## Family Focus

by 4-H'er Gina Basquez and Sandy Tomlinson, County Extension Agent - Home Economics

"Kids Talk", Part 2, has been prepared by Gina Basquez, who is working on her 4-H Record Book in Family Life. Today's two part article is entitled:

### Family Strengths in Later Life

**Adult Relationships**  
Achieving an adult relationship with one's parents in later life may not be easy but the rewards can be worth the try. An adult or mature relationship means accepting each other for who he/she is, including imperfections as well as positive traits. It means being able to give and receive help without feeling that your contribution to the relationship has decreased. Current relationships between adults and their aging parents are a product of earlier family life. In some families the parents were the authorities and continue to play this role even as children became adults. Such patterns from the past can dominate late life interactions between older parents and their adult children and prove dysfunctional. For example, being "the one in control" may put an aging parent in a position where receiving information or accepting help from an adult child is difficult because it is not in keeping with earlier roles.

Aging parents and aging children can examine how they relate to each other by asking themselves the following questions:

- Do I accept my child (or parent) as an adult who has a right to his/her own opinions, values and lifestyles even if these differ from my own?

- Am I judgmental of my children's (parent's) choices and decisions?

- Do I interfere and try to control their lives?

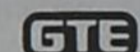
## STATEMENT OF INTENT TO CHANGE RATES

GTE Southwest Incorporated, in accordance with the Rules of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, hereby gives notice of the Company's intent to implement a new schedule of rates in Texas, effective July 6, 1988. This proceeding has been previously docketed by the Commission as Docket No. 5610.

The proposed changes in rates will affect approximately 970,500 of the Company's Texas customers who represent all classes of customers subscribing to the Company's local exchange and foreign exchange services within the State of Texas, as well as all entities subscribing to the Company's billing and collection services within the state. The proposed changes in rates are designed to increase the Company's intrastate revenues by \$81,407,000, or approximately 11.8 percent annually.

Persons who wish to intervene or otherwise participate in these proceedings should notify the Commission as soon as possible. A request to intervene, participate, or for further information should be mailed to the Public Utility Commission of Texas, 7800 Shoal Creek Boulevard, Suite 400N, Austin, Texas 78757. A complete set of revised rate schedules has been filed with the Public Utility Commission at Austin, Texas, and is available for public inspection in each of the Company's Business Offices in the State of Texas. A summary of the Company's rate filing has also been sent to the Mayor's office of each affected Municipality.

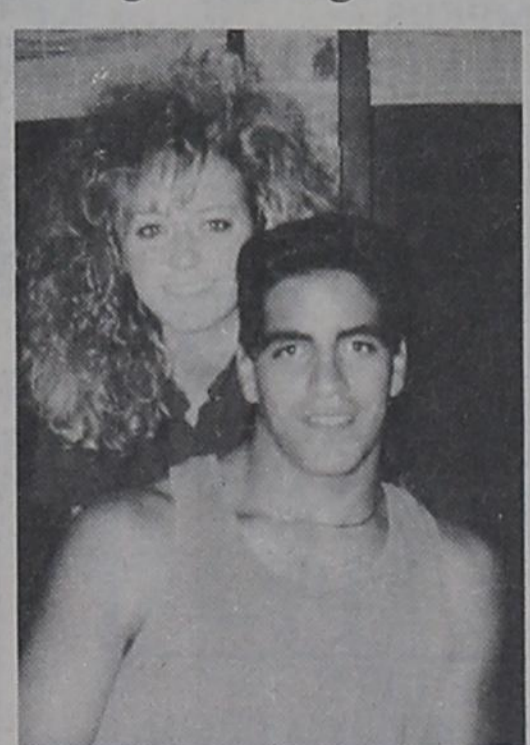
The groom-to-be is the son of Mr and Mrs Mike Ayala of Bever, Okla.
