In further sports news, Varsity Lady Lopes and 7th and 8th grade boys and girls continued their winning streak in area track relays.

Two men were arrested by the Garza County Sheriff's Department in connection with a local filling station burglary.

Tennessee Williams' classic play "The Glass Menagerie" captivated audiences at the Garza Theatre and in the schools, the PHS entry in U.I.L. one-act play competition "Children of a Lesser God," won first place here. Cheryl Thompson and Eric Reece were named best actress and actor. Southland's one-act play "Lily Daw and the Three Ladies," won zone U.I.L. competition and advanced to district.

Post's Main Street continued to take on a brighter look as work began on Jan's and the building immediately west of Jan's, and renovation continued at Hudman Furniture.

April

April showers brought a destructive hail storm to Post and insurance agents were busy inspecting property damages and filling out claims for most residents of Garza County.

Freddy Cockrell for sheriff, Sammy Ellis for commissioner precinct one and Lonnie Gene Peel, constable precinct one/three were winners in the Democratic run-off election April 12.

The PHS entry in one-act play U.I.L. competition continued to be a winner - taking first place in Brownfield and Kermit. PHS students lead the area in U.I.L. points in the spring over all academic standings.

"Carelink," Lubbock's air ambulance helicopter visited Garza Memorial Hospital to acquaint Post residents with expanded emergency transport care - a cooperative venture of Methodist and Lubbock General Hospital.

PHS girls' and boys' track teams took first place in an Idalou meet and the Lady Lopes took home the trophy in a District 3AAA meet in Denver City.

The Garza Theatre celebrated its second anniversary with four outstanding performances of "Butterflies are Free."

Mayor Giles McCrary received an Honorary Doctorate from Texas Tech University, but if you wanted to write and congratulate him it would cost you more to mail the

letter. On April 3, the price of a stamp increased to 25 cents.

May

Local elections were once again in the news in May when incumbents Larry Waldrup and Jack Alexander and newcomer Irene Fry were elected to the Post City Council on May 7. David Tyler was elected to serve another term on the Garza County Hospital board and was joined by Ronny Ammons, Don Payne, Jerry Hays and Dan Hodges won three positions on the Post ISD board of trustees.

In the month of May the weather was as unpredictable as local elections, and a tornado skipped over the City of Post.

U.S. Senator Phil Gramm visited in Post on May 4 to tour United Sewing Agency.

Four people were injured in a two-vehicle collision at the top of the Caprock.

Jill Richardson was named valedictorian and Keitha White salutatorian of PHS's graduating class. In Southland, Tammy Weaver and Michelle McGehee took the honors.

Angela Cruse was selected for a Girl Scout trip to Canada.

The Post Art Guild annual art show was highlighted by 300 entries.

Graduation ceremonies were announced for Friday, May 27 at Post High School on Thursday, May 26 at Southland High School.

Members of the PHS Lady Lopes Varsity 400 meter relay team were Region IAAA champions and state qualifiers going to Memorial Stadium in Austin.

The Post Chamber of Commerce got a new manager when Kathryn Floyd, who had recently received her M.A. in Human Communications from Abilene Christian University, was named to that position beginning June 1.

And in downtown Post all eyes were turned toward the Tower Theatre and the owl which suddenly appeared there.

June

In June approval was issued by the State Highway Department for Phase I (three blocks of Main Street from Broadway east to the railroad tracks) of the Main Street Landscaping Project.

The Garza County 4-H Horse Show in the rodeo arena was a big success as was "Blithe Spirit," the Noel Coward comedy at the Garza Theatre.

Steve Payton was among 2,000 4-Hers who gathered at Texas A&M University for the annual Texas 4-H Roundup.

Byra Vay Strong, 54, of Snyder, was killed June 1, 1988 in a one-car accident on U.S. 84, approximately five miles outside Post.

Glenda Baker, Garza County Drug and Alcohol Abuse Program Director was presented an award as Counselor of the Year for the Lubbock/South Plains area at a conference in Dallas.

Eric Reece, Christina Martinez and Trevor Thuet were PHS winners in State U.I.L. competition and Post Middle School students toured Washington, D.C.

Daring daytime robbers hit Corner Grocery in downtown Post, with two men robbing the cash drawer while the other two kept owner Marvin Williams busy in the back of the store.

July

The Post Summer Festival and the second annual Shakespeare Festival provided eight days of entertainment in July. "A Mid-

summer Night's Dream" cast a spell on audiences in the Garza Theatre and other activities were on hand in Algerita Park.

Giles and Louise McCrary were honored at the theatre with a reception during the Shakespeare Festival for their outstanding contributions and support of the Garza Theatre.

The sheriff's department received a new telephone number in July and heavy rains closed several Garza County roads on July 11.

Handy Gifts had a grand reopening in July and Handy Hardware's entry in the "Mr. Legs" contest during the Summer Festival won the trophy.

In Commissioners Court, Judge Giles Dalby discussed joint contracts between the city and county and stressed the need for written agreements on everything shared jointly between the two.

In other action the Commissioners voted not to enter into a delinquent tax suit with the City of Post and Post ISD.

Ben Kirkpatrick was named "defensive most valuable player" of the North-South Game played at the Astrodome in Houston July 26.

August

In August bingo in Post was one year old, and the city received \$1,032.43, its first bingo profits check from Bob Bullock, State Comptroller's office.

LaDonna Scott was selected to the Academic All-State Girls track team for Class AAA based on academic achievements and track accomplishments.

Dodson's Jewelry was broken into by persons unknown and robbed of several hundred dollars in watches and jewelry.

The City Council approved plans to improve the helicopter landing pad site adjacent to Garza Memorial Hospital and the County Commissioners awarded a bid for courthouse janitorial services to Nonnie Bright and Tommie Brewer.

Fifty-three athletes reported for the first day of football practice.

Post ISD board of trustees reported heavy roof damages at the gym and closed the facility. The board also raised the 1988-89 tax rate to .75 cents per \$100 in a special called meeting.

The Post Stampede opened its 48th annual rodeo and cowboys representing Double U were off to the Texas Ranch Roundup in Wichita Falls.

The Texas Department of Agriculture asked local farmers for hay donations from CRP acres for bailing costs - \$30 a ton.

Past and present residents of Close City and Garlynn had a reunion August 20 at the Post Community Center.

Gina Basquez placed first in State 4-H record book competition and Shal Speed and Robin Dean represented Post in the Miss White River Lake Pageant.

And at the Garza Theatre, the hilarious comedy "The Seven Year Itch" was playing to appreciative audiences.

September

The month of September brought us two birthdays of interest - the Woman's Culture Club celebrated its 75th anniversary and Post resident Guadalupe Perez celebrated his 108th birthday.

Tax rates were set by the hospital and the county - the hospital rate remained at .105 per \$100 evaluation and the county tax rate us unchanged at 17.5 cents per \$100.

The Gary Lester Memorial

Roping was held September 17 and the Post Art Guild hosted six prominent artists representing Thornhill's Gallery of Fine Art in Snyder.

The Post Antelopes opened their season with a strong win against Abernathy 25-19, but were defeated by the Idalou Wildcats 28-8.

Lisa Taylor was named 1988 Homecoming Queen at Southland.

Dr. James Bell assumed his duties as minister of Post's First United Methodist Church after four years in Midland and many years serving in foreign countries.

Judge Giles Dalby was honored by the John Ben Shepperd Leadership Forum as an outstanding Texas leader and recipient of the Political Courage Award. He was also honored with a reception in the east wing of the State Capitol.

October

The big news in October was the second annual Founder's Day Celebration and Harvest Festival October 13-15.

Post welcomed visitors from all over and entertained them with a full schedule of activities.

Garza County saluted 4-H with 4-H week October 2-8 and Gold

Star awards went to Gina Basquez and Janell Jones at the annual 4-H Banquet.

PHS Antelopes celebrated a 14-2 district victory over Lamesa and squeaked by the Roosevelt Eagles 6-0 and, while the school gymnasium was finally pronounced safe, problems continued on resurfacing the school track.


Rene Craig was named Harvest Festival Queen; Sarah Aguilar was chosen PHS Bank Sweetheart; and Amber Crenshaw as PHS Homecoming Queen.

"The Sunshine Boys" opened at the Garza Theatre and played to capacity audiences.

Absentee voting was heavy for the November general election.


