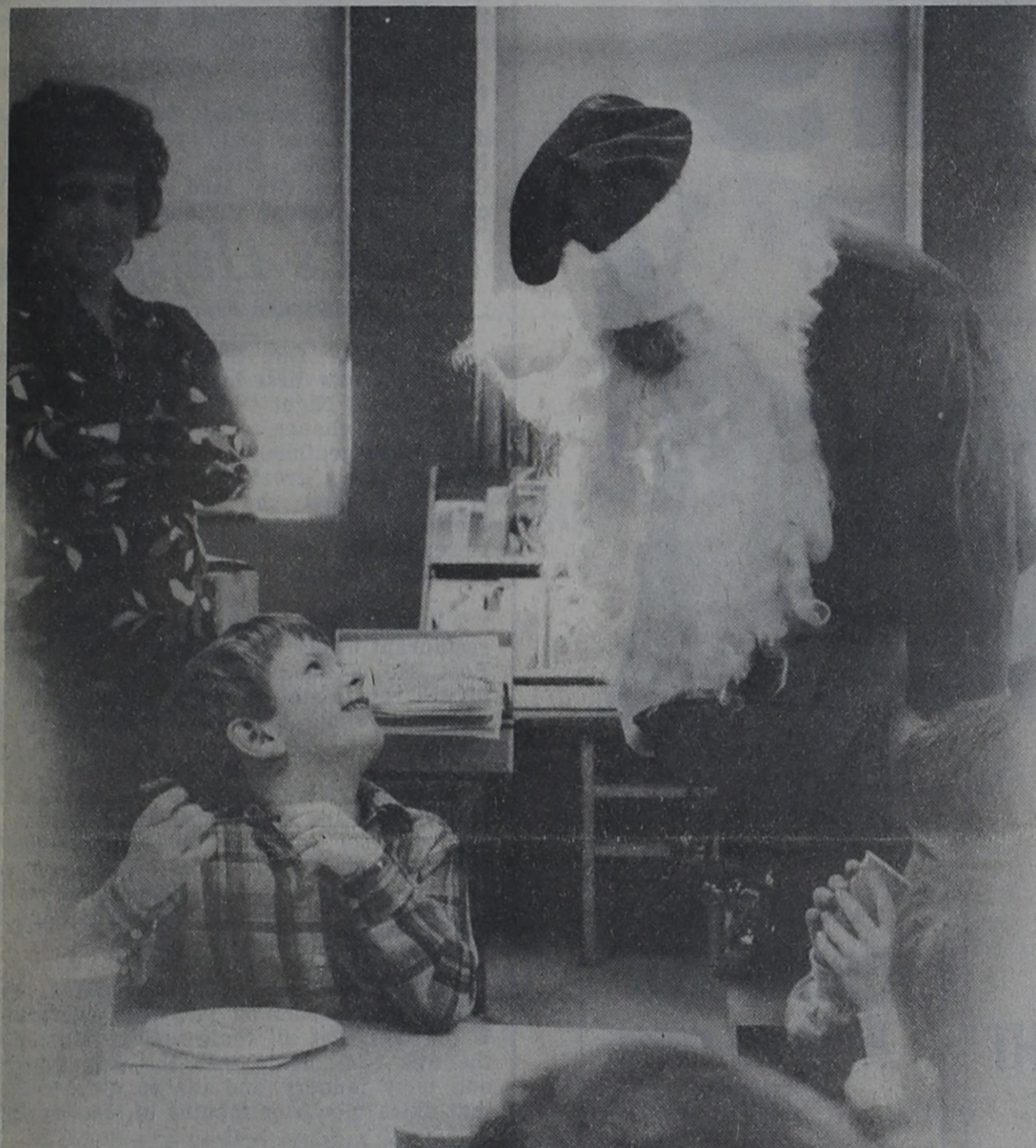

## School Board Hears Report on Facilities

Architect Duane McQueen gave a presentation of current athletic and ag facilities and told school board members the results of the questionnaires he had sent out to faculty recently. The board of trustees were meeting in regular session Tuesday night, Dec. 13.

McQueen noted that the present football field sets on a 220 x 430 tract of land and that the current seating held 1,428 on the Post side with 532 seats available on the visitors side and the seating needed to be upgraded to at least 4,000.

The field house, used by varsity players is inadequate for the number of students involved and either needs to be renovated or rebuilt to add more space. The Middle school was also noted as needing to have more dressing rooms available for students.

McQueen also advised board members that the present high school gym seating was not adequate, as it only seats 380 fans and needs to be upgraded to 750.

Trustees took no action on the presentation by McQueen as they are meeting with a new architect at their January meeting.

Jack Lott was selected on the ballot by trustees as their director on the appraisal district board and was approved during the meeting.

Appointment of the 1984 textbook committee was also approved and include: Mrs. Peggy Lott, Mrs. Rowena Pierce, Patricia Reynolds, Ida Jones, Doris Giddens, Mary Wristen, Julie Hudman, Marge Tannehill, Candace McConnell, Juanita

## New Medical Alert System

Garza Memorial Hospital Board of Directors was informed of the new Medi-Mate system which has been installed at the hospital, but are still awaiting the arrival of the portable units.

The new system, which will cost subscribers \$15 a month, is hooked up to the hospital with the subscriber having a portable unit which they may take with them outside the home or around their home. Linda Bell has been designated as the

program coordinator. The system is available in the country and city including the Fletcher Carter area and Tahoka. The only stipulation is that subscribers may not be on a party line, but must be a private line telephone.

Those interested in subscribing to the service should contact Maritta Reed at Garza Memorial Hospital or Linda Bell.

Meeting in regular session, directors wrote of \$2,748.92 in delinquent accounts to

be turned over to a collection agency.

Directors also approved the installation of a purification system to feed deionized water to the steam generator that feeds the autoclave. Initial installation of \$590 was quoted and a quarterly charge of \$115 thereafter.

Before adjourning, directors approved the minutes of the last meeting, monthly bills and heard an audit report.

## Commissioners Approve Court Coordinator

The Commissioners Court, meeting in regular session Dec. 12 approved the Grant Application for a Court Coordinator for the 106th Judicial District Court.

In other action, commissioners approved the employment of Lena Gomez for a period of 90 days, to be under the supervision of the Treasurer's office, and Voda Beth Gradine. Ms. Gomez' employment will be on a quarterly basis.

The court gave Judge Dalby the authorization to sign the Certificate of Revenue Sharing with a copy of the statement of assurances to be made a permanent record of the minutes.

The court also approved the construction of new shelves and the removal of a sink in the County Clerks office.

Before adjourning, the court approved the monthly reports, monthly invoices and the minutes of the last meeting.

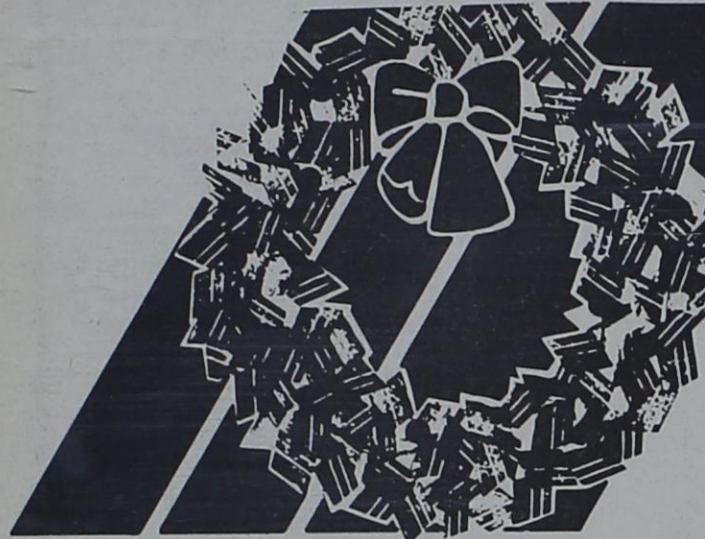
Thompson, Rockford Burris, Christine Morris, E. A. Howard Jr., and Bill Shiver.

Superintendent Bill Shiver advised the board that he had met with Dr. Lindsay at T. E. A. in Austin in November and discussed different types of Vocational programs. He suggested to Mr. Shiver that the board run some survey of both the areas of parents and students. The survey will be sent out to the community in January with the totals to be sent to the agency in February and recommendations to be made to the board in March.

Mr. Shiver also asked the board if they wanted to change the school calendar so that students did not have to return to school on January 2. He said a survey had been made of faculty and that it was running 50-50, the board did not have to vote on the change as they left it as is, with students returning on the 2nd.

The board did vote on using the new auditorium for graduation ceremonies so that plans may be finalized and will not have to be changed at the last minute due to the weather. Trustees were told that with graduation being held in the auditorium, participants would have to be issued tickets, but that each graduate would receive seven tickets which would be ample.

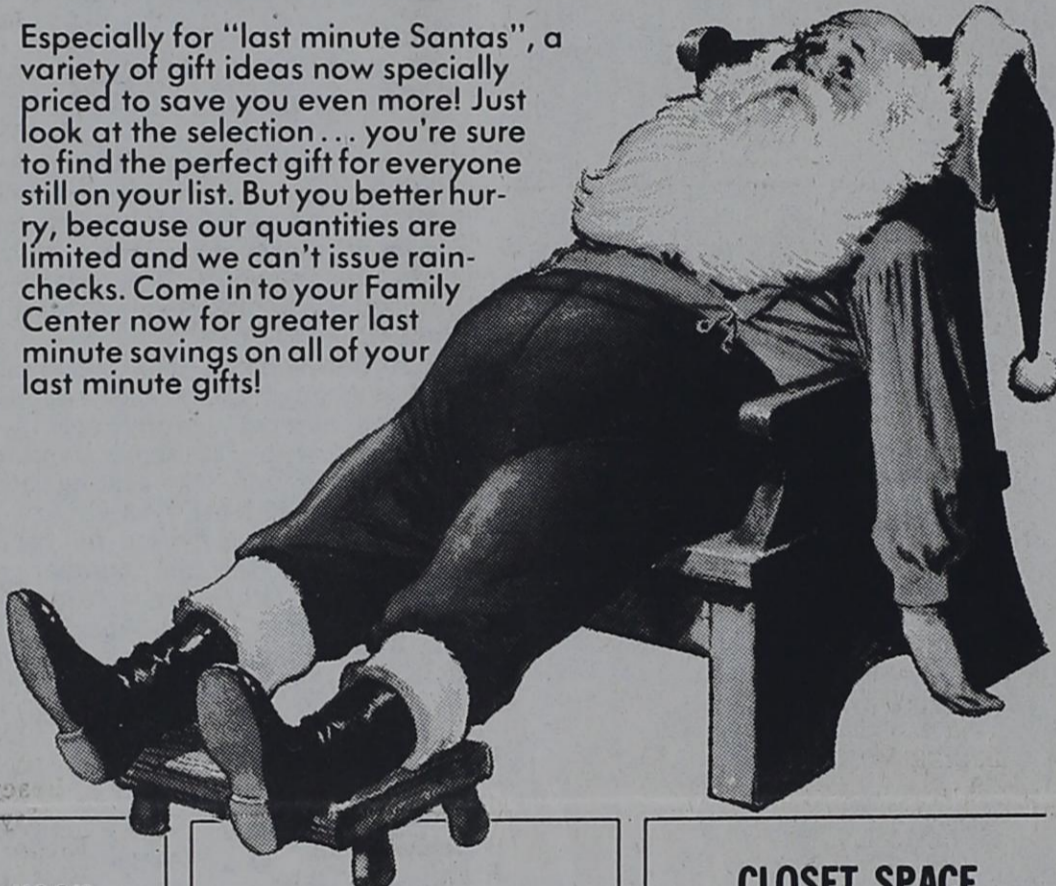
Before adjourning, trustees discussed the possibility of raises for coaches with no action taken and to be discussed at the meeting in January.

Looking like they were three weeks into basketball, the Post Antelope varsity football players took control of the court in their first

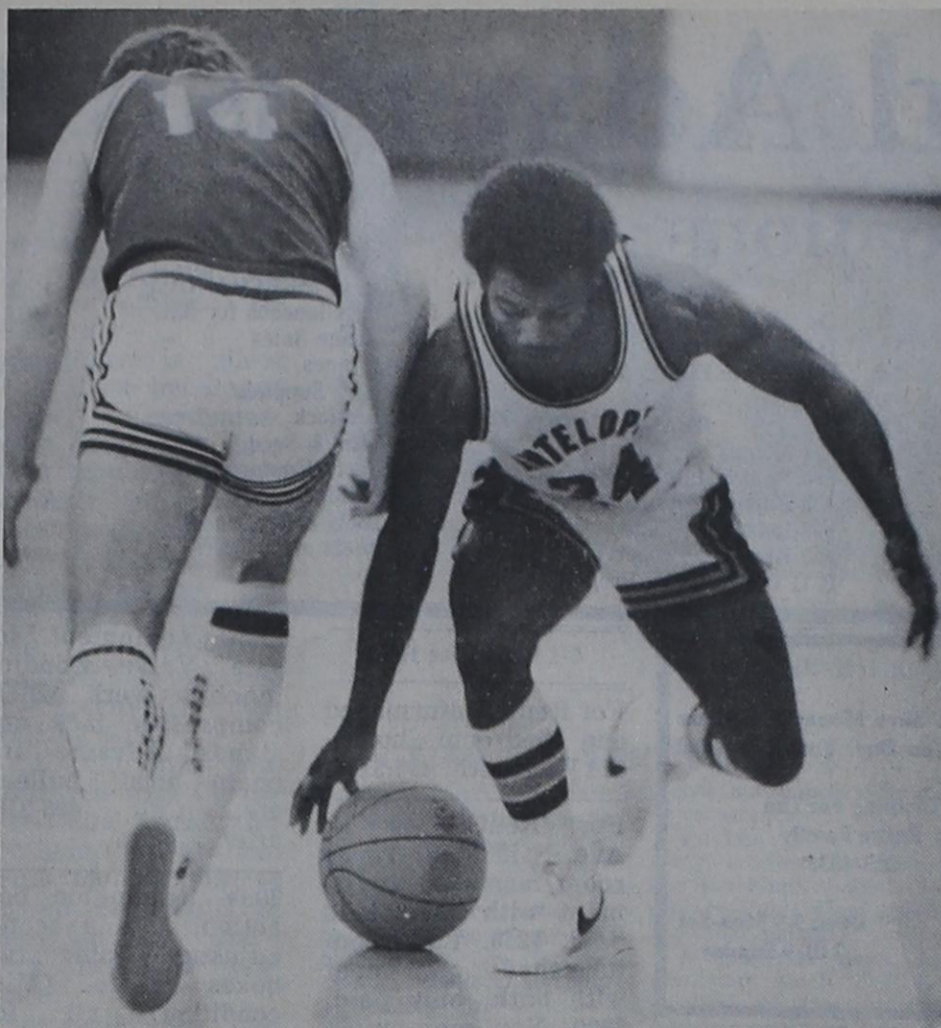
contest last Friday with Ralls Jackrabbits 75-51. L. D. Harper led the scoring with 18 points, followed by Milton Williams with

for 12 and scored 15 in the final period with Ralls eight.

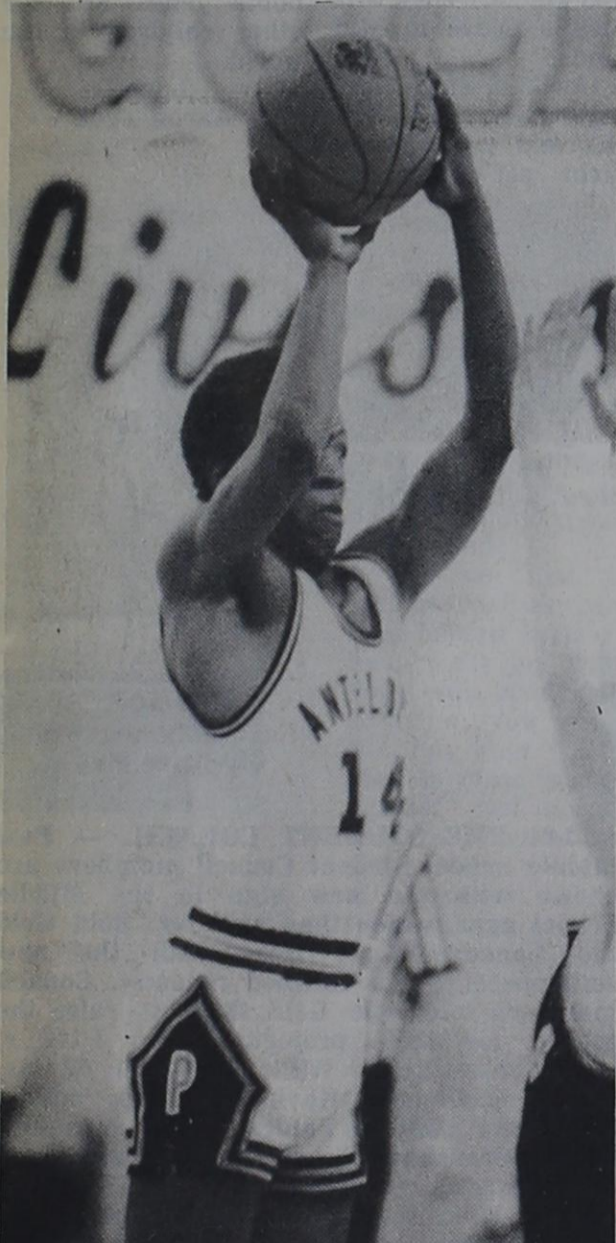
All JV players were in the game.

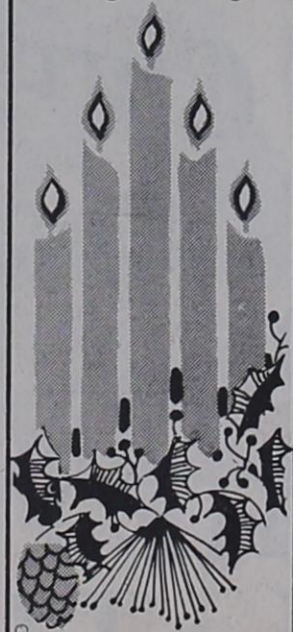
Purchasing new suits for the boys with donations of \$45 is a favorite way for many friends of the ranch to help at Christmas time.
