

Keitha White, Steve Payton Winners at State 4-H Roundup

Two Garza County 4-H Club members, Keitha White and Steve Payton, were winners at the June 7 and 8 State 4-H Roundup held at Texas A&M University.

Keitha White, a 10 year member of the Graham 4-H Club, was one of seven state 4-h'ers to be chosen to receive a 1988 C.J. "Red" Davidson Endowment Scholarship of \$4,000. White graduated from Post High School in May and interviewed for the scholarship June 6.

To receive a scholarship, applicants are judged on their involvement, leadership, and citizenship in their county 4-H program. Recipients are evaluated on their academic standing and involvement. Upon receiving the scholarship, Keitha was recognized during a

banquet and assembly held at Texas A&M University. Her parents, Orabeth and Noel White, were present to see their daughter receive the honor.

She will be attending Texas Tech University this fall to begin

her studies in Business Administration with a major in finance or accounting.

Steve Payton, an eight-year member of the Close City 4-H Club, placed third in the State 4-H Roundup out of 26 participants entered in the Safety and Accident Prevention contest.

In addition to winning third place, Payton also received a \$30 award given by Blue Cross and Blue Shield.

REMEMBER THESE SAFETY TIPS

- Watch for power lines when climbing in trees.
- Do not climb electrical poles, towers or structures.
- Do not trim trees near power lines.
- Do not set ladders or scaffolds near power lines.
- Do not shoot at insulators on poles, towers or structures.
- Never climb on or go inside a substation fence. Call SPS to help you retrieve anything thrown into the substation or caught in its fence.
- Avoid using electrical tools like lawn mowers or hedge clippers when grass and leaves are wet.
- Be careful when digging. Call SPS to find out if there are any buried electrical lines in the area.
- Electrical cords should not be spliced or taped. Repair by shortening them or replace them entirely.
- Beware of exposed wires.
- Don't touch portable appliances (coffee makers, radios, hair dryers, etc.) with wet hands or while standing or sitting in water.
- Don't post signs on utility poles. A lineman hitting a nail with his cleat could slip and fall. Also, nails can snag protective gloves and destroy their insulation value.

Breast Cancer Detection Unit Available to Area Women

According to the American Cancer Society, one out of 10 women in the United States will develop breast cancer sometime in her lifetime. It is currently estimated that over 37,000 women die each year as the result of breast cancer.

Ninety percent of breast cancers are diagnosed by women or their physicians finding a lump in the breast. Women who are diagnosed with a lump large enough to feel have a 50 percent, five year survival rate. A woman who is diagnosed as having breast cancer by mammography, before a lump can be felt, has a 97% five year survival rate and a 90% 10 year survival rate.

A mammogram can detect a cancer this small, even before it can be felt.

Appointments may be made by calling 495-2828.

The Mobile Breast Cancer Detection Unit will be in Post Wednesday, June 29.

The American Cancer Society has established guidelines for mammography in asymptomatic women. (Women who have no symptoms of disease). Those guidelines have been adopted by the American Academy of Family Physicians, American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and The American College of Radiology. These guidelines are:

- I. 35-40 years of age - One baseline mammogram.
- II. 40-50 years of age - A mammogram every 1-2 years, depending on breast type and risk factor.
- III. 50 years of age and over - An annual physical examination and annual mammogram.
- IV. Asymptomatic women under 50 years of age with significant high risk factors should be examined at appropriate in-family history of cancer.

V. A symptomatic woman should have a mammogram at any age when she experiences a mass, nipple discharge, skin changes or unexplained breast pain.

A screening mammogram is an x-ray of the breast using extremely low dosages of radiation (usually comparable to dental x-rays) and is designed to find very early cancers.

A female technologist who is highly trained in mammography will perform the examination.

The charge for the screening mammogram is \$55. The Unit accepts cash, check, Visa, Mastercard and American Express.
