## Post ISD trustees open discussion on future building

### Building maintenance costs, new school buildings, HIV virus policy dominate agenda

The Post ISD Board of Trustees, at the regular monthly meeting Tuesday, December 11, considered a report on the costs of continuing maintenance for the three campuses from engineer Bill Stracener and gave preliminary approval for improving the sound system at the Elementary School Auditorium.

Stracener pointed out to the trustees that repairs to the heating system at the elementary school building were continuing, and emphasized that annual repairs will probably be needed to the old steam heating system.

Stracener also reported on modifications to the vocational ag building ventilation system, with work expected to begin this week on installing equipment which will protect students from potentially hazardous gasses emitted from the welding torches. Students will be moved to classrooms while the work is completed.

Trustees took action on a report by Superintendent Bill Shiver concerning establishing a policy for use of the school facilities. A decision on the recommended policies is expected following a meeting with ISD attorneys.

Shiver also reported to trustees about the "tremendous success" of the recent teacher training workshop conducted by Dr. Lee Hannel, a program implemented by the school board to improve cognitive thinking. The workshop was the result of requests by teachers, who listed cognitive thinking as one of the top priorities on a recent survey conducted by Shiver.

"This community, its teachers, parents and students should be proud of you," Shiver told the trustees. "For approving this training, which I believe will do more for our teachers and students than anything we could do."

"I wish you could see how Dr Hannel's approach brings out the best in our teachers," Shiver added, "it is really inspiring to see our teachers responding to this method of questioning and getting students involved in the learning process."

Shiver told trustees that Dr Hannel will return here in January to conduct follow up sessions on each campus, which includes direct, in-classroom teaching to show the teachers how his method works. "That was probably the most important part of his workshop," Shiver emphasized, "when teachers could see him in a classroom with their students, and see how the students responded to his method."

In other action, Shiver informed the trustees that the district will have to develop a policy on how to deal with the HIV virus. He recommended that each campus have at least two clean-up kits for use by the staff, and that all employees be required to use the clean-up kits whenever they are exposed to blood.

"It is against the law to identify students with AIDS," Shiver added, "and this is not a problem for us right now, but with the spread of that disease, it'll just be a matter of time when we will have to face it."

Shiver told the trustees that a recent communication from the state board of education shows a shortfall of state funding, which will leave Post ISD with \$58,280 less than previously budgeted. During the discussion Shiver pointed out that many of the state's education policies are unreasonable, specifically the career ladder program, which provides for teachers to be evaluated in a 45 minute period. "How would you like to have your job performance determined by a 45 minute evaluation?" he asked the trustees. "It just isn't right, you just can't do it," he added.

Trustees accepted the resignation of Teresa Terry. In other action the board approved renewal of certificates of deposit totaling \$5,522,477.

Trustee Barbara Hardin, under the new business category, opened up a discussion about the inadequacies of the high school gymnasium when she reported about numerous complaints from parents about the poor seating.

The entire question about the district's buildings was discussed, including a lengthy consideration of a completely new school complex, as has been suggested by Shiver for the past 10 years.

"Thirty years ago your predecessors looked to the future when they built this new high school," Shiver said, "and we need to be looking ahead to the needs of our grandchildren, these buildings are getting to the age where the costs of maintenance is not efficient."

Trustees discussed the issues, questioning if the taxpayers would approve of the estimated \$10 million to build a new school complex. "Many of the people I talk to say we need new facilities, but complain that we should have done it 10 years ago when it wouldn't have costs so much," board president Royce Hart said.

"Maybe we should start talking about it, see how the people feel," trustee Dan Hodges added.

Shiver suggested the board have the engineer show them comparisons of

costs for maintaining the current buildings, gather information more specifically and study the options. Attending the meeting were trustees Hart, Hardin, Hodges, Jerry Hays and Ronnie Gradine.

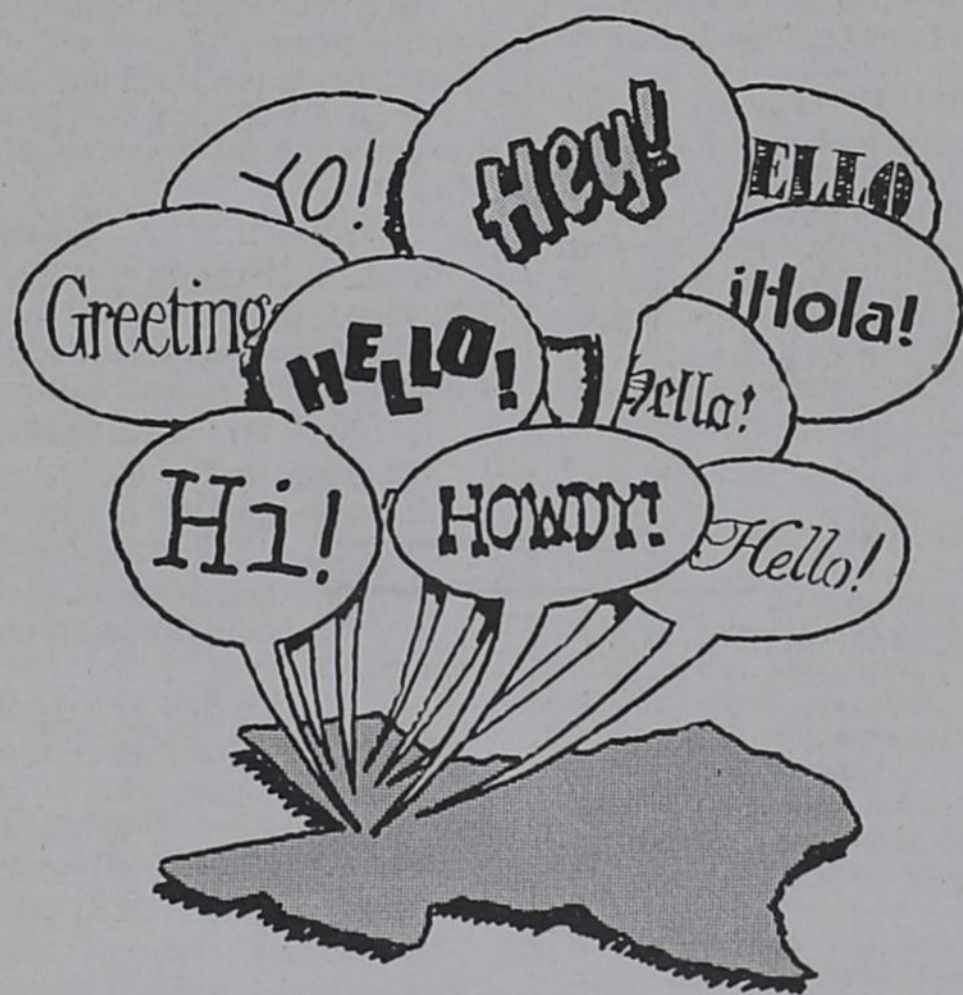
Hiccups Treatment:  
Different Approaches

Almost everyone has experienced hiccups—a sudden contraction of the diaphragm and the muscles responsible for inhaling and exhaling air. If continued for a long period of time, hiccups can be hazardous. Hiccups can become quiet fatiguing and often will prevent sleep. Although there are various causes of hiccups, one of the most common is swallowing hot foods.

A number of self-treatments have been suggested for hiccup relief. These include holding one's breath, standing on one's head for a certain length of time, drinking water from the "wrong side" of a cup, slowly taking 9 sips of water, and breathing into a paper bag.

Although there were several studies conducted in the nineteen seventies, little has been written during recent years regarding the evaluation of different hiccup treatments. One study concluded that persons who swallowed a teaspoonful of white granulated sugar often obtained hiccup relief. Varying degrees of success have been achieved with carbon dioxide, quinidine and chlorpromazine. A recent issue of *The New England Journal of Medicine* reported on hiccups in a boy who had experienced the problem for several years. Immediate relief was achieved with the antidepressant medicine amitriptyline.

**Living on the edge of the cap.....**

For those making a holiday hazardous products. Before visitors  
list and checking it twice, take an arrive for Christmas holidays, make

sure potentially dangerous household products are safely out of the reach of children.

Holidays are usually happy occasions, but they can also be "bad times" for young children. Young children, infants to 6-year-olds, are most often the victims of accidental poisonings, and the holiday periods are times that require extra vigilance.

During holidays, for example, grandparents and other relatives come to visit and forget to

lock it up. Holidays disrupt normal routines and create situations for kids to get into trouble.

The Dallas Poison Control Center, which covers north Texas, reported that 65 percent of their 65,000 cases in 1989 involved youngsters, and 80 percent of the 43,000 cases reported by the Galveston Poison Control Center covering southwest Texas, involved children. Nationally, 65 percent of the more than 1.58 million poisoning cases reported last year involved children.

Dangerous products that are most often overlooked include aspirin, cough and cold medicines, cleaning substances, and such oil-based products as furniture polishes. Every day, a person typically uses at least one product that can be dangerous in the hands of a child. The poison control center's checklist of poisonous products includes items that are sometimes kept on bathroom counters -- soaps, lotions, perfume, deodorants, rubbing alcohol and room deodorizers.

Some products are more dangerous than others. For example, drugs and pills, drain and toilet bowl cleaners can be deadly to a child. Detergents, bleaches and soaps rarely cause death, but can cause serious discomfort for a toddler.
