The vandalism downtown Monday night, although not a big money loss, is another reminder that no matter how much work goes into trying to make our town more attractive, there are those inconsiderate slobos who are going to do what they can to tear it up.

For several years now I have tried to float the idea of an auxiliary night patrol in the downtown area, and this incident gives me another opportunity to present this idea to our civic and elected leaders.

Call this whatever you like, but it seems to me we can not expect our sheriff and deputies, limited as they are in manpower anyway, to devote extra people to patrol the downtown area. What we need is a mature individual to walk up and down the street late at night and into the wee morning hours, when the vandals seem to strike, armed with a communication device which could alert the sheriff's dispatcher when suspicious activity is going on.

This person need not be an ordained law enforcement officer, he or she could just as well be a concerned citizen volunteer, a person with some common sense and maturity and enough wisdom to know real problems from non-destructive 'fooling around.'

I believe that an adult walking and observing downtown would be a strong deterrent to the activities of a few vandals...who by their nature are cowardly and not about to let someone see their juvenile behavior at work.

One idea that has also been mentioned to me is the concept of a volunteer police reserve force, not unlike the volunteer firemen and emergency medical technicians.

This idea warrants consideration and review by the Post City Council and I urge that some action be taken, before irate citizens take it upon themselves to protect their property from the hoodlums roaming our streets late at night.

Garza Chapter ACS Launches Crusade

The Garza County Unit of the American Cancer Society launched its annual fund raising Crusade, Friday, May 26 and will continue collecting for the cause through June 5 with a door-to-door Residential Campaign under the direction of neighborhood chairmen Margaret Bull, Anne Leake, Robin Leake and Tana Pyssen.

When you contribute money to the fight against cancer, you'd like to know that your money will be used efficiently.

And in fact, according to Melissa Cunningham, co-chairman of the American Cancer Society's 1989 Crusade in Post, most of the funds the Society raises in Texas, are used to support ACS research, rehabilitation programs and services for cancer patients.

About 40 percent of the money raised by the Garza Unit volunteers during the Residential Crusade will

go toward work in Post; 20 percent is used for statewide programs and the remainder supports nation programs and research.

"In 1987-88, \$1,314.98 was raised in Garza County specifically for cancer research, in hopes of finding a cure and better treatment methods for the cancer victim," Becky McCullough, chairman of the Public Education division of the Garza Unit, said.

One of the major goals of the Crusade is public education--to provide information about cancer detection, prevention and treatment to local residents. "It's important to alert the public to visit their doctors for regular checkups and to teach them to recognize the seven basic warning signals of cancer. The more people know about cancer, the better their chances are of reducing their risk of getting it," McCullough added.

County Receives Grant for Retraining Workers

Beginning July 1, 1989, assistance will be available for laid off workers, bankrupt farmers and the long-term unemployed, through a program financed by federal funds and administered by the Private Industry Council.

Garza County, along with Lubbock County, will receive a grant (\$210,324 initially) for a program which will run from July 1, 1989 through June 30, 1990 and will provide assistance for retraining workers who have been displaced by the agriculture and petroleum slump and can no longer find jobs in those fields.

According to Don McCullough, executive director of the Private Industry Council in Lubbock, the Title III program isn't new - there have been others in the past, but this is the first for Garza and Lubbock counties.

The program, made available under Economic Dislocation and Worker Adjustment Assistance (EDWAA), will be set up in the PIC Lubbock offices with a Title III program manager and arrangements made to have a representative in Post on a regular basis.

"All the details aren't finalized. We have to work out how to best serve the people of Post," McCullough said.

Post High School students were honored at a special awards ceremony Monday, May 22, held in the Post School Auditorium.


Presiding at the ceremony was PHS principal Joe Giddens.



The balloon launch is the kickoff for what promises to be two months of entertainment in the Post Public Library's 1989 Summer Reading Program.

The program is open this year to all students who will be in the first grade through fifth grade in the coming school year. Preschoolers are eligible to participate in the library's "Read To Me" program.

Activities get underway at 10 a.m., Monday, June 5 when all the summer participants will meet at the library for registration. During registration, postcards will be filled out listing the reader's name and favorite book and the library's address.

After registration, the group will move from the library to Algeria Park where the postcards, which are ready to be mailed back by whoever finds them, will be attached to the balloons and the messages launched. Refreshments will be served at Algeria Park and the group will then return to the library.

Among the graduates of the class of 1989 at Colorado's United States Air Force Academy graduation exercises, Wednesday, May 31, will be Gregory Sean Basinger, the 22-year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe E. Basinger of Southland.

Sean entered the Air Force Academy as a Basic Cadet on July 5 after graduating from Southland High School in 1985. He began his freshman (Doolie) year with Cadet Squadron Nine, the Vikings, and then moved after that year to finish the remainder of his cadet career in Cadet Squadron Four, the Fightin' Fourth.

As an upperclass cadet, he was elected to be the Squadron Honor Representative. In this position, he was responsible for the administration and investigation of any alleged violations of the Cadet Honor Code and sat as a juror on Cadet Wing Honor Boards.

Additionally, he served the squadron as a Flight and Squadron Specialist, where he performed peer and human relations counseling. During his four years at the Academy, he was active in the Baptist Student Union and the Protestant Chapel Cadet Choir.

ACS Crusade Continues with Residential Drive

(Continued from Page 1)

The Public Education division includes pamphlets, posters and videos available for schools, day care centers and youth organizations. It also includes presentations made to adults groups - ranging from information on reducing cancer risk, to teaching women breast self-examination, to encouraging men to have regular colorectal checks.

In 1987-88, Garza Public Education reached 840 adults and 1,316 youths with a total dollar value of \$4,574 in speakers and materials distributed.

Every day the American Cancer Society develops and distributes materials on the latest cancer treatments, has seminars to train health professionals on dealing with the physical and emotional aspects of cancer, and educates these professionals on the society's programs. Health professionals include doctors, dentists, nurses, clergy, pharmacists and others. So far this year, the Garza Unit has reached 975 health professionals, compared to last year's total at this time of 302.

According to Georgia Slough, chairman of Service/Rehabilitation, "Five cancer patients were served in 1987-88 with a combination of information, gift items, equipment loans, counseling and ostomy rehabilitation. As of April we have served seven cancer patients with equipment and information. The estimated value of services for these patients is \$2,289. We also have a "Keys to Service," which is a guide to cancer patients on resources available in the community."

As the local volunteer workers in the 1989 Cancer Crusade and Residential Campaign call on you for your donations, they will be part of a statewide and nationwide effort involving more than 1.6 million American Cancer Society volunteers.

Co-chairman of the '89 Crusade, Joyce Strubhart, said, "Volunteers express determination and strong dedication in the crusade against cancer. We are proud of our volunteers...their support and ongoing commitment and concern to the cancer patient."

no cost for public uses.

Numerous showings of the industrial plant were made for manufacturing and more intensive employment uses. Unable to economically locate a sewing factory on the property, the Board concluded negotiations with United Sewing for location in a privately owned building in Post with PEDC purchasing the sewing machines and equipment for rent by the company. During the year \$43,646 was spent for machinery and equipment for which \$3,531 was returned in rental payments. Additionally, the Corporation paid \$5,205 toward the renovation of the building to get the United Sewing Company to locate in Post for which no recovery was anticipated other than 25 to 45 jobs in the community.

During the year several contracts were made regarding establishing a cotton manufacturing operation at the plant. Considerable work of this nature was done by the Texas Department of Agriculture. Additionally several contracts were made concerning the location of a regional prison in Post, with the Postex Plant as a possibility.

During 1988 there were 13 meetings of the Board of Directors. There were several reviews of the role and functions of the Corporation with respect to general economic development of the community without definite conclusions. Considerable time was devoted to management and maintenance of the residential properties.

PEDC Ends '88 in Good Financial Condition

The Post Economic Development Corporation ended the year 1988 in improved sound financial condition. Total revenues for the year were \$169,869 against which expenditures of \$81,215 were made. To the \$88,654 grossed from operations, the return of \$26,327 escrow established in 1986 in the sale of the major property to Gordon M. Davidson gave the Corporation an increase of \$114, 981 in liquid assets.

The major income from rent of the industrial property to Postex Warehouse Company of cotton storage produced \$124,530. The powdered milk storage that uses 30,000 square feet of space was closed out before the 1988 cotton harvest required a higher priority use of the property. Only minimum expenditures for plant maintenance of \$6,777 were done during the year. This does not include considerable expenditure of labor and materials that were done by the major tenant, Postex Warehouse Company.

Housing vacancies continued throughout the year, reflecting the depressed real estate market throughout Texas. One of the small vacant house was sold for \$500 and removed from the property leaving 21 remaining residential buildings. Another small house was donated to the Rotary Club for use by the local Boy Scout Troop and to be removed from the property. Income from the residential property was \$29,948 against which \$16,027 was spent on repairs and maintenance, leaving a gross of \$13,921. Greater effort was made toward improving the residential properties. One house was approved for the HUD rent supplement program.

Much of the property continued to be made available for public use. The First Presbyterian Church was provided two of the small rent houses rent free for a year to establish a Child Day Care Center. Other residences continued to be made available at considerable reduced rents to the Head Start Program, to the Main Street Manager and to the Chamber of Commerce Manager. In the industrial property the Lubbock



Ranching Heritage Hosts Cowboy Celebration

Cowboy. The word evokes strong images: images of a rough, leathery man -- a solitary spirit with a zest for hard work and hard lands -- a man respectful of nature, polite to the ladies and best friends with his horse.

The public's vision of a cowboy did not materialize from the dust of the West. The portrait was created by people -- poets, writers, scholars, artists, musicians and craftsmen. It was created by cowboys themselves or by people who,

through relationships or research and analysis, have come to know and under cowboys and the spirit of the American West.

More than 250 of these authorities on cowboy culture will unite for one of the most comprehensive explorations of the traditions of the American frontier at the National Cowboy Symposium and Celebration June 2-4 at Texas Tech University in Lubbock, located in the heart of the plains of West Texas.

"Never before has such a diverse group of authorities on cowboys and cowboy culture gathered together to pay homage to these folk heroes of America," said Alvin Davis, executive vice president and general manager of the Ranching Heritage Association (RHA).

The RHA, a sponsor of the program, is the non-profit support organization for Texas Tech's Ranching Heritage Center. The outdoor museum represents the development of Texas ranching from 1836-1936 through a collection of 30 historic ranching structures.

"This is not just a chance to hear poetry and literature about the cowboy. It's a chance to see the art, hear the music and observe the work of the cowboy," said Davis. "Even the cowboy craftsmen will be on hand displaying boots, saddles, spurs and other gear."

Davis said that true, less than well-known facts about cowboy and Western culture will be topics of some of the discussions.

Four women, Fern Sawyer of Alto, N.M., Dixie Mosley of Amarillo, Stella Hughes of Clifton, Arizona and Betty Cooper of Durant, Oklahoma, will lead a discussion about Western women. The women were not secondary figures in relation to the cowboys, but were, and are, primary characters in their own right.

Participants of the daily panel sessions and evening performances will include: Baxter Black and Carlos Ashley, two of the foremost cowboy poets; Red Steagall, traditional Western musician; Don Edwards, yodeler and singer of old-time cowboy ballads; John Erickson, author of "Hank the Cowdog" stories; Elmer Kelton, one of the great Western fiction

writers; Barry Corbin and Barry Tubb, two of the actors in the television movie "Lonesome Dove;" Ace Reid, cowboy cartoonist and humorist; and Tom Ryan, artist and former president of the Cowboy Artists of America.

In addition to the panel sessions on poetry, songs, stories, photography and art, the symposium will feature a celebrity cutting and team roping event from 2-4 p.m. Sunday, June 4 at the Livestock Pavilion on the Panhandle South Plains Fairgrounds. Champion rodeo cowboys Toots Mansfield and Troy Fort will flag the team roping event and champion cutters Fern Sawyer, Buster Welch and Lex Graham will judge the cutting competition.

A book fair and exhibit of cowboy gear, trappings, art and crafts will be from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Friday (June 2) and 9 a.m.-8 p.m. Saturday (June 3) and 2 p.m.-5 p.m. Sunday (June 4) in the University Center. The Ranching Heritage Center will provide the setting for a barbeque and a tour of the center from noon to 2 p.m. Saturday (June 2).

A single ticket price of \$5 will provide admission to the Friday, Saturday and Sunday panel sessions. The first 5,000 people to purchase tickets will be given an 18"x24" poster. Evening performances and the Sunday afternoon arena performance tickets are \$6 for adults and \$3 for children. Barbeque tickets are \$7 for a regular serving and \$5 for a small serving.
