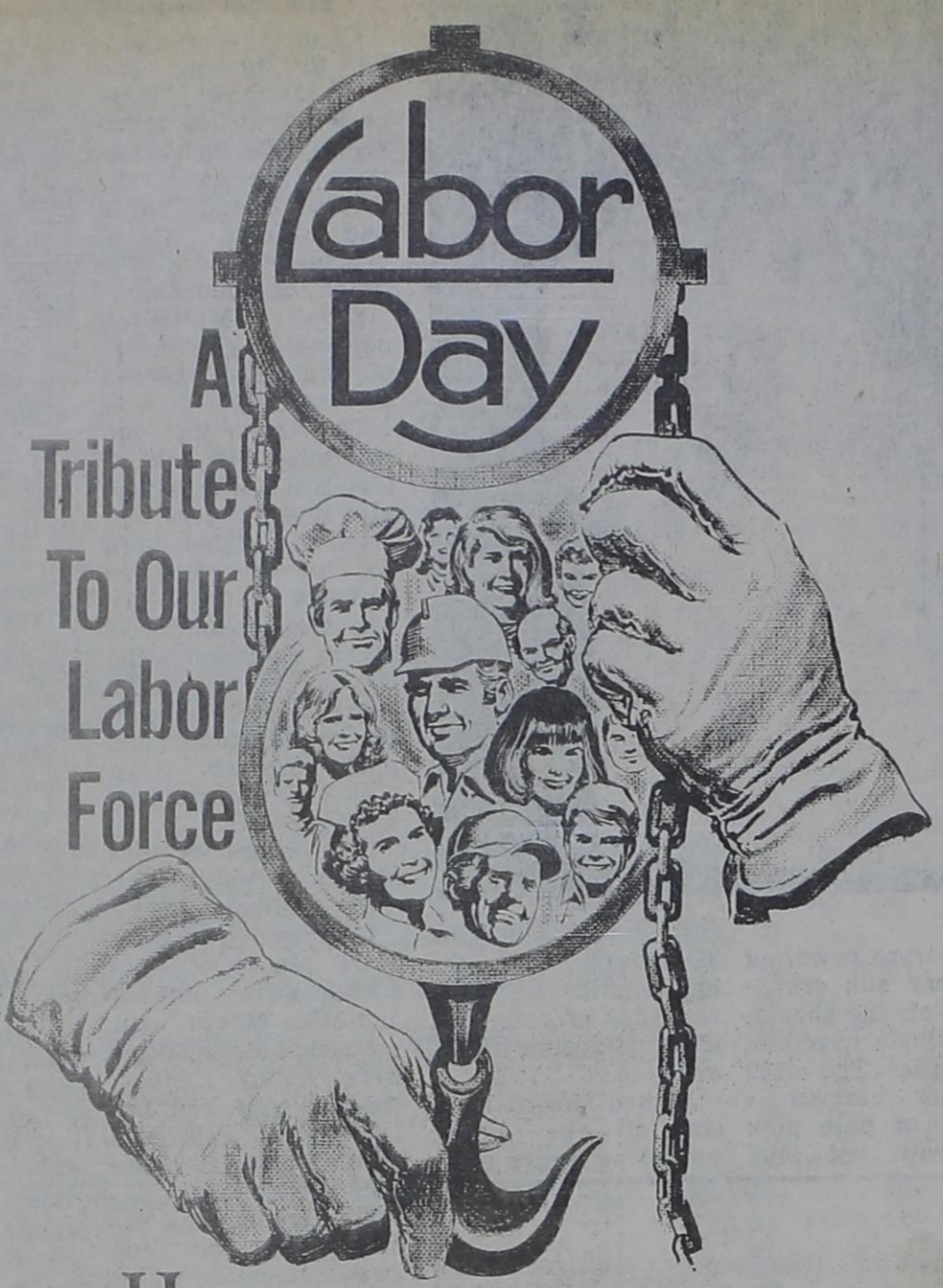

(Cont'd from P. 1) Second Touchdown The Antelopes got the ball back after an Eagle punt was returned by Williams from the Post 26 to the Roosevelt 48. With 9:34 left in the half, the 'Lopes opened a four-play touchdown drive, capped by a one-half yard plunge by Daniel Gonzales over left end.

The big plays in the drive came as Williams took a hand-off over left tackle, breaking arm tackles to the 20, and then Bustos blasting a round left end, barely being shoved out of bounds at the one-half yard line.

The next series gave the crowd a shock, as the Eagles pulled a draw play, sending Johnson past the 'Lope secondary, finally being hauled down by Dalby, and during the ensuing gang-tackling, Johnson lost control of the football and what looked like trouble for the Bold Gold turned into another chance.

Four plays later, the 'Lopes punted, temporarily losing the advantage. The Eagles mounted another threat in the waning minutes of the first half, but ran out of steam at their 44 and were forced to punt the ball with only 19 seconds left.

Antelope coach David Thompson sent quarterback Kirkpatrick into the huddle with instructions to score...and the young field general dropped back to pass, with good protection, lofted the ball down the right sidelines to L.D. Harper, who simply turned on the afterburners, racing into the end zone, and the 'Lopes led 21-0 after the kick.

Second Half The Eagles came out smoking in the second half, held the 'Lopes on the first series, then put their only points on the board as Johnson finished off the drive from the three.

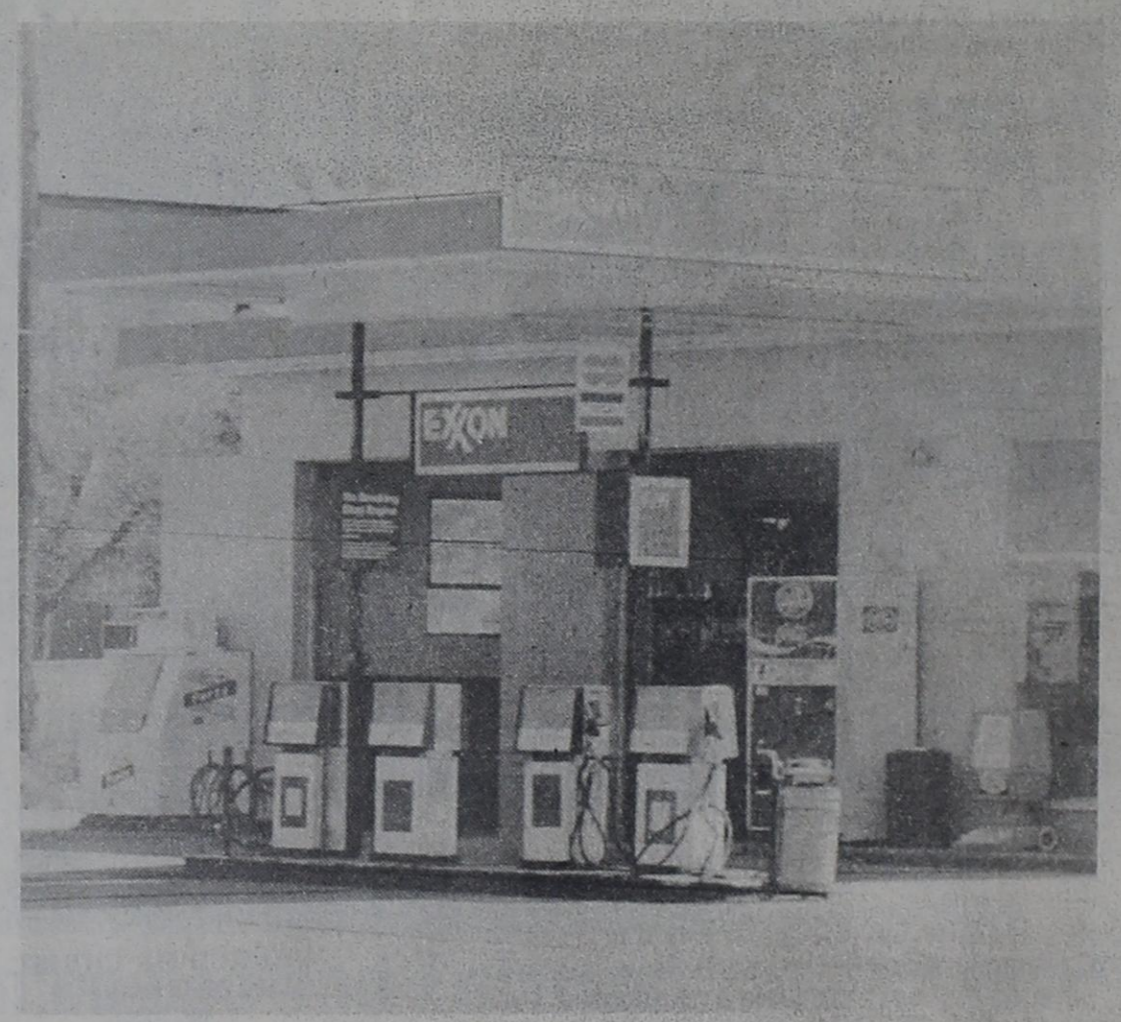

by the 'Lope defense. Roosevelt looked hungry, as on the kickoff they recovered a Charles Johnson fumble on the Post 43, where a tough and hard-hitting 'Lope defensive squad took over.

Next TD Drive

A sustained, no-nonsense, hard-nosed drive proved to any doubters that the Antelopes are for real as they started a 15 play drive with 4:14 left in the third quarter.

From their own 20 yard line, the 'Lopes hit over left tackle with Gonzales to the 26, followed by Williams over right guard to the 39 and a first down.

Gonzales got the call again around left end to the 40, Kirkpatrick threw an incomplete pass to Johnson, which was tipped by a defender, then hit a pass to Gonzales around right end behind a screen to the 45, and collected another 15 for a late hit penalty on the Eagles.

On first down from the Roosevelt 40, Kirkpatrick gave the ball to Williams, who bullied his way to the 37, Dalby took it for another tough two yards to the 29 for a first down.

Kirkpatrick then kept the ball on an option inside the left end and Williams shot over right tackle to the 16 for another first down.

Still leading 21-6, the Antelopes entered the final quarter, smelling paydirt.

Final Scoring

Dalby blasted through the right side to the nine, Williams tried the same side to the eight and then again over right tackle to the four and one-half for a first and goal.

Kirkpatrick sliced on a keeper over left

tackle to the two, Williams pushed his way over right tackle to the one-half and then over the same side, slid in standing up for the touchdown.

The right side blocking in the drive was provided by Curt Cowdrey, Jay Valdez, James Mock and L.D. Harper.

With 9:15 left in the game, the Antelopes took a 27-6 lead, missing the extra point attempt.

Solid Defense

Putting heavy pressure on the Eagle quarterback, the 'Lope defense gave the ball back to the offense after two plays as Ricky Moore intercepted a pass at the Roosevelt 25, although a penalty after interception set the team back to the Roosevelt 42.

In three plays the Bold Gold led 34-6, as Williams caught a pass on the 30 and took it to the nine yard line.

Next Kirkpatrick handed the ball to Curt Greer over left end to the five and Dalby got the call over left end for the touchdown, with 7:09 left in the contest.

The Eagles were gasping for breath, as they found themselves outmatched in speed, quickness and endurance.

The Antelopes got the ball back after a strong defensive stand, which opened up a one-play drive from their own 24 yard line.

Kirkpatrick handed the ball to Gonzales, who hit a hole over left tackle, then broke through two defenders and showed his back to the secondary as he sped untouched for a 76 yard scoring run.

The point after lit up the score board for the final score, 41-6, and a fine beginning for the 1983 Post Bold Gold Antelopes.

Cotton Use Rises
Domestic cotton use increased again in July, continuing a general trend of improvement, the National Cotton Council reports.

Cotton was consumed at a seasonally adjusted annual rate of nearly 6 million 480-pound bale equivalents, 0.2 percent ahead of the June pace and 16.7 percent higher than the July, 1982, figure. Moreover, cotton use advanced 7.5 percent from January through July, the Council stated.

Cotton's share of the total fiber use stood at 23.4 percent in July, compared with 23.6 percent the month before and 24.5 percent a year ago. On cotton system spindles, cotton's share increased to 61.0 percent, up from 60.3 percent in June and 60.7 percent in July of last year.
