Caprock Collision **Results in Injuries** To Four People

A Saturday night two vehicle collision at the top of the Caprock resulted in injuries to four people and helicopter flights to Lubbock for two of the parties involved.

The accident occurred around 10:15 p.m. Saturday when a pickup driven by Nicholas Tarango of Post was struck by a pickup driven by a Mr. Richie of Amarillo.

Tarango, was taken to St. Mary's by the hospital's Flight for Life helicopter, and a passenger in his vehicle, Paul Soto of Post, was transported to Methodist Hospital by Care-Link after he was first taken to Garza Memorial Hospital by Post-Garza County EMS team members John Redman, Betty Posey and Becky Warren.

At the time of the accident investigation, the extent of Tarango's injuries were not known, and he was removed from the vehicle with the assistance of the Post Volunteer Fire Department.

Richie and his wife, who was a passenger in the vehicle, were both treated and released at Garza Memorial Hospital.

According to Gene Posey, DPS trooper, both vehicles were headed east when Tarango attempted a left turn in front of the Richie vehicle. Richie then swerved toward the inside median to avoid collision, and struck Tarango's pickup.

The pickup turned over one and three-quarter times and came to rest on the driver's side.

"There are indications at this time that no seat belts or safety restraints were worn by anyone involved in the accident," Posey said.
