Ear drops may be effective in relieving the itching and pain asso-

## Tornado <br> Destruction

Every tornado is a potential killer and many are capable of great destruction. Tornadoes can topple buildings, roll mobile homes, uproot trees, hurl people and animals through the air for hundreds of yards, and fill the air with lethal, windborne debris.
Sticks, glasi, furniture all become deadly mis siles when driven by a tornado's winds.
In 1975, a Mississippi tornado carried a home freezer for more than a
Tornadoes do their destructive work through the combined action of their strong rotary winds and the impact of windborne debris. In the most simple case, the force of the tornado's winds push the windward wall of a building inward
The roof is lifted up and the other walls fall outward. Until recently this damage pattern le to the incorrect belief that the structure had exploded as a result of the atmospheric pressure drop associated with the ornado.
Mobile homes are particularly vulnerable to strong wind blown debris Even is tied down, mobile homes should be evacuated for more substantial shelter.

Mobile home parks should have storm shelters for their residents if located in areas where strong thunderstorms or tornadoes occur.

On May 11, 1970, Barbara McDowell and David Edwards were out on a date. Driving through downtown Lubbock, they noticed a strange calm around them. Then came the storm. The couple helplessly watched the windshield pop out, the tires go flat, and the metal crumple as the car, still carrying its passengers, was whipped through the street.

The night of April 24, 1990, was an entirely different matter. Barbara, now married to David for 14 years, woke up not long after midnight and turned on the television to Channel 11. John Robison was using the Doppler radar warning system to show a tornado warning in the area between Lubbock and Shallowater, where the Edwards live in a trailer. A neighbor from Wolfforth called Barbara at 1:30 to warn her about the storm. "This is routine for us," Barbara says. "We look out for each other."

For the next two hours, Barbara continued watching the reports. "I was
was out of town, but the weather was so detailed that I really wasn't worried. John Robison told us exactly where the 50 mile-per-hour winds were going to hit. I knew we could get to shelter in time if it got worse.

Because Barbara knew from experience that their trailer could withstand winds of 50 mph , the family never had to go to the cellar. "Usually I'm the first one in the cellar and the last one out whenever there's a warning," Barbara says. "But, with the Doppler, I knew we were safe." Their barn, however, did not fare so well. When the strong wind reached the barn, just 500 feet from the trailer, it tore off the roof, twisting the metal. But Barbara was just happy her family was safe.
"We were really appreciative of the information we were getting," she says. "It wasn't just a warning. It was a warning with detailed information we could use personally.

By definition, a tornado is a violently rotating column of air in
contact with the ground. The air column may be seen when it contains condensation in the form of a cloud or when it contains surface dust and debris. Often its appearance is a result of both. When a tornado touches visible cloud portion is missing or fails to reach all the way to the ground. When the column of air is aloft and does not produce damage he visible portion is properly called a funnel cloud. A waterspout is a omado in contact with a water surface.
Tornadoes vary greatly in size, intensity and appearance. Most (62
 category. Wind speeds are in the range of 100 miles an hour or less Weak tomadoes account for less than three percent of all tornado deaths. About one of out of every three tornadoes is classified as strong. Wind seeds reach about 200 miles an hour with an average path length of deaths occur each year from this type of storm. Nearly 70 percent of all tornado fatalities result from violent tornadoes. Although very rare only about two percent are violent), these extreme tornadoes can las respectively. The largest of these may exceed a mile or more in width, with wind speeds approaching 300 miles an hour.
The color of a tornado is determined by a number of factors, such as the amount and direction of sunlight and the type of debris being picked up at the surface. Not only does the shape of a tornado vary from one
storm to another, but an individual tornado usually changes its shap storm to another, but an individual tornado usually changes its shape
frequently during its life cycle. During the late stages of a tormado's life, it is not unusual for the tornado to become highly tilted and shrink in size. This reduction is size does not mean that it is less intense. It is still very dangerous! With exceptionally large tornadoes, the classic
"funnel shape" may be absent. The tomado may appear to be a large turnel shape may be absent. The tornado may appear to be a large, rain shaft or even a non-weather event such as a fire.
Sometimes as series of two or more tornadoes is associated with a parent thunderstorm. Occasionally, two or more tormadoes can occur simultaneously, extending downward from the same thunderstorm. On March 18, 1925, the Tri-State tornado traveled some 219 miles across Missouri, Illinois and Indian It lasted for over three and one-halr hours and killed 689 people. Except for weak tornadoes and waterspouts in coastal areas, tornadoes tornadoes have their origin within the right rear quadrant of the thunderstorm wh
