no longer find jobs in those fields. According to Don McCullough, executive director of the Private In-
dustry Council in Lubbock, the Titie III program isn't new - there have been others in the past, but this is the first for Garza and Lubbock coun-
ties. The program, made available under Economic Dislocation and
Worker Adjustment Assistance (EDWAA), will be set up in the PIC
Lubbock offices with a Title III program manager and arrangements Lubbock offices with a Titte III program manager and arrangements
