burden of proof in applications for new trucking authority shifted from the applicant to the protestant. No longer was it easy for existing companies to te up applicants the public waited for reasonable trucking service. In the wake of that simple but profound change, new
authority sion have increased substantially, resulting in a wider variety of carriers and a more competitive atmo
sphere Last year, Senate Bill 595 and House Bill 908 again changed the face of Texas transportation regulaments for registering new require ommercial vehicles and revising the state's trucking rate structure. It hasn't been easy to translate the
