School Board Hears Report on Facilities

Wednesday, December 21, 1983

Architect Duane McQueen gave a presentation of current athletic and ag facilities and told school board members the results of the questionnaires he had sent out to faculty recently. The board of trustees were meeting in regular session Tuesday night, Dec. 13.

McQueen noted that the present football field sets on a 220 x 430 tract of land and that the current seating held 1,428 on the Post side with 532 seats available on the visitors side and the seating needed to be upgraded to at least 4,000.

The field house, used by varsity players is inadequate for the number of students involved and either needs to be renovated or rebuilt to add more space. The Middle school was also noted as needing to have more dressing rooms available for students.

McQueen also advised board members that the present high school gym seating was not adequate, as it only seats 380 fans and needs to be upgraded to 750.

Trustees took no action on the presentation by McQueen as they are meeting with a new architect at their January meeting.

Jack Lott was selected on the ballot by trustees as their director on the appraisal district board and was approved during the meeting.




The court gave Judge Dalby the authorization to sign the Certificate of Revenue Sharing with a copy of the statement of assurances to be made a permanent record of the minutes.





Thompson, Rockford Burris, Christine Mor-ris, E. A. Howard Jr., and Bill Shiver. Superintendent Bill Shiver advised the board that he had met with Dr. Lindsay at T. E. A. in Austin in November and discussed different types of Vocational programs. He suggested to Mr. Shiver that the board run some survey of both the areas of parents and students. The survey will be sent out to the community in January with the totals to be sent to the agency in February and recommendations to be made to the board in March.

Mr. Shiver also asked the board if they wanted to change the school calendar so that students did not have to return to school on January 2. 


