Most folks in Garza County appreciated the heavy, dark clouds which swooped over the area Thursday afternoon and evening, dropping more than an inch of rain in most

places. Although cotton farmers were caught in the fields defoliating, and the rain presents a problem for them at this time, not too much complaining was going on.

A blessing for some, a problem for others, but the rain Thursday broke a three month or more dry spell in Garza County.
Ranch watering tanks weren't filled, most ranchers reporting little or no run-off, but the parched ground seemed to sigh with relief as an average of one inch fell generally across the county.
A quick striking thunderstorm blitzed through Post Thursday evening, dropping pea-sized hail, forcing junior high football fans to scramble for cover.
Riley Miller at Miller Brothers near Justiceburg reported .5 Thursday, but last Sunday measured one inch with other parts of the ranch reporting 1.3 inches of rain Thursday.
Other ranches reporting rain were:
Cross H — five miles east of Post — .5;
Bird Ranch — 15 miles east of Post — .6;
O. S. — 15 miles south of Post — 1.;
Beggs Cattle Co. — 25 miles east of Post — 1.1.
U Lazy S Ranch, south of Post received anywhere from a trace to .5 inch;
The Kirkpatrick ranch southeast of Post received 1.5 inches.
Garza County ranchers are encouraged to call The Dispatch after significant rains so that a general report may be provided.
On the negative side, county cotton farmers were caught in the fields, defoliating, and the timing of the rains has created problems.

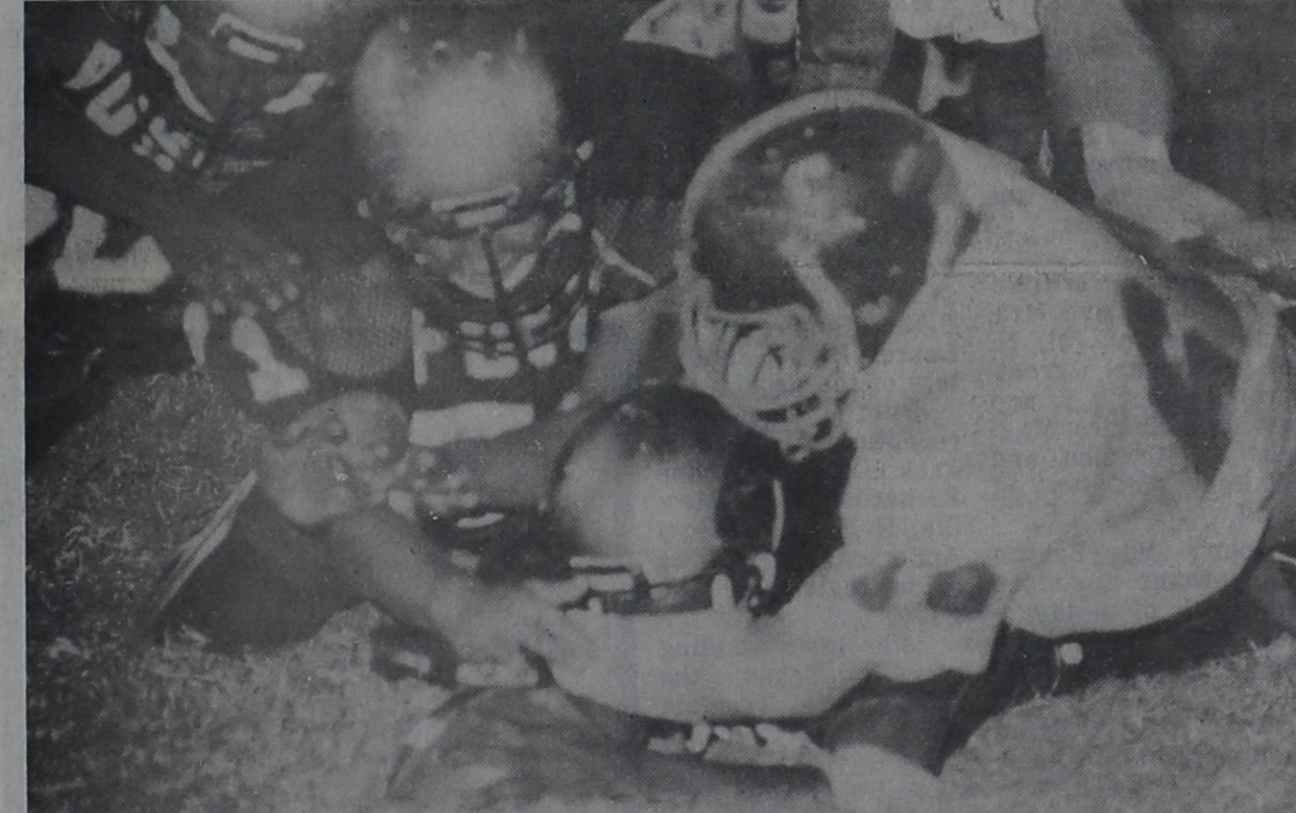

Defense Saves 'Lopes in 21-7 Win

Three goal-line stands by the Post Antelope defense in the third and fourth quarters gave the reigning District 3AAA champions a 21-7 edge over the visiting Childress Bobcats here Friday night in the opening district opener for both teams.
Leading 14-7 at the half, the 'Lopes came into the second half, kicking off to the Bobcats.
The visitors, who clearly had upset on their minds, marched in six plays to Post 44, and on fourth down pulled a fake punt, as John Lott took the short snap and raced through a gaping hole up the middle to the Post 30 yard line.
Then nine plays later, the Bobcats rammed to the two yard line, and on fourth down the entire Antelope right defensive side stopped Kenneth Sims at the one-half yard line and the ball went over on downs.
Unable to move the ball, the 'Lopes punted and after a personal foul penalty on Post, the Bobcats started another move to paydirt from the 'Lope 19.
In four plays they made it to the 10, before a stiff Antelope defense gave the ball back to the offense after a fourth down try failed for the 'Cats.
Then, early in the fourth quarter, the Post defense stymied another Bobcat scoring attempt, which started at the Post 10 yard line after a blocked punt.
Four plays later, a pass in the end zone to Terry Smith was batted away by Rodney Hays and Keith Osborne...which set up the final Antelope touchdown drive.

The defensive effort was sparked by linebackers Giles Dalby, Curt Greer, Felix Bustos and Daniel Gonzales, ends L.D. Harper, R.J. Greathouse, James Brown, David Shults, interior linemen Jay Valdez and Keith Osborne.

Williams took the handoff from Dale McVay on the 15 and behind excellent blocking, the speedster left Bobcat defenders sprawled on the ground along the way.

Chuck Morris' kick put the 'Lopes out front 7-0.

After forcing Childress to punt, Williams caught the ball at the Post 30 and repeated the kickoff return, racing down the left sidelines behind a wall of blockers, but was tripped up by a lone defender at the six yard line.

Two plays later Williams took the hand off over left tackle from the four and into the end zone. Another kick and the 'Lopes took the lead 14-0.

Late in the first quarter the Bobcats scored on a five play drive, using two passes and scoring on the second one as Boyd Johnston found Lott on a lobb pass around right end from the three yard line.

Another great defensive stand kept the 'Cats from scoring early in the second quarter from the Post 14, then later from as close as the seven.

A third down play from the 23 saw Johnston passing to Sims, who fumbled the ball at the 13 and Williams recovered for Post.

Then, after a brilliant 26 yard run, breaking three tackles and finally being ridden down by Chris Castleberry, Williams got hit on the next play and fumbled the ball.

From the Childress 44, the Bobcats picked up a first down to the Post 36, then Johnston fumbled the ball and the Antelopes got it back at their own 36.

They moved the ball consistently to the 'Cat three yard line, and then with 13 seconds left in the first half, quarterback Joel Kirkpatrick was caught for no gain and the teams went to the lockers.

After the strong defensive show in the fourth quarter, the 'Lopes started their final touchdown drive with 10:32 left in the game.

Williams took the sweep around right end to the Childress 35 from the Post six...then the play was nullified by a holding penalty, bringing the ball back to the five yard line.

Williams went over right tackle to the 15.

Then Curt Greer sliced over right guard to the Childress 35, surprising the Bobcat defenders as he outmaneuvered the secondary.

Williams went to the 34, then to the 29 and on third down Dalby blasted over left end to the 29.

Daniel Gonzales took the ball over left tackle to the 14, then Williams went over right tackle to the six.

The Bobcats were beginning to show signs of wearing out, as the physically conditioned 'Lopes controlled the line of scrimmage.

Williams got the call again over left guard, and the ball squirted loose at the goal line, but was recovered by the Antelopes in the end zone for the touchdown.

Morris made it three-for-three...21-7.

With 6:36 remaining, the Bobcats tried to mount a drive, but were thwarted by a swarming 'Lope defense.

On second down from the Childress 46, Johnston's pass deep was intercepted by Michael Ollison on the 20 and returned to the Post 35.

After a penalty the 'Lopes started on their 24 and then a bad pitch out was recovered by the 'Cats on the 25.

J.V. Joust Dunbar

"It could have just as easily been us six, Dunbar zero," coach Ken Plumlee comments about Thursday's junior varsity football game in Lubbock.

The Dunbar JV outscored the Antelopes 12-6 but only after a determined effort by the visiting 'Lopes.

"Going toe-to-toe with a 4A school, and one as good as Dunbar, is a real challenge," the coach adds.

Adam Perez scored the 'Lope touchdown on a four yard run following a nine play, 74 yard drive.

Dunbar got one score on a 56 yard pass play and the other following a 'Lope fumble near the

end zone.

"We played good defense against the run, holding them to 112 yards," the coach explains, "and their score came as a result of us not tackling very well."

"Benny Hair ran very well, Steve Gomez had a good game," Plumlee continues, "with Lanny Wilbourn and Rodney Tidwell playing excellent defense."

The coach also praised Sammy Binford and Bruce Crenshaw for their efforts as defensive ends.

The junior varsity contest with Dunbar came as a last minute result of cancellation by the Brownfield junior varsity.

The team hosts Slaton this Thursday.

Before the heavy rain began, the 'Lopes scored in the first quarter on an eight play drive with tailback Mike Bartlett running off-tackle for the final 10 of the 42 yard drive.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Colorado River Municipal Water District of P. O. Box 869, Big Spring, Texas 79720, holder of Weather Modification License No. 83-1 of the State of Texas, has applied for a permit to engage in an operation to change or attempt to change by artificial methods the natural development of appropriate atmospheric cloud forms or precipitation forms which occur in the troposphere. An application has been filed with the Texas Department of Water Resources for consideration to conduct a weather modification operation to increase precipitation within the area described and by the method stated below:

1. The equipment, materials and methods to be used to conduct this operation include: a weather radar set, meteorological analysis information, a twin-engine aircraft, air-to-ground radio communications and wing-mounted racks to hold silver iodide flares; a meteorologist directs the aircraft to a radar-selected cloud to begin cloud-seeding at cloud base to increase rainfall in the target area.

2. The area intended to be affected by the operation is the target area which is bounded by a line beginning at a point of origin at Big Spring, Texas and running along Highway 87 in a north-westerly direction to Lamesa, thence north-northeast on Highway 87 to the north border of Dawson County, thence east along the northern boundary lines of Dawson, Borden and Scurry Counties to Highway 84; thence southeast along Highway 84 to Roscoe, in Nolan County; thence south-southeast to Maryneal; thence southwest to Silver in Coke County; thence south-southwest to Highway 87 at a point approximately 13 miles northwest of Sterling City; thence northwesterly along Highway 87 to the point of origin at Big Spring, Texas.

3. The area in which the equipment is to be located includes the operational area and the target area. The operational area is the land-area between an outer boundary which is defined by a line that encompasses the block of counties of Lynn, Garza, Kent, Fisher, Nolan, Coke, Sterling, Glasscock, Martin and Dawson and an inner boundary which is that of

the target area.

4. The persons approved by the Department to be in control and in charge of the operation are Ray Pat Jones and Owen H. Ivie, P. E.

5. The period of the operation is expected to be March 1 through November 30 during the years 1984, 1985, 1986 and 1987.

6. The initial Texas Weather Modification License was issued to the Colorado River Municipal Water District Dec. 18, 1974 and has been renewed each year.

The Commission shall, if requested by at least 25 persons, hold a public hearing in the area where the operation is to be conducted prior to the issuance of the permit. No public hearing will be held on this application unless a request for a hearing is made within 20 days following the date of publication of the first of three consecutive weekly notices of intention to engage in weather modification operations.
