NEW DELINTING PROCESS - Buddy Skinner (right) of Justiceburg and John W. Beck of Lubbock have announced the invention of a new apparatus for delinting cotton seed.

New Delinting Process Was Developed Locally

A new method and apparatus for delinting cottonseed has been developed by inventor, John W. Beck of Lubbock, in conjunction with the venture capital investor, Cumberland & Ohio Company of Texas, in Justiceburg.

Beck stated "the method and machine were designed specifically to reduce the costs of delinting

cottonseed for planting, as well as reducing the environmental problems associated with current systems."

The Beck method is relatively small, compact and simple to operate and maintain.

The System delivers the cottonseed briskly through a flame chamber in excess of 4,600 degrees, which singes the lint from

the seed while retaining the quality of the seed germination.

Over 13 months of experimentation, construction and documentation have been expended to assure the integrity of this invention.

The Beck System can also be used as a seed conditioner to replace the present seed dryer in a delinting plant to remove excessive lint, thereby reducing the HCL acid needed to complete the seed delinting process. When operated as a pre-conditioning unit, both electric h.p and B.T.U.'s required for heating are reduced.

James A. Skinner, President, Cumberland & Ohio Company, said, "The Beck System is the subject of a Patent Pending application from the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office. Cumberland & Ohio provided the capital required to fund the entire project and has exclusiveness to the patent and other intellectual rights to the System."

Skinner continued, "Cumberland & Ohio desires to associate with an international cotton machine manufacturer to construct, market and sell the System in both the U.S. and International market."

The Beck prototype of the system is available for viewing at Beck's shop in Lubbock.

FmHA Funds Available for Farm Loan Dispute

U.S. Senator Phil Gramm has announced the allocation of \$500,000 to the State of Texas by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration to help finance efforts to mediate farm loan disputes.

The matching grants from USDA's credit agency were authorized by the Agricultural Credit Act of 1987 and funded by fiscal 1989 appropriations.

"These matching funds go a long way in helping to resolve differences between lenders and farmers who credit with us," FmHA Administrator La Verne said.
