During the six weeks of training the airman studied the Air Force mission, organization and customs and received special training in human relations.

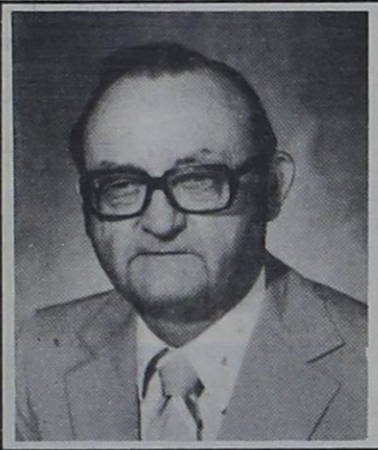
In addition, airmen who complete basic training earn credits toward an associate degree through the community college of the Air Force.

Dear Editor:

As a former Post resident, I'm always interested to hear about new things happening in my old home town. I was really glad to read in the Dispatch that a few interested parents are trying to get a Youth

Basketball program started. I'd like to share with your readers, if I may, a few positive views on these programs.

Since leaving Post in 1981, and moving to Sour Lake, Texas, we have been involved with Texas Youth Basketball and Little Dribble Basketball. Our son Jyles (Jot) played for six years, four of which he was chosen for the All-Star team. Three of those years he was fortunate enough to play at the National Little Dribbler Tournament.

Our senior all-star girls (ages 13 & 14) played at the National Tournament in Amarillo this past June and came home champions.

Now that Jot attends Hardin-Jefferson High School, we can see the effects of early basketball training in both our girls and boys teams.

Our varsity girls, The Lady Hawks, have been class 3-A State contenders as long as we have been in this area. They were defeated at the State Tournament in 1984, made it back to Regional in 1985, won the State Title in 1986, won Bi-District in 1987 and are ranked #1 in class 3-A this year. As of this

date, we have a 31-0 record and are hoping to be in Austin by the time this letter gets printed.

Our boys teams, although their records are not as impressive as the girls, have had many winning seasons. They also are playing for Bi-District this week.

To make an already long story short, our Hardin-Jefferson coaches are the first to admit that an early Youth Basketball training program makes a good foundation on which to build a state team. It also is a great way to build self confidence, teach sportsmanship and team play, three things that can't be taught too early.

I sincerely hope you stick with this. Its like any other youth program, a lot of hard work, an awful lot of fun and definitely worth it.

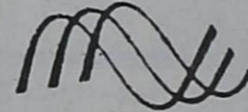

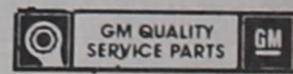

Post Art Guild Names Kaiter as Guest Artist

Post Art Guild, Inc., has selected Lubbock artist-sculptor Manfred Kaiter, whose works are now on display at the First National Bank of Post, as Guest Artist of the Month.

Mr. Kaiter was born in 1935 in Berlin, Germany and the story of his childhood has the makings of a truly great book - being raised in a Communist country; surviving war-torn Europe; eventually immigrating to America and later moving to Lubbock, Texas.

His journeys have been great from the time he was in school being taught to click his heels together to perfection and salute Adolph Hitler; to emerging as a gifted artist and American with a touch of a German accent and a whole lot of Texas drawl.

Kaiter began stone sculpting as a teenager in East Germany where he helped to restore damaged

buildings and statues after World War II, recreating exact replicas of missing pieces of ancient stone.

Mr. Kaiter has done many pieces in was, but finds stone to be much more challenging.

His works are in private collections all over the country, and he continues to demonstrate his works at conventions and art festivals.

Some of his past projects are the restoration of the Hedwig Hill Cabin at the Ranching Heritage Museum in Lubbock, and the emblem for the Lubbock City Council Meeting Hall.

While in New England, he helped to construct Sturbridge Village, an outdoor museum that served as an inspiration for the ranch headquarters project.

Kaiter and his wife, Pat, who is the sister of the late Buddy Holly, live in Lubbock and are the parents of five children.
